

- 11) To eliminate the mosquito breeding places in the respective Municipal area. To take special care of the construction sites, abandoned areas, peri-domestic areas being the most vulnerable mosquito breeding sites.
- 12) To create awareness amongst the community so that they could identify the mosquito breeding places and destroy the same.
- 13) To involve all the Health facilities like U-PHCs, HAU, Sub-Centres, all the Health manpower like doctors, Health workers and others under Health Programmes i.e. NUHM, UPHCS, CBPHCS & HHW Scheme. Doctors to be assigned ward-wise for monitoring & supervision.
- 14) To inspect all the School & College premises, various Central Government & other offices and residential premises, Government & private Hospital premises, factory, commercial places for mosquito breeding sites for taking action.



**Sub : SMS-based monitoring system for House-to-House Survey  
Programme in selected urban areas.**

You are aware that a fortnightly House to House Survey Programme for prevention & control of dengue/ chikungunya is going to start in 91 selected urban areas (Municipality/Municipal Corporation/ Notified Area) spread over the state from 1<sup>st</sup> May, 2017. In addition to the conventional reporting mechanism (hardcopy/ e-mail), an SMS-based daily monitoring system is being introduced for this programme.

Each Supervisor of the House-to-House Teams will send an SMS for each of his team to a designated no. (server) at the end of each day's work. It is to be sent from the particular phone no. already registered against that Supervisor. It will report on three parameters: (i) no. of fever cases with joint pain & definite body ache ("fever" cases) found by the Team on the day, (ii) no. of containers checked by the Team and (iii) no. of containers found to have aedes larva (containers having "larva"). The Nodal Officer (ULB), after daily report compilation at his end, will also send an SMS to the server on the same parameters, totaled for the whole urban area for the day. You will be able to see in the portal (in District Dashboard menu) the data sent by the Supervisors and the Nodal Officer (ULB).

If the findings of any Team cross the pre-defined cut-off mark, alert messages will be sent from the server to the respective Municipal and Health functionaries in terms of the following indicators: (i) no. of "fever" cases found by a particular team on the day and (ii) percentage of containers having "larva" reported by a team. Local verification and necessary response actions have to be taken forthwith from your end in collaboration with the ULB.


At the end of a Round, if the overall proportion of "fever" cases (out of the population) or the overall proportion of containers having "larva" in an urban area surpasses the cut-off level for an ULB, further alert messages will be sent.

The IT system for the above mechanism is already in place. You are requested to convene a meeting with the key persons of the ULBs and H & FW at an early date. The Dy.CMOH(II)s have been sensitized in this matter in a state level meeting on 19.04.2017. They are supposed to sensitize the key persons of ULBs who will again impart the necessary training to the Supervisors.

In the above-said meeting, the Dy.CMOH(II) may please give a demonstration of the portal and the SMS system. The portal will remain open for practice till 28.04.2017. The site link to be used for practice is: [125.22.76.17:8080](http://125.22.76.17:8080). The user name & password are: [admin](#) & [123](#) respectively.

Phone nos. of the Dy. CMOH-II's have been temporarily entered into the server as Supervisors for practice demonstration. SMS has to be sent to 9223166166. For a Supervisor the SMS syntax is as follows: WB(space)DN(space)Team No.(space)No. of fever cases with joint pain & body ache found on the day(space)No. of containers checked on the day(space)No. of containers having aedes larva. The cost that the Supervisors will have to bear for messaging to the server phone no. will be reimbursed in due course.

Sub- Guidelines for choice and procurement of insecticides for vector control.


The ULBs are in the practice of using insecticides in one or other form for control of mosquito vectors so as to control diseases like Dengue, Chikungunya, Malaria etc.

A set of guidelines is sent herewith, which may be shared with the ULBs, so that proper insecticides are chosen according to the situation, used in proper method & dose and a standard procedure is maintained for procurement of such materials.

We recommend the use of insecticides approved by NVBDCP and TAC (Govt. of India), a list of which vis-à-vis the purpose is given in Annexure-I and II.

Annexure III is the suggested list of documents that are required to ascertain the validity of the firm, the product & its source for the procurement process. Annexure IV is a list of the CIB approved sources of the molecules (i.e. raw material necessary for preparation of formulation). It is an abridged list containing names relevant for the recommended insecticides only.



## Annexure-I

Under the National Vector Borne Disease Control Programme (NVBDCP) insecticides are used based on certain epidemiological and entomological criteria. The programme uses insecticides for indoor residual spray, indoor space spray, outdoor fogging, treatment of mosquito nets and control of vector larvae for prevention & control of vector borne diseases.

The followings are the larvicides that are applicable against mosquito vectors and are approved by NVBDCP and Technical Advisory Committee, Govt. of India.

**Procurement of the insecticides:**

'Product' hereunder means the commercial formulation as procured from suppliers.

1) Product should have approval of NVBDCP (GOI) and TAC ( Technical Committee headed by the Additional Director General, Directorate General of Health Services, Government of India ).

2) Product must be one registered with Central Insecticide Board (copy of CIB registration certificate to be submitted along with the offer). *Website of the Central Insecticide Board & Registration Committee, Govt. of India i.e. [www.cibrc.nic.in](http://www.cibrc.nic.in)* may be referred to check whether an insecticide is registered. [The insecticides enlisted in Annexure I & II are CIB registered].

3) Valid Manufacturing License to be submitted by the manufacturer for the particular product.

4) Shelf life of the product must be 2 years from the date of manufacturing.

5) The manufacturer requires to have 'CIB approved source of Import'- certificate for the source or the raw material for preparation of the formulation (if the product is not a proprietary product). Valid agreement with the approved source firm & bill/invoice of purchase from the approved source also to be submitted.

In case of proprietary products, proprietary certificate from the manufacturer has to be submitted.

