Sub: Prevention and Management of Vector Borne Diseases in Urban Local Bodies:
Advisory

Dear Mayor/Chairperson/Administrator,

You are aware that the State Government has attached highest importance towards prevention of vector borne diseases. This is also being monitored regularly at the level of the Chief Secretary. Hon'ble Chief Minister has reviewed this time and again at Administrative Review meetings. All ULBs have more or less taken initiatives in this regard and as guided by Health & Family Welfare Department, all kinds of monitoring activities have been taken up. In the meantime SUDA has released funds towards various purpose including VCT, procurement of Larvicides etc.

In view of the prevalence of vector borne diseases, which has still not shown any signs of recession, senior officers of the Department have been tagged and the officers are moving frequently to all ULBs, particularly in the vulnerable ULBs to monitor the situation closely. A study of the report of these teams reveal some serious deficiencies which need your immediate attention:

1) In most of the wards, there is a clear lack of coordination between VCT and H to H teams. As a result, health related works of the ULBs are not properly coordinated with the conservancy work resulting in accumulation of garbage in the vicinity of human habitations. *peri domestic area*

2) Often it is found that VCT team is regularly changed by ULBs resulting break in continuity. VCT workers are trained and their continuity is a must for getting best output from these teams. Any proposal for change, if absolutely essential, may be referred to SUDA for approval and training of new members. Untrained members should not be deployed for this work.

- 3) In few ULBs, VCTs have not been formed at all in all wards resulting poor performance in VBD control work.
- 4) Spraying teams of the ULBs should be well trained so that spraying is done properly. It is seen that in many cases spraying has been done unscientifically on the branches of trees/walls of buildings which is a wrong practice. Apart from the fact that larvicide is wasted in such cases, such spraying has no impact on control of vector. The teams should be properly trained in this regard.
- 5) In many areas irrigation canals are blocked; these are open breeding grounds for mosquitoes and these should be cleared regularly. In this regard coordination meeting between the ULB and the respective line Department may be held at regular interval. Similarly desilting of local drains should be done by ULBs.
- 6) Many premises including those of institutions owned by GoI are not properly cleaned; this problem is particularly acute in railway lands. Matter should be regularly taken up at appropriate level to redress these issues. If action is not taken by the owners of these premises, the ULB is empowered to enter the premises and get it cleaned. The owner of the premises may then be sent a bill for the expenses incurred. This provision of law has been introduced (section 333 of the West Bengal Municipal Act, 1993 and similar provisions in the other acts).
- 7) Few ULBs have unmanaged/abandoned and inaccessible lands/construction sites and water bodies, which have become ideal breeding ground of mosquitoes. These should be cleaned regularly.
- 8) In every ULB, Task Force for Solid Waste Management has been constituted. Members of the Task Force may intensify the monitoring and employees found responsible for dereliction of duty may be made accountable and suitable punitive action taken.
- 9) H to H teams in many areas are submitting Nil report in Environmental Management Portal without verifying the ground situation. These personnel may be identified immediately and appropriate action may be initiated against them.
- 10) Effective IEC for a behaviour change communication have to be enhanced as there is lack of awareness among citizens.
- 11) Supervision, it is felt to a large extent, is confined to compilation of data generated by H to H team compromising the field visits which is their primary task.
- 12) It has also been observed that many contractual/daily wage employees of ULBs are not involved in conservancy works (though they are not carrying out any specific tasks either). All employees paid out of public funds should be engaged for conservancy works unless they have any other specific regular tasks.





