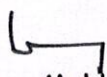
Director, State Urban Development Agency (SUDA) chaired the meeting.

At the outset, he welcomed all the members and explained the discussion points of the meeting. After that, a threadbare discussion was held among the members and the following discussions and decisions have been made in the meeting.

- (1) At the last meeting of the State Level Task Force, KMC appealed to the Committee to revise the minimum credential of the prospective bidders for the proposed MRF along with primary collection of dry waste from Rs.10 crore to Rs.5 crore. Committee after due consideration suggested KMC to keep the threshold eligibility limit at Rs.10 crore. KMC has again further appealed to the Committee now to reconsider the threshold eligibility to Rs.5 crore. As per the extant orders/guidelines of the Finance Department the credentials/bid eligibility criteria for the 2nd call onwards of any tender are to be revisited and relaxed in the interest of greater participation of prospective bidders. KMC appraised that there were no bidders in the 1st three calls of the tender under decision. Therefore KMC may consider to revisit the eligibility criteria/credentials for the 4th call in the interest of greater participation of prospective bidders. It was further decided that the bid document of KMC should also mention the minimum area of land to be available to the bidders alongwith other details for the Material Recovery Facility (MRF) to be set up.
- (2) SUDA has engaged Centre for Environment Education (CEE) as the Nodal Agency for imparting capacity building and development of IEC materials in connection with Solid Waste Management. The Ganga Towns (non-KMA ULBs) and all ULBs within the Kolkata Metropolitan Areas (KMA) were prioritised for a physical training at Subhanna. However due to the upsurge in Covid-19 case the training has to be discontinued covering 19 ULBs in 6 (six) batches. It is understood that presently all ULBs are extremely busy with the 'Duare Sarkar' programme. Therefore the Committee propose to conduct the trainings wherein the key trainer of CEE will be addressing the participants through webinar and the hand holding will be done by the other trainers of CEE/ Micro Planners at the ULBs.
- (3) Delivery and distribution of household bins from SUDA to the ULBs and thereafter to the households in all 51 ULBs has to be completed within 31st December, 2020. SUDA will monitor the exercise regularly.

- (4) The committee suggested an advisory to be issued from SUDA for the scale at which approved IEC material are to be printed and the remuneration to be paid for Motivators and the Supervisors along with the scale of deployment.
- (5) SUDA has already invited stand alone tenders for 41 ULBs and 2 clusters (consisting of 11 ULBs) for fresh waste processing. All bids will be closed at the end of December, 2020. This is put on record.
- (6) Tenders for Fresh Waste Management to be invited for another 18 ULBs where unencumbered land is available. The tenders will be invited within 10th of this month.
- (7) The Committee after due deliberation presumed that the ULB wise estimation of projected quantity of municipal solid waste which was calculated based on the population projections as well as waste projections derived from average of arithmetic increase method, geometric increase method and incremental increase method made by Micro Planners in the DPRs is higher than the actual quantity of municipal waste to be generated in due course in the ULBs. Hence, the Committee recommended that the calculation of projected waste to be made considering maximum 10% decadal growth in population as well as 10% decadal growth in waste generation which will be much realistic.

With no other issue for discussion the meeting ended with vote of tanks to and from the chair.