6) Either manufacturers that fulfil the above criteria or their authorised distributors are eligible to participate in the selection process. Production of tender-specific valid authorization certificate from the manufacturer is necessary for a distributor.

7) Test report and guarantee certificate from the manufacturer to be submitted at the time of supply.



**Minutes of the meeting with various Departments of the State Government and the districts to review the status of Prevention and Control of Vector Borne Diseases**

Date- 2.2.2017

Venue- Chief Secretary's Conference Hall at Nabanna

Chief Secretary, Government of West Bengal takes chair and welcomes all.

The list of participants is enclosed at **Annexure – I**. District Magistrates and Chief Medical Officers of Health are present through video conferencing.

**Dengue**

Additional Chief Secretary, Health and Family Welfare Department states that advance planning based on the previous year experiences has been done to combat Vector Borne Diseases especially Dengue in the State in the year 2017. He in details informs the steps taken/planned for the current year. Secretary, Department of Urban Development and Municipal Affairs informs that in the year 2016, the areas adjoining Bagjola canal and other canals in the northern periphery of Kolkata were most affected. Director of Health Services informs that in the year 2016, Dengue case fatality was higher because of infection by serotype DEN II and DEN IV which were much less in previous years. Secretary (PHP) emphasizes on cleanliness and IEC drive in schools. Additional Chief Secretary, Home Department requests to ensure more centres in North Bengal Districts for production of platelets. Chief Secretary reviews preparedness at the State level as well as at the district level. The following decisions are taken in the meeting for prevention of Dengue in the year 2017:

1. In the year 2017, total 91 Urban Local Bodies (including Jaigaon Development Authority) in the State have been selected in a joint meeting with SUDA for House-to-House survey during the months May, 2017 to October, 2017. For this, around Rs. 13 crore would be spent.
2. This year each H-to-H team would visit 50 houses/day. H-to H teams would also identify probable places of mosquito breeding and will inform municipal authority for removal of garbage. Micro plan for H-to H activities are to be prepared at the earliest.
3. In case of old 41 ULBs, the H-to-H teams of the last year would be given priority. If any change in the composition of the teams is necessary, prior permission of UD and MA Department to be obtained.
4. This year the H-to-H teams would visit houses in each fortnight. After each round of visit, evening monitoring meet by the Nodal Officials of Health and ULB to be done.
5. Proper training of the volunteers who undertake visits and the quality of this activity are to be ensured. Quality of larvicides/insecticides used by the ULBs & proper mixing & effective spraying to be ensured.
6. 49 posts of District Entomologists would be created and engaged at the CMOH offices.
7. 3/4 new Sentinel Surveillance Centres would be set up in addition to existing 32 number of SSLs for testing of blood samples.
8. Display of IEC materials at government offices has to be ensured.
9. Kits for test of Dengue are supplied by the GOI but those are inadequate. Health and FW Department would locally procure such kits.
10. Intensive IEC campaign would be done at schools, colleges on awareness generation and personal protection. Higher Education and School Education

Departments would re-circulate advisory on prevention of Dengue to all educational institutions & ensure school/college premises are thoroughly checked and cleaned immediately before schools resume after vacations.

11. District Magistrates are requested to convene meeting with all departments at the district level to review preparedness. Similarly, Sub-divisional Officers would convene meeting at the sub-division level.
12. Treatment protocol has to be strictly adhered to.
13. Nursing Homes would be made aware of the treatment protocol. Steps would be taken against defaulting Nursing Homes.
14. UD and MA Department has issued circular that open vats would not be allowed. This has to be ensured.
15. Cleaning of drains/canals has to be completed by May, 2017. If additional fund is required, UD and MA Department would provide.
16. H and FW Department would share information on the Blood Banks from where platelets would be available.
17. All government departments especially PWD are requested to ensure there is no water logging on the roof tops of office premises and government housings.

### **Malaria**

Number of cases of malaria is decreasing in the State but number of deaths have increased. This is because of delay in coming to health facilities and non-adherence to treatment protocol. Indoor Residual Spray (IRS) for Malaria, awareness camps, distribution of Long Lasting Insecticide treated Mosquito Nets (LLIN) (in Purulia, Bankura and Paschim Medinipur districts), training of Medical officers on treatment protocol etc are being done for prevention of Malaria in the State. The following decisions are taken in the meeting:

1. District Magistrates are requested to ensure that there is no refusal for Indoor Residual Spray (IRS) for Malaria and kala-azar. They are also requested to involve representatives of local bodies so that spray teams can have access to inside the houses.
2. New spray machines would be introduced.
3. 1000 Service cum awareness camps would be organized in the Malaria prone villages in Purulia, Bankura and Paschim Medinipur districts out of the State Budget. District Magistrates are requested to monitor preparation of micro plan based on evidences and also ensure wide publicity.
4. Long Lasting Insecticide treated Mosquito Nets (LLIN) are not effective for Dengue and Japanese Encephalitis as vector mosquitoes of these diseases bite in the day time/evening. LLINs are effective against Malaria only. Thus, LLINs would be distributed in malaria affected areas only.

### **Japanese Encephalitis/Acute Encephalitis Syndrome**

Cases of Japanese Encephalitis (JE) in the year 2016 have come down to almost half in comparison to that in the year 2015. Adult vaccination of JE (15- 65 years) has contributed to the reduction of cases. One round of Adult JE vaccination, covering 70 Blocks and municipalities is scheduled from February 2017. Following decisions are taken in the meeting:

1. Adult vaccination of JE is done in camps with injections being administered by the ANMs. District Magistrates of concerned districts are requested to monitor this.
2. PHE Department is requested to ensure quality of water supply for prevention of Acute Encephalitis Syndrome. AES may be prevented by means of regular testing of water quality, repair of platforms of tube wells and wells.
3. Patients suffering from JE/AES or Malaria should not be unnecessarily referred by hospitals. District Magistrates are requested to monitor this.
4. ARD Department is requested to take steps for containment of pigs before the AES season.
5. Department of Women & Child Development and Social Welfare may arrange for extra Take Home Ration for children recovered from Japanese Encephalitis.

