

Sub: Report with regard to visit at Dum Dum, Baidyabati, Baruipur and Serampore Municipality relating to preparedness for control of dengue/chikunguniya

As per instruction, Dr. G. Dey and Dr. S. Basu visited Dum Dum and Baidyabati Municipality respectively on 07.04.2017 and Baruipur and Serampore Municipality respectively on 08.04.2017. Reports are enclosed at **Flag 3 to 6**.

Both the ULBs have taken actions with regard to house to house visit to be held with effect from May 2017.

Summary of observations as on 07.04.2017:

<p>Abandoned Jessop Factory Gate No. 12</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Condemned vehicles, machinery and its parts within the factory premises are the potential source of mosquito breeding.</u> • A vat lying opposite to gate no. 12 with is full with garbage and spillage on road side. 	<p>Ward No. 1 & 2</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Drains are clogged in some areas. • Pond is covered with water hyacinth in Ward No. 1. • No open vat. • Door to door garbage collection, segregation and sending waste to RWMC Baidyabati regularly. • Preparedness for conduct of Micro Plan are in place. • IEC – Hoarding and banners will be ready by one week. Central rally will be held. • Two NUHM UPHCs will serve as fever clinic from 1st week of May.
<p>Ward No. 15 – U.K. Dutta Road</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • An abandoned house near a triangular road junction - potential source of breeding. • An open dump yard opposite to Saint Stephens School – causing road side spillage of garbage. • Road side drains partly clogged. 	
<p>Ward No. 14 (Kalidham)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ponds in the area with accumulation of garbage along its sides. • Road side drains clogged. 	

Summary of observations as on 08.04.2017:

<p>Ward No. 12 – Baruipur Court premises</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Drains clogged. <u>Larvae found in one of the drains. A vat lying uncovered with road side spillage of garbage.</u> • Abandoned plot with garbage and bushes found being the potential source for mosquito breeding. 	<p>Ward No. 2 & 15</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Drains are clogged in some areas. • Door to door garbage collection, segregation and sending waste to RWMC regularly. • The Chairman has a concern for two choked canals i.e. Rayland road canal in Ward No. 24, 25 and Danish Canal in Ward No. 3,4,7 which require man power and fund for cleaning. • Regular larvicidal is in place. • NUHM UPHCs will serve as fever clinic from 1st week of May.
<p>Ward No. 15 – Baruipur SD Hospital premises</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Drains clogged. Larvae found in the drain near ACMOH Office area. • Garbage dumping. 	
<p>Ward No. 17 – Railway over bridge area</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Drains clogged. • Accumulation of garbage alongside the bank of ponds. 	



Interventions required:

For Dum Dum Municipality

- Abandoned Jessop factory in Dum Dum needs intervention by the ULB and District Administration.
- Solid waste management needs to be boost up by the ULB.
- Clogged drains to be cleaned by the ULB before monsoon.

For Baruipur Municipality

- Solid waste management needs to be boost up by the ULB.
- Clogged drains to be cleaned by the ULB before monsoon
- Abandoned plots/premises needs intervention by the ULB to prevent mosquito breeding.
- Solid waste disposal from the SD hospital shall be planned by the hospital authority with the ULB.
- Regular larvicidal operation be done by the ULB.

For Serampore Municipality

- Clogged drains to be cleaned by the ULB before monsoon.
- With regard to cleaning of choked canal the ULB may draw plan with District Administration.

