

**Minutes of the 47th Meeting of State Level Task Force on Solid Waste Management
for discussion on several issues of solid waste management**

Director, State Urban Development Agency (SUDA) chaired the meeting.

At the outset, he welcomed all the members present and explained the discussion points of the meeting. A threadbare discussion was held regarding the agenda points and following decisions were taken:

1. UD&MA Department has entrusted KMDA to execute the work of biomining and bioremediation of legacy waste for Belgachia dumpsite of Howrah MC. For this KMDA floated the e-tenders incorporating due suggestions received from prospective bidders.

The first call of the eTender floated had to be cancelled for bidders have been failed to receive the required qualifying marks as per financial norms. As such and after due deliberations by the TIA with technical members, reexamining the clauses mentioned, KMDA once again floated tender (2nd call) taking into consideration all aspects within the ambit of financial clauses.

This meeting of SLTF has been called for having an understanding on the participants' strategy and modus operandi to be adopted on Initial Implementation and Operational Plan (IIOP), carrying 25 marks to qualify in the technical bid. The minimum qualifying marks was set as 70, and bidders with more than 70 marks are declared to be qualified and responsive and their financial bids to be open.

The Committee is of the opinion that the 3 Agencies viz. Akansha Enterprises, Delhi, Eastern Organic Fertilizer Pvt. Ltd. & NACOF participated today and present their cases with regard to understanding of the ground situation and their modus operandi of implementation.

2. In the 45th SLTF meeting a decision was taken to enter into a MoU with Regional Centre for Urban and Environmental Studies, Lucknow as a Consultant on nomination basis to act as a Transaction Advisor for implementation of an Integrated SWM Project for both HMC & Bally Municipality. However the rate offered by the Organization as consultancy fees in the role of a Transaction Advisor for setting up of an Integrated SWM Project was



Rs. 177 lakh including GST appeared to be exorbitantly high . In the meanwhile another Organization, Administrative Staff College of India (ASCI), Hyderabad approached before KMDA to work as a Consultant for 'Waste to Energy (W2E) Plant'. After detail discussions, ASCI, was offered to submit a proposal as a Transaction Advisor to develop a comprehensive solution for Integrated SWM Project pertaining to HMC and Bally Municipality focusing on project details, scope of work, work plan analyzing ground details, challenges and probable, feasible solutions with timeline in a phased manner for implementation of a viable and sustainable Project. As such ASCI offered a rate of Rs 43.07 lakh including GST.

Now, considering all aspects, this Committee is of the opinion that ASCI may be offered to act as a Transaction Advisor on nomination basis.

With no other issue for discussion the meeting ended with vote of tanks to and from the chair.