Chief Secretary especially requests all District Magistrates to monitor the above mentioned decisions at regular intervals.

- **Ward Councillors participation** : All the Councillors are well aware and actively involved.
- **Hoardings/Banners/Miking/Rally** : **Hoardings/banners in place** and the Municipality **organized a rally against vector borne diseases on 08/03/2017** . **Miking done regularly in the wards.**
- **Fever clinics** : Eight NUHM UPHCS will serve as fever clinic from 1<sup>st</sup> week of May.
- **Control Room** : The Municipality have plans to set up a control room for reporting of house to house visit from the 1<sup>st</sup> week of May.
- **Computerization of reports** : The municipality has computers and from NUHM fund they already procured eight computers (eight for UPHCS ) for computerization of data, but installation has not been done.

- **Convergence with Sanitary Department** : Yes, the Councillor (Conservancy Department ) actively participates in the whole process.

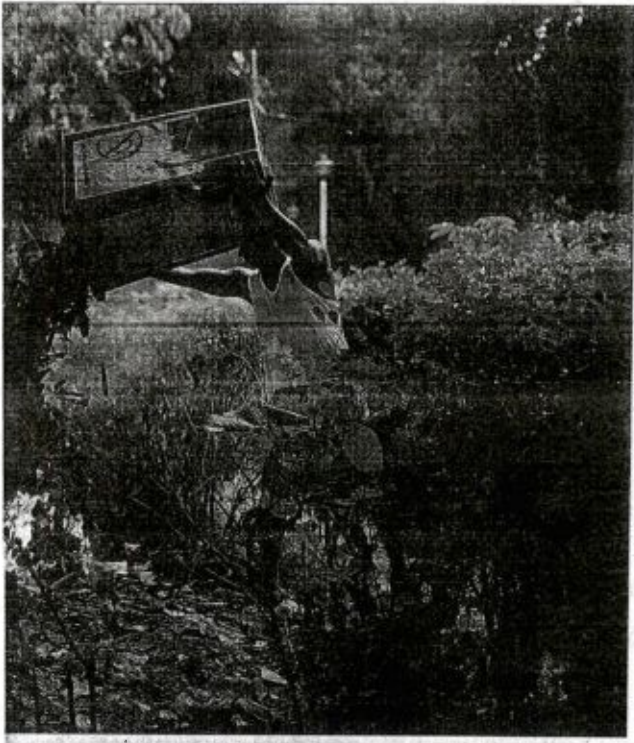

# দক্ষিণ দমদমে এখনও অভাব সচেতনতার

**সপ্তম শহর**  
**ডেঙ্গি-ম্যালেরিয়া**

**প্রবাল গঙ্গোপাধ্যায়**

এপ্রিলের দুই সপ্তাহ কেটে গেল। অথচ গত বছর ডেঙ্গিতে পর্যুদিত দক্ষিণ দমদম পুরসভা মশাবাহিত রোগ নিয়ে জন সচেতনতার কাজ শুরুই করতে পারল না।

গত বছর উত্তর ২৪ পরগনায় ডেঙ্গিতে সবচেয়ে বেশি মানুষের মৃত্যু হয়েছিল দক্ষিণ দমদম পুরসভা এলাকাতেই। তার জন্য ওই পুরসভাকে নবাব থেকে সতর্ক করে দেওয়া হয়েছিল। কিন্তু তাতে যে কোনও কাজ হয়েছে, তা পুরসভার হাবভাবে বোঝার উপায় নেই। পুর এলাকার বাসিন্দারা মশার দাপটে আতঙ্কিত। কিন্তু পুরসভা তাদের কাজটাই শুরু করতে পারেনি এখনও।

কেন? পুরসভা সূত্রের খবর, ওই এলাকায় ডেঙ্গি-ম্যালেরিয়া সচেতনতা অভিযানের জন্য কোনও পুরকর্মী নেই। এই কাজটা করেন স্টেট আর্বাণ ডেভলপমেন্ট অথরিটি (সুডা)-র কর্মীরা। ওই কর্মীরা এ বার দৈনিক ৭৫ টাকা মজুরিতে আর কাজ করতে চাইছেন না। ওই টাকাটা দেয় পুরসভা। এখনও সচেতনতা অভিযান শুরু না হওয়ায় কাউন্সিলরদের অনেকেই পুর-কর্তৃপক্ষের উপরে চাপ বাড়িয়েছেন। ওই চাপেই পুরসভা সুডা কর্মীদের দৈনিক মজুরি কী ভাবে বাড়ানো যায়, তা নিয়ে আলোচনা শুরু করেছে দক্ষিণ দমদম পুরসভা।

পুরসভার এই গয়গঞ্ছ মনোভাবে কাউন্সিলরদেরা অনেকেই বিরক্ত। এক কাউন্সিলরের মন্তব্য, “কলকাতা পুরসভা জানুয়ারি মাস থেকেই ডেঙ্গি, ম্যালেরিয়ার সচেতনতা অভিযান শুরু করে দিয়েছে। আর আমাদের পুরসভা এখন ঠিকই করতে পারল না কবে থেকে তারা অভিযান শুরু করবে। কে

বলবে গত বছর ডেঙ্গি মৃত্যুতে আমরা নাহো প্রথম স্থান পেয়েছিলাম।”