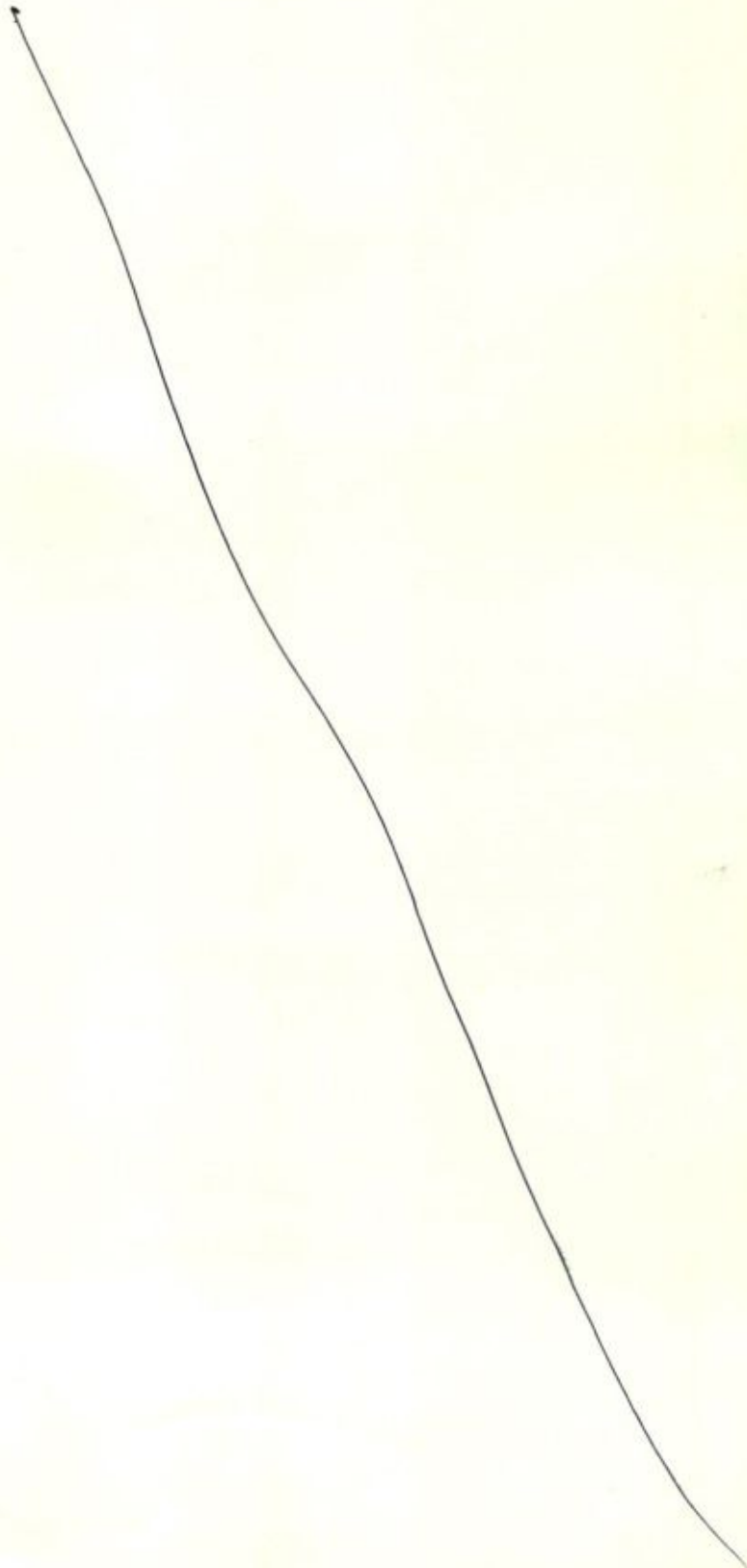

Dr. S. Basu visited the ULBs and submitted report which is enclosed at **Flag-A**.

Summary of observations :

This is to state that --

- Total no. of team for house to house activity in South Dum Dum Municipality – 346, No. of Supervisor – 70.
- No. of existing HHW – 128 and FTS – 22, thus totaling 150.
- Out of 150, 99 HHWs / FTSs involved in House to House activity.
- Ward No. – 13 (Madhugarh) detected as Dengue prone area in the last year also.
- 08 teams & 02 supervisors have been allotted in ward no. – 13. All the team members and supervisors are the volunteers selected by the Councillor.
- Training of all the volunteers & supervisors done by Health Officer and District Health Office.



NOTE SHEET



Interventions required :

- Show cause may be issued to the team members and supervisors of ward no. - 13.
- Notice shall be issued by the ULB to the household where larvae detected.
- Re-training of the volunteers and supervisors shall be organized by District Health Office.
- Training of spray workers shall be organized by District Health Office.
- Monitoring by Ward Committee members shall be in-place.
- Inter-sectoral coordination amongst team members, conservancy workers and spray workers shall be strengthened.
- Over and above, immediate mop up house to house surveillance may be done by the team members - supervised by the supervisor and under the supervision of central team consisting of SUDA official, DHFW official, councillor, ward committee members.