Priority activities to monitor are :

(a)	House to House team visit	:	Done twice / thrice in a month in pre-scheduled dates. During November, 2019 it is scheduled from 4 th to 8 th November and 18 th to 22 nd November. The team enquire about fever case(s) and presence of any domestic and peridomestic water collection, that will act as a potential source of larval breeding. They the team also drain facilitated the drain the collection of water.
(b)	VCT activities	:	Done simulteneously house to house activities twice in a month (in other areas / every week (in vulnerable area). Two such team (x three members) engaged in each ward of ULBs. They are supposed to identify, manage the peridomestic water collection.
(c)	Monitoring & supervisory activities	:	One supervisor for five house to house team to supervise the activity of (a) & (b) above.
(d)	Spraying of larvicide	:	Done by spray workers (of ULB) and VCT team (one member). Spray should be done in water collections (not in bushes) at weekly interval in same areas.
(e)	Conservancy work	:	Two things to notice - block drain and accumulation of garbages (as identified h-t-h team).
(f)	Fogging	:	To be done within 200 mtr. distance of the households with cases. The technique and timing (during evening / early morning) should be appropriate.
(g)	ULB level monitoring	:	There is mechanism of monitoring at ULB level of daily / weekly basis.
(h)	IEC	:	Meeting with community and distribution and display of IEC materials.

1. As reported by H&FW Dept. **34769** Dengue Positive cases (NS1) detected as on 06.11.19 (N24pgs 13886, S24pgs 1357, Hooghly 1418, Howrah 1087).
2. An upsurge of Dengue cases is noticed in Oct/Nov.
Cases reported in Oct/Nov upto 06.11.19 is **14012** (N24pgs 4254, S24pgs 684, Hooghly 979, Howrah 527).
3. Routine visit was done by the officials of SUDA along with the Entomologists, to the affected areas of NKDA, Bidhan Nagar MC, Baranagar, Srerampur, South Dum Dum & Khardah.
4. Follow up meeting on environmental management of VBD was held at SUDA on 07.11.2019 with the Administrators and officials (SI/HO/NO) of 8 vulnerable ULBs (Administrator controlled),
5. Monitoring and Convergence meeting with Officers from UD & MA Dept, Heath & FW Dept. and officials (EO/SI/HO) of 24 ULBs of four Vulnerable Districts (mentioned above), was held at SUDA on 11.11.2019.
6. Vulnerable wards were identified at these ULBs and their officials were advised to focus on these wards with respect to environmental Management (VCT work)
7. Special Monitoring Officers have been allocated for these 24 ULBs for intensified and Focal monitoring of the areas with respect to Environmental Management.
8. VBD portal entry was elaborately discussed with ULB members with focus on teams reporting of zero larvae, zero fever, zero garbage and zero blocked drains.
9. Entry details on Environmental Management Portal were shared in the meetings and ULB s were advised to monitor uploading of EVM data on regular basis.
10. Regular feedback report is being sought from the high risk ULBs.

RECORD NOTES

6th Meeting of Core Group on Prevention and Management of Dengue

Date: 25 October 2019, Nabanna

Discussion

Chief Secretary took the chair. Secretary, Health & FW Department briefed that in last few weeks upsurge of dengue was reported from some pockets of Hooghly and North 24 Parganas districts. She emphasized upon need to upscale vector control works in those areas. She also informed that in the year 2019, around 60 percent of dengue positive cases were reported from rural areas. She requested P&RD Department to consider round the year conservancy in selected peri urban areas. Areas with high number of Dengue cases reported in the month of October, 2019 are as mentioned below-

Discussion and Status reported

- a) Director, SUDA informed that regular visit by the ULB nodal officials, weekly meeting with Municipal Health Officers and Sanitary Inspectors for monitoring VBD activities, monitoring of vector control work and analysis of reports were being done.
- b) Special Secretary, P&RD Department informed that fund for additional workforce (10 workers per GP) for highly affected GPs of North 24 Paraganas (41 GPs of 12 Blocks) and Nadia (10 GPs of 5 Blocks) had been released for the months October and November, 2019.
- c) Chief Engineer, I&WD Department informed that canals in North 24 Parganas, South 24 Praganas and Howrah districts were covered under AMC. In addition, cleaning of 18 canals had been taken up on emergency basis after getting information from

DMs would take necessary actions for control activity. Health &FW Department would coordinate with concerned departments for support on dengue management.