পুরসভা সূত্রে দাবি করা হয়েছে, সচেতনতা অভিযান যে একেবারেই হয়নি তা নয়, দু’-তিনটি প্রচার মিছিল হয়েছে। পরিস্থিতি নিয়ন্ত্রণে এবং মনুষ্যের মনে আস্থা ফেরাতে পুর-কর্তৃপক্ষ কাউন্সিলরদের বিশেষ দায়িত্ব দিয়েছে। ঠিক হয়েছে, কাউন্সিলরের ওয়ার্ডের বাসিন্দাদের সঙ্গে পুরসভার স্বাস্থ্য, জনস্বাস্থ্য বিভাগের কর্মীদের মুখোমুখি বসিয়ে দেবেন। যাতে বাসিন্দারা নিজেদের সমস্যা জানাতে পারেন। পুরসভা সূত্রে বলা হয়, সচেতনতা এবং মশা মারার অভিযানে নামার সময়ে দেখা যায় বেশ কিছু নাগরিক নিজেদের বাড়িতে ঢুকতে দিতে চান না পুরকর্মীদের। এই ধরনের প্রকাশ্য সভায় সনাক্ত করা যাবে ওই সব নাগরিককে যারা সচেতনতার কাজে ব্যাঘাত ঘটান।

মশা মারা অভিযান এবং সচেতনতা অভিযানে সব কর্মীর প্রতিদিন ৫০টি বাড়িতে যাওয়ার কথা। কিন্তু দৈনিক ৭৫ টাকা মজুরিতে কোনও কর্মীই দৈনিক ৫০টি বাড়িতে যেতে চাইছেন না। এক কাউন্সিলর বলেন, “এত কম টাকায় কেউই প্রতিদিন ৫০টি বাড়িতে পৌঁছন না। তার উপরে সুডা-র নিয়ম, মাসে ১০ দিন কাজ হবে। ফলে সুডা কর্মীরা কেউই তেমন ভাবে কাজে উৎসাহ দেখাচ্ছেন না।”

দক্ষিণ দমদম পুরসভার চেয়ারম্যান পারিষদ (স্বাস্থ্য) গোপা পাণ্ডে বলেন, “আমরা টাকার সমস্যার সমাধানের চেষ্টা করছি। গোপা দেবীর দাবি, সুডা কর্মীরা ছাঁড়াও পুরসভার জনস্বাস্থ্য বিভাগের কর্মীরা নাগরিকদের বাড়ি বাড়ি গিয়ে প্রচার ও সচেতনতার কাজ করেন। নাগরিকেরা অবশ্য এমন দাবি মানতেই চাইছেন না। তাঁরা আতঙ্কে অপেক্ষা করছেন বর্ষার পরের পরিস্থিতির জন্য। তখনই যে থাংবা বসায় ডেঙ্গি-ম্যালেরিয়া।

## সত্ত্বো হনতাই

ধরন হয়ে বলে জানাচ্ছেন ওই পুলিশকর্তা। প্রথম দলটি বাজার, বাস, ভিড় দোকান— এ সব জায়গায় হাতসাক্ষাৎ চালায়। আর দ্বিতীয় দলটি বিশেষ করে অপারেশন চালায় ভেদে হাটতে বেরোনো মানুষদের লক্ষ করে। তবে ওই পুলিশকর্তার মতে, বেশির ভাগ ক্ষেত্রে পুরনো ছিনতাইকারী দলগুলির দাপটেই বাড়ছে দুর্কর্ম। নতুন ছিনতাইকারীরা এই উৎসব মরসুমের ভিড়ে চট করে হাত পাকাতে নামে না।

লালবাজারের এক পুলিশকর্তা আবার মনে করিয়ে দিলেন, এক সময়ে ভোরের ফাঁকা রাস্তায় প্রচুর ছিনতাই হতো। সেগুলি রুখতে, হাতের দস্তাই তোর বেলাতেও পুলিশি টহলদারির সিজাক্ত হয়েছিল কিছু দিন আগে। “সেই অভ্যাসটাই আবার জোরদার ভাবে ফিরিয়ে আনার কথা ভাবছি আমরা। কারণ সানীং ফের খুব বেশি করে ছিনতাই হচ্ছে ভোরের ফাঁকা রাস্তায়।”— দিলেন তিনি।

**Points of Discussion:**

- a. **List of ULBs for inclusion in 2017:-** The list of 62 ULBs identified by H&FW Department for the H-to-H activities during 2017 with reasons for inclusion is shared with MA department for their feedback at earliest.
- b. Activity will be from May to October,2017, total 6 months. It will be a fortnightly activity.
- c. Universal fixed timing for activity:-1st Fortnight: from 1st to 5th of the calendar month.2nd Fortnight: from 16th to 20th of the calendar month.
- d. Total no. of teams, composition of Team, Supervisor etc. as proposed by SUDA in their letter no SUDA-Health/65(PT.XIV)/16/207 Dt.28.12.2016 is agreed to in respect of 62 ULBs.
- e. Teams must cover domestic, immediate peri-domestic & the common areas, shops, hotels, offices, grounds, under construction sites so that there will be no left out areas. Supervisors to oversee the activities of common places, Hotels, Shops, constructed sites etc.
- f. Teams to submit their daily report to the supervisors. Supervisors to submit the report to the Municipal Health Officer daily.
- g. One Register to be maintained with the Municipal Health Officer for day wise entry of the findings of the teams related to unusual larva indices, pending scavenging works, fever cases. It is expected that MHO will take immediate suitable redressal measures by involving the ULB authorities & for unusual fever cases with the CMOH on a daily basis during the H-to-H activity.
- h. Dy. CMOH-II for district HQ ULB & respective sub-divisional ACMOHS for rest of the ULBs will be Nodal Officers from Health. Necessary orders will be issued from the end of the DHS.
- i. Technical analysis will have to be taken up in the office of the Dy.CMOH-II at the end of the activity round on a fixed date:- ( 10<sup>th</sup>. & 25<sup>th</sup>. if holiday immediate next working day).All MHOs, ACMOHS,District VBD Consultants/ Epidemiologist to participate. For N24Pargana district it will spread for two days owing to large number of ULBs.
- j. ULB wise reporting to be done by the CMOH to state Epidemiologist (IDSP) utilizing IDSP net work in a format to be designed by the H& FW Deptt along with the existing team wise data format by ( 12<sup>th</sup>. & 27<sup>th</sup>. if holiday immediate next working day).Simultaneously at local level actions as deemed necessary to be initiated by the ULB/or Department of Health basing upon the technical evaluation reporting.
- k. At state level the report will be analysed by a team headed by Dy.DHS(PH), other b-ing Entomologist (IBD),SNO(IDSP),State Epidemiologist (IDSP) & State Entomologist(IDSP). Necessary feedback to the districts & Director SUDA will be given.

