Minutes of the Meeting of State Nodal Monitoring Committee for Prevention and Management of Vector Borne Diseases

Date: 4th January 2018

Venue: Green Room of Swasthya Bhawan, Salt Lake

List of participants is annexed.

Secretary (PHP), Health & Family Welfare Department takes chair and welcomed all to the first meeting of State Nodal Monitoring Committee. He informed that in the meeting chaired by the Chief Secretary on 27.11.2017 for preparation of a Joint Action Plan to tackle Vector Borne Diseases in the State, it was decided that State Nodal Monitoring Committee on Vector Borne Diseases (VBD) would be constituted with senior officers from concerned Departments and Commissioners of KMC, HMC and BMC. He also informed that in the administrative review meeting chaired by the Hon'ble Chief Minister on 4.12.2017 it was decided that every district would have a District Level Monitoring Team (DLMT) chaired by the District Magistrate. Guideline for preparation of District Vector Borne Disease Control Plan has been prepared and shared with all District Magistrates and concerned Departments. In 2018, House to House surveillance and vector control measures would be intensified. It was decided that House to House surveillance would be done in all municipal areas of the State from January to December on fortnightly basis. In rural areas, District Magistrate would decide areas of H to H surveillance.

Additional Secretary (PHP) explained the salient features of the District VBD Plan. He informed that the existing daily reporting system through SMS would be discontinued and software would be developed for daily reporting as well as sending alerts through SMS to key persons. He also informed that a calendar mentioning dates of fortnightly H to H surveillance and vector control activities would be printed by the H and FW Department for distribution among the H to H workers, supervisors, Councilors, UPHCs etc.

Advisor to Health and FW Department gave emphasis on quality of surveillance work and conservancy work. He informed that this year house marking would be done after each round of visit. He clarified that basic management of dengue cases did not necessarily depend on lab diagnosis of dengue. Rather he gave emphasis on monitoring of Platelet count, and also on management of dengue cases in peripheral units in order to prevent undue overloading in higher centres. However, he suggested that setting up Sentinel Surveillance Laboratories (SSL) in urban areas for more than 1 lakh population might be considered under NUHM.

Director, State Urban Development Authority (SUDA) proposed to increase the daily allowance to H to H workers and supervisors from existing Rs.75 to Rs. 150. He also added that there was need for arrangement of some pathological tests like platelet count, PCV test etc at ULB level.

Joint Municipal Commissioner, KMC informed that in KMC areas the VBD control activities would be undertaken on weekly basis. He requested that the calendar for KMC areas to be modified accordingly.

Joint Secretary, Department of Women and Child Development and Social Welfare suggested including the District Programme Officer (DPO), ICDS in the District Level Monitoring Team (DLMT).

Secretary, School Education Department said that School Safety Committee might be activated. He suggested that a leaflet containing 'Do-s and Don't-s' could be designed for secondary school students, along with a checklist. Students would inspect their house environment & the surroundings and submit the filled-in checklist. He agreed that if the design was provided from the end of H & FW, his department could arrange for printing and supply of the same to the schools. He informed that the proposal of H and FW Department for inclusion of a chapter on VBD, its control and management in the school syllabus had been forwarded to Text Book Committee and it was under consideration.

Additional Chief Engineer, PHE informed that PHED was supervising and monitoring works related to supply of safe potable water, repair of tube well platforms etc. Since the data of such actions may be important for the national meetings on AES, he stated that they were ready to share the same from time to time.

Commissioner, Bidhannagar Municipal Corporation requested to sanction additional allotment for the Nursing Students deployed for house-to-house activities during the dengue transmission season.

Commissioner, Howrah Municipal Corporation gave emphasis on setting up additional testing facilities in urban areas.

The following decisions were taken in the meeting:

1. H and FW Department would move for increasing the daily wage for H to H Survey Team Members and Supervisors deployed in 125 Corporations and Municipalities in the State. Fund would be provided for honourarium of H to H workers, supervisors, printing of forms, mobility support to municipalities and CMOH, cost of data entry at municipality level, contingency to municipalities and cost of IEC. It was estimated that around 71 crore would be required for these purpose.
2. SUDA would provide fund for payment of honourarium to Vector Control Team, cost of larvicidal, IEC, cost of implements. Around Rs. 40 crore would be required for these purposes.

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3. KMC would spend around Rs. 14 crore for payment of honourarium to H to H workers, supervisors, printing of forms, mobility support, contingency, cost of IEC etc.
4. School Education Department would take steps to sensitize secondary level students. Inspector of School (both Pry and Secondary) would be sensitized. Expenditure on this account would be met up by the School Education Department.
5. It was learnt that Panchayet and Rural Development Department had already issued order for incurring expenditures for H to H surveillance, cleaning etc from MGNREGA and Nirmal Bangla Prakalpa.
6. DPO, ICDS would be included in the District Level Monitoring Team (DLMT).
7. SUDA would prepare list of ULBs where Sentinel Surveillance Laboratories to be set up. While preparing this list, care to be taken that each SSL caters to more than 1 lakh population or so, for the SSL to be sustainable. If the population is less than 1 lakh, the Urban Area may be tagged with the nearest SSL.
8. Facility of Blood Sample Separation Unit (BCSU) and Platelet Agitator to be augmented in the State.
9. The case management guideline for Dengue would be re-circulated and Medical Officers posted at various level to be sensitized.
10. Provision of monitoring Pack Cell Volume (PCV) and Platelet count at BPHC and UPHC level may be considered, keeping the cost effectiveness in view. ??
11. IEC would be intensified. H and FW Department would modify the IEC materials, as & if necessary and supply to all.
12. State level ToT and Regional level sensitization meetings would be organized jointly by the H and FW Department and SUDA.
13. Calendar mentioning dates of fortnightly H to H Survey and Vector Control Team activities in municipal areas would be circulated among Councilors, UPHCs, Supervisors and H to H workers. Separate calendar would be printed for KMC.
14. Training Module for Vector Control Team would be provided by the H and FW Department.
15. Joint Action Plan for control & management of VBDs would be published shortly.
16. PHED was requested to give emphasis on repair of platforms at JE/AES endemic areas and send progress report to H and FW Department on quarterly basis. H and FW Department would prepare the reporting format/ points.

Meeting concludes with thanks to and from the chair.