l. Training:-

- a. Master Trainers at State HQ. To be arranged by SUDA.
- b. For Volunteers:- Health & FW Department's participation is mandatory. Not to utilize any untrained volunteers under any circumstances.
- c. Fogging team members, Insecticide/larvicide spray members of the ULB to be trained by the Health & FW Department.
- m. Quality of the manpower to be utilized is critical for success towards desired outcome. So, some essential criteria for selection of volunteers may be imposed like :
  - a. Physically fit with an upper age limit of 55 yrs.
  - b. Minimum educational level (that enables them to read and fill in the formats correctly).
- n. Training and IEC to be done for all 125 municipalities. Prototype of season specific IEC materials will be shared by Department of H & FW. Sufficient IEC leaflets to be distributed to the families. Special emphasis to be given on awareness generation to ensure personal protection & keeping all fever cases under mosquito nets.
- o. Proposal for issue of one Family Card to each of the families from the end of the ULBs. Format will be developed by Health & FW Deptt. Entries will be date of the visit with signature of the volunteer & the available senior member of the household.
- p. To ensure use of NVBDCP approved Insecticide & Larvicide with proper dilution maintaining the guidelines for fogging, spray. Health & FW Deptt. will share necessary details to SUDA.
- q. Few group meetings may be organized in the area as a part of IEC to ensure full Community participation, awareness generation & taking the ownership. Miking at places may also be considered.
- r. Effective Supervision & Monitoring with reporting from both Health & FW Department & ULB to be considered during the activity days. Existing format may be utilized.

With this the meeting ended.



- Chief Secretary convened a meeting on 02.02.2017 with Municipal Affairs Department and Health and FW Department regarding preparedness to control dengue and hold VC with the respective DM's
- Instructions issued by the Deptt. of UD & MA to all the ULBs <sup>Subj. cont.</sup> as under :
  - To ensure excavation of clogged drains so that flow is maintained
  - To give utmost effort to cover the open drains in the Municipal jurisdiction
  - To take care of the low lying areas to prevent accumulation of water
  - To ensure cleanliness through regular waste disposal including bio-medical waste
  - To take effort for removal of open vat and to replace the same by placing container

### Prevention & Control of Dengue

- To maintain regular cleaning of container by using compactor for which route chart to be placed
- To maintain ward-wise database of probable breeding grounds for taking immediate actions
- To ensure availability of larvicide / insecticide as well as its application as per technical specification of National Vector Borne Disease Control Programme (NVBDCP) guideline available in the website [www.nvbdc.gov.in](http://www.nvbdc.gov.in) & [www.wbhealth.gov.in](http://www.wbhealth.gov.in)
- To update knowledge of spray workers w.r.t. proper mixing and effective spraying of larvicide / insecticide
- To organize intensive campaign and wide publicity immediately in line with campaign already taken up by the State Government. Rally, posting of Banner, Hoarding; electronic media, distribution of leaflet, group meeting and other means may be adopted for the purpose

### Prevention & Control of Dengue

- To eliminate the mosquito breeding places in the respective Municipal area. To take special care of the construction sites, abandoned areas, peri-domestic areas being the most vulnerable mosquito breeding sites
- To create awareness amongst the community so that they could identify the mosquito breeding places and destroy the same
- To involve all the Health facilities like U-PHCs, HAU, Sub-Centres, all the Health man-power like doctors, Health workers and others under Health Programmes i.e. NUHM, UPHCS, CBPHCS & HHW Scheme. Doctors to be assigned ward-wise for monitoring & supervision
- To inspect all the School & College premises, various Central Government & other offices and residential premises, Government & private Hospital premises, factory, commercial places for mosquito breeding sites for taking action

### Prevention & Control of Dengue

- Fund for Procurement of Larvicidal & IEC be released to all the ULBs as was done in previous year
- ✓ House to house activity be undertaken in 90 ULBs – 87 NUHM ULBs and Beldanga, Nalhati, Sainthia Mpl.
- ✓ House to house activity from May to October, 2017 fortnightly – 1<sup>st</sup> fortnight from 1<sup>st</sup> to 5<sup>th</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> fortnight from 16<sup>th</sup> to 20<sup>th</sup> of Calendar Month
- Meeting already held with the <sup>72</sup>ULBs for preparation of Micro-plan and to submit by 1<sup>st</sup> week of March, 2017
- Micro-Plan is to cover not only household but also non-residential areas in between houses, market, shops, hotels, offices, construction sites etc.
- ~~ULB to set up one control room for entire duration of H-t-H activity~~

### **Prevention & Control of Dengue**

- Nodal Officer will collect information on fever, garbage dump and clogged drains, if any, to the concerned District Health Office and conservancy wing of ULB

**Detailed Operational Guidelines for smooth implementation of the H-to-H Activity in Selected ULBs- 2017-West Bengal for prevention and control of Dengue & Chikungunya.**

1. Activity will be from May to October,2017, total for 6 months.
2. It will be a fortnightly activity during 2017.
3. Activity will cover 90 ULBs. For this ULB wise total number of teams, Supervisors & fund requirement etc. has been calculated by SUDA has been agreed upon (**annexure-A**).
4. Uniform fixed timing for activity:-
  - a. **1st Fortnight:** from 1st to 5th of the calendar month.
  - b. **2nd Fortnight:** from 16th to 20th of the calendar month.
5. No of Teams admissible for calculation will be at the ratio of 01 Team for 60 Households. 01 Supervisor for 05 Teams. Number of Volunteers required for office works will be @ 4/all ULBs (excluding 8 for Howrah MC & Bidhannagar MC , 12 for Asansol MC).
6. The rate of honorarium per day for Volunteers, Supervisors, Office Volunteers will be Ra.75/- per day.
7. Form the department of H&FW, Dy. CMOH-II will be the Nodal Officer for district HQ ULB. For Sub Divisional ULB/(s) respective ACMOH of the sub-division will be the Nodal Officer. For Bidhannagar MC, the ACMOH, Salt Lake, for Howrah MC the Dy.CMOH-II, Howrah, for Asansol MC, the Dy. CMOH-II, Asansol will be the Nodal Officer. ULB wise list of Nodal Officer (Health) with contact details will be shared with SUDA authority (**annexure-B**). All the Nodal Officers (Health) will work under control of the respective CMOHs .
8. SUDA authority will ensure to prepare the list of ULB wise Nodal Officer(ULB) & share it with the Department of H&FW.
9. Each of the ULB has to prepare one Team wise & Ward wise MICROPLAN. Responsibility for developing the same will be that of the ULB. To be completed by 28.02.2017. Respective Nodal Officer (Health) will help in developing the Microplan from the end of the Department of H&FW. The total geographic area of the ward is to be distributed suitably amongst the available teams, so that the no geographic area is left uncovered. Teams must cover domestic, immediate peri-domestic & the entire shared/ public/ private areas in between houses within allotted geographical area. The microplan will contain the name of the starting household & the last household day wise with mention of non-residential areas in between houses, market, shops, hotels, offices, grounds, construction sites etc by name, so that those are not missed. Supervisors to oversee the activities of common places, Hotels, Shops, constructed sites etc in particular. The Proforma is as per **annexure-C**.
10. Necessary logistics for H-to-H activity will be supplied by the ULB authority for carrying out the inspection for breeding sites & larvae during visit.

11. ULB authority will also issue ID Card for the activity to each Team Member & Supervisor.
12. ULB authority to ensure running of one Control Room at each of the ULBs for the entire duration of the activity. One staff from the end of the Nodal Officer (Health) will attend the Control room in the after-noon. The said staff will primarily collect information of fever case load & clustering & will inform the respective Nodal Officer, Dy.CMOH-II & the CMOH instantly.
13. Each Team to visit each of the households as per microplan. Perform IPC with available members in relation to the prevention & control of vector mosquito, fever. Distribute leaflets received from the ULB. Have inspection for containers, larvae within the household. So also the peri domestic areas. If larvae found then the same to be destroyed with the help of the available members of the house. The team will also collect the no. of fever cases with joint pain &/or definite bodyache in the family for the day & that for last 2 weeks.
14. For the first time a Household Card/Family Card (**annexure-D**) will be printed by the respective ULBs as per Prototype to be supplied by the Department of H&FW, which will be handed over to the house owner during 1<sup>st</sup>.round visit & will be retained with the family. This Card will be updated by the team members during visit of each round. Necessary data should be noted down before leaving the house. If required the team can get the signature of the member of the house on his/her register as a proof of the visit.
15. Team wise Reporting Format (**annexure-E**), Supervisor wise Reporting Format (**annexure-F**), Soft copy format for entry of Team-wise reporting (**annexure-G**) have been revised & will be shared with SUDA authority.
16. Each Team will have to submit their daily report at the end of the allotted activity to their respective supervisors. Supervisors to submit the report to the designated Municipal Health authority daily at the Control Room.
17. ULB authority to ensure to maintain one Register at the Control Room for day wise entry of the findings of the teams related to unusual larval presence, pending scavenging/cleanliness works, blocked drains, low wet patches of land, fever cases etc.
18. ULB authority will ensure taking urgent suitable redressal measures by involving the concerned wing of the ULB in respect of reported pending waste management & cleanliness/ sewer management/ insecticidal spray, with noting of the action taken in the register.
19. Both the Departments of H&FW & MA should ensure enough supervision & monitoring from the end of both Health & ULB during the activity proper. The **Format-H** should be utilized for the purpose. These Reports to be deposited at the Control room to be looked into by the Nodal Officer (ULB) on daily basis for taking instant action, if required.
20. Technical analysis of the outcome of the activity at the end of each round will have to be taken up in the office of the Dy.CMOH-II on a fixed date (10th & 25<sup>th</sup>; if holiday, immediate next working day) under guidance of the Chief Medical Officer of Health. All designated officials from the ULB, all Nodal Officers (Health & ULB), District VBD Consultants/ Epidemiologist to participate.

For N24Parganas district it will be spread for two days owing to large number of ULBs. The Nodal Officer (ULB) must carry all Monitoring Reports, the Register where the pending activities reported by the teams were recorded daily with noting of the subsequent action/(s) taken along with Team-wise soft copy.

21. ULB wise comprehensive reporting has to be done by the CMOH & to be sent to the e-mail address of State Epidemiologist (IDSP) & Entomologist (IBD) utilizing IDSP net work in a format developed by the H & FW Deptt (**Form-I**) along with the existing team wise data format (soft copy) by ( 12<sup>th</sup> & 27<sup>th</sup>; if holiday, immediate next working day). The report in Form-I is also to be shared with the Chairperson of the ULB.
22. Simultaneously at local level actions as deemed necessary to be taken up by the ULB/or Department of Health basing upon the technical evaluation reporting.
23. At state level the report will be analysed by a team headed by Dy.DHS (Malaria), others being Entomologist (IBD), SNO(IDSP), State Epidemiologist (IDSP) & State Entomologist(IDSP). Necessary feedback to the districts & Director SUDA will be given.
24. Prototype of season specific IEC materials will be shared by Department of H & FW. Sufficient IEC leaflets to be distributed to the families during activity rounds. Special emphasis to be given on awareness generation to ensure personal protection & keeping all fever cases under mosquito nets. All the ULBs to be covered (125).
25. ULB authority may consider organizing few group meetings in the area as a part of IEC to ensure full Community participation, awareness generation & taking the ownership.
26. ULB authority may also consider Miking at places .
27. Training:-
  - a. **For Volunteers:-** Health & FW Department's participation is mandatory. Not to utilize any untrained volunteers under any circumstances. For this a uniform PPT will be developed by the Department of H&FW. Quality of the manpower to be utilized is critical for success towards desired outcome. So, some essential criteria for selection of volunteers may be considered like :
    - i. Physically fit with an upper age limit of 55 yrs.
    - ii. Minimum educational level (that enables them to read and fill in the formats correctly and to take enough personal protective measure).
  - b. **For Vector Control personnel** of all the ULBs (all except KMC) to be trained by the Health & FW Department & KMC. For this a Uniform PPT will be shared by the H&FW Deptt. One advisory will be issued by the department of H&FW as regards to the NVBDCP approved list of Larvicides & Adulticides with dilution details & operational guidelines.
28. The evaluation & monitoring will be taken up intermittently jointly by the department of H&FW & MAUD at state HQ & also with few/all ULBs through VC.

- The Hon'ble Chief Minister hold a meeting on 08.02.2016 and 02.08.2016 on Prevention of Vector Borne Diseases i.e. Dengue / Malaria in Urban areas.
- Following to the meeting of Hon'ble Chief Minister, the Chief Secretary convened a meeting on 08.03.2016 with Municipal Affairs Department and Health and FW Department regarding preparedness to control dengue.
- Chief Secretary hold a meeting on 08.04.2016 with GOI & other officials, Municipal Affairs Department and Health and FW Department for interdepartmental co-ordination and on 04.08.2016 & 21.09.2016 to follow up the progress.
- Principal Secretary, Department of Municipal Affairs hold a meeting on 29.03.2016 with the ULBs.
- 41 ULBs have been identified as high risk ULBs by the Department of Health & Family Welfare.
- Training of trainers conducted on 16.02.2016 for identified persons of those 41 ULBs. Technical training had been imparted by the official of Health and FW Department.
- The trainers of ULB organized training at the ULB level for the field volunteers and supervisors wherein technical input provided by District Health.
- All the 41 ULBs have submitted micro plan and started house to house visit for consecutive five days in a month w.e.f. April, 2016.
- Printing of leaflet done by SUDA centrally and delivered to the ULBs.
- Monitoring officials of SUDA visited ULBs (either separately or along with official of Health & Family Welfare Department) during / after house to house visit.
- ACMOHs are the Nodal Officer from Health and FW Department.
- After completion of each round of house to house visit ACMOH concerned and Health Officer of ULB shall analyse the team-wise data and to suggest corrective steps required before implementation of next round. Furthermore, short evaluation note under the joint signature of ACMOH and Health Officer are to be made available with State NVBDCP cell of Health and FW Department through Dy. CMOH-II. ULB send a report as per format provided by Health and FW Department to SUDA for onward submission to Health and FW Department.
- Meeting convened by the Secretary, Municipal Affairs Department with respective DM and Mayor / Chairpersons of all the ULBs.

### Points of Discussion:

- a. **List of ULBs for inclusion in 2017:-** The list of 62 ULBs identified by H&FW Department for the H-to-H activities during 2017 with reasons for inclusion is shared with MA department for their feedback at earliest.
- b. Activity will be from May to October,2017, total 6 months. It will be a fortnightly activity.
- c. Universal fixed timing for activity:-1st Fortnight: from 1st to 5th of the calendar month.2nd Fortnight: from 16th to 20th of the calendar month.
- d. Total no. of teams, composition of Team, Supervisor etc. as proposed by SUDA in their letter no SUDA-Health/65(PT.XIV)/16/207 Dt.28.12.2016 is agreed to in respect of 62 ULBs.
- e. Teams must cover domestic, immediate peri-domestic & the common areas, shops, hotels, offices, grounds, under construction sites so that there will be no left out areas. Supervisors to oversee the activities of common places, Hotels, Shops, constructed sites etc.
- f. Teams to submit their daily report to the supervisors. Supervisors to submit the report to the Municipal Health Officer daily.
- g. One Register to be maintained with the Municipal Health Officer for day wise entry of the findings of the teams related to unusual larva indices, pending scavenging works, fever cases. It is expected that MHO will take immediate suitable redressal measures by involving the ULB authorities & for unusual fever cases with the CMOH on a daily basis during the H-to-H activity.
- h. Dy. CMOH-II for district HQ ULB & respective sub-divisional ACMOHS for rest of the ULBs will be Nodal Officers from Health. Necessary orders will be issued from the end of the DHS.
- i. Technical analysis will have to be taken up in the office of the Dy.CMOH-II at the end of the activity round on a fixed date:- ( 10<sup>th</sup> & 25<sup>th</sup> if holiday immediate next working day). All MHOs, ACMOHS, District VBD Consultants/ Epidemiologist to participate. For N24Pargana district it will spread for two days owing to large number of ULBs.
- j. ULB wise reporting to be done by the CMOH to state Epidemiologist (IDSP) utilizing IDSP net work in a format to be designed by the H& FW Deptt along with the existing team wise data format by ( 12<sup>th</sup> & 27<sup>th</sup>, if holiday immediate next working day).Simultaneously at local level actions as deemed necessary to be initiated by the ULB/or Department of Health basing upon the technical evaluation reporting.
- k. At state level the report will be analysed by a team headed by Dy.DHS(PH), others being Entomologist (IBM),SNO(IDSP),State Epidemiologist (IDSP) & State Entomologist(IDSP). Necessary feedback to the districts & Director SUDA will be given.

- I. Training:-
- Master Trainers at State HQ. To be arranged by SUDA.
  - For Volunteers:- Health & FW Department's participation is mandatory. Not to utilize any untrained volunteers under any circumstances.
  - Fogging team members, Insecticide/larvicide spray members of the ULB to be trained by the Health & FW Department.
- m. Quality of the manpower to be utilized is critical for success towards desired outcome. So, some essential criteria for selection of volunteers may be imposed like :
- Physically fit with an upper age limit of 55 yrs.
  - Minimum educational level (that enables them to read and fill in the formats correctly).
- n. Training and IEC to be done for all 125 municipalities. Prototype of season specific IEC materials will be shared by Department of H & FW. Sufficient IEC leaflets to be distributed to the families. Special emphasis to be given on awareness generation to ensure personal protection & keeping all fever cases under mosquito nets.
- o. Proposal for issue of one Family Card to each of the families from the end of the ULBs. Format will be developed by Health & FW Deptt. Entries will be date of the visit with signature of the volunteer & the available senior member of the household.
- p. To ensure use of NVBDCP approved Insecticide & Larvicide with proper dilution maintaining the guidelines for fogging, spray. Health & FW Deptt. will share necessary details to SUDA.
- q. Few group meetings may be organized in the area as a part of IEC to ensure full Community participation, awareness generation & taking the ownership. Miking at places may also be considered.
- r. Effective Supervision & Monitoring with reporting from both Health & FW Department & ULB to be considered during the activity days. Existing format may be utilized.

You may be aware that incidences of Dengue had been reported in a number of ULBs in the last year. Utmost importance is to be given for taking preparation well in advance to ensure prevention of Dengue, Chikunguniya. You are requested to take following urgent preventive measures in your Municipal area :

- 1) To ensure excavation of clogged drains so that flow is maintained.
- 2) To give utmost effort to cover the open drains in the Municipal jurisdiction.
- 3) To take care of the low lying areas to prevent accumulation of water.
- 4) To ensure cleanliness through regular waste disposal including bio-medical waste.
- 5) To take effort for removal of open vat and to replace the same by placing container.
- 6) To maintain regular cleaning of container by using compactor for which route chart to be placed.
- 7) To maintain ward-wise database of probable breeding grounds for taking immediate actions.

- 8) To ensure availability of larvicide / insecticide as well as its application as per technical specification of National Vector Borne Disease Control Programme (NVBDCP) guideline available in the website [www.nvbdc.gov.in](http://www.nvbdc.gov.in) & [www.wbhealth.gov.in](http://www.wbhealth.gov.in).
- 9) To update knowledge of spray workers w.r.t. proper mixing and effective spraying of larvicide / insecticide.
- 10) To organize intensive campaign and wide publicity immediately in line with campaign already taken up by the State Government. Rally, posting of Banner, Hoarding; electronic media, distribution of leaflet, group meeting and other means may be adopted for the purpose.
- 11) To eliminate the mosquito breeding places in the respective Municipal area. To take special care of the construction sites, abandoned areas, peri-domestic areas being the most vulnerable mosquito breeding sites.
- 12) To create awareness amongst the community so that they could identify the mosquito breeding places and destroy the same.
- 13) To involve all the Health facilities like U-PHCs, HAU, Sub-Centres, all the Health manpower like doctors, Health workers and others under Health Programmes i.e. NUHM, UPHCS, CBPHCS & HHW Scheme. Doctors to be assigned ward-wise for monitoring & supervision.
- 14) To inspect all the School & College premises, various Central Government & other offices and residential premises, Government & private Hospital premises, factory, commercial places for mosquito breeding sites for taking action.



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

**Subject: Proposal for long term and short term measures to curb the menace of Dengue in Bidhannagar Municipal Corporation**

Sir,

As you are aware, there has been a spurt in the number of Dengue cases reported in Bidhannagar Corporation during the current financial year. Though timely intervention from the end of the Corporation, backed by your relentless support and leadership has managed to keep the menace in check, it is felt that if a slew of measures can be initiated from the end of the Corporation, both long term and short term, it will have a definitive impact in checking the incidence of the disease in the long run. A list of such measures, both long term and short term is given below for favour of your kind perusal and necessary guidance

**A) Long Term Measures:**

- i. Recruitment of an Entomologist
- ii. Establishment of an Entomological Laboratory
- iii. Since the wards falling under Rajarhat portion of the Corporation do not have mosquito workers, unlike their counterparts in the Bidhannagar portion, outsourcing the services of mosquito workers for those wards will aid in the regular spraying of larvicides and adulticides in those areas that are most susceptible to the outbreak will go a great deal towards curbing the incidence of the disease.
- iv. It is found that cowsheds or khatals are posing to be a great source of health hazard in the locality and are indirectly aiding the breeding of mosquitoes. Necessary amendments are required to be made in the West Bengal Municipal Corporation Act, 2006 arming the Corporation with powers to dismantle such khatals that are a source of health hazard and a breeding ground of mosquitoes.
- v. Organizing sensitization programmes in local schools and offices on a regular basis.

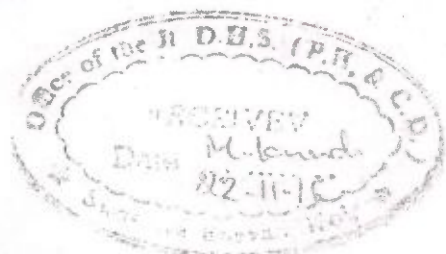