2. SUDA will form central Rapid Response Teams for vector control in urban areas. These teams will be sent to areas where the municipal body fails to manage mosquito breeding spots.
3. Anganwadi Workers will be involved in awareness generation on dengue management. DPO, ICDS to be involved for district level dengue management activities.
4. School Education Department and Higher Education Department will be requested to send instruction to districts for cleaning of school/college premises after Puja vacation. Concerned Inspectors will furnish certificate accordingly to higher offices.
5. Director, SUDA was requested to sanction fund to Barasat Municipality for development of sewage system outside the Barasat DH.
6. I&WD Department was requested for immediate cleaning of Monikhali Khal, Old Monikhali Khal, Mirpur Khal under Mahestala Municipality and Begar Khal under Sonarpur Municipality.
7. It was decided that a joint meeting would be held at KMC with H&FW Department for coordination in dengue prevention and case management issues.
8. It was reported that there were many locked or inaccessible premises where environment management was not possible. Chief Secretary advised Health & FW department to explore possibility of spraying larvicide by using drone in such areas.

Chief Secretary in his closing remarks emphasized on focused efforts for vector control activities.

H&FW Department. He also informed that cleaning of water hyacinth had been started at Bongaon (8.5 Km stretch of Ichamati river).

- d) Principal Secretary, I&CA Department informed that display of 2059 temporary hoardings out of fund provided by H&FW Department had been completed. Also, publicity through tableaux, intensive miking were being done in markets, haats, schools, colleges for awareness generation. I&CA Department had deployed additional tableaux in vulnerable Wards and GPs in North 24 Parganas.
- e) Commissioner, KMC informed that 16 Wards of the corporation were vulnerable. Many dengue positive cases have been reported from ward no. 131 in last few weeks. KMC had requested different State Government premises for cleaning and environment management. Out of 98 such premises, 49 premises were yet to be cleaned.
- f) Commissioner, BMC informed that 8 Wards had been identified as vulnerable. 3 Special Fever camps and 11 outreach fever camps have been organized. Notice to 55 private and government premises had been issued for conservancy and cleanliness. Repair of potholes in different roads had been started.
- g) Commissioner, HMC informed that 45 percent of total cases were being reported from 5 Wards. He requested H&FW Department for urgent repair of fogging machines supplied by H&FW Department.
- h) Secretary, WCD&SW Department informed that Kanyashree beneficiaries had been trained and deployed for awareness generation. Fund sanctioned for this purpose by H&FW Department had been received by all districts.
- i) Chief Engineer, PWD informed that one time cleaning of hospitals in Kolkata had been completed. He also informed that water stagnation problem inside Barasat DH premises could not be solved as the outside discharge pipes (maintained by municipality) required larger diameter pipes.





RECORD NOTES

5th Meeting of Core Group on Prevention and Management of Dengue

Date: 9 September 2019, Nabanna

Discussion

Chief Secretary took the chair. Additional Chief Secretary, Health & FW Department briefed that this year so far around 10,000 dengue positive cases had been detected in the State of which more than 50% had been reported from North 24 Parganas district. Nadia and Alipurduar districts have also experienced high number of cases partly due to proximity to Dengue affected areas in North 24 Parganas; and Bhutan. Keeping apart cases in these three districts, number of dengue cases was lesser in this year compared to 2018. Areas with high number of Dengue cases reported in 2019 are as mentioned below-

North 24 Parganas- Habra, Ashoknagar, Bongaon, Barrackpore, Panihati, Titagarh, Bhatpara, BMC, Khardaha municipalities; Habra I, Habra II, Gaighata, Bongaon, Barrackpore II, Barasat I blocks

South 24 Parganas- Maheshtala, Rajpur Sonarpur municipalities, Bishnupur II, Bhangore II, Budge Budge II, Kakdwip blocks

Alipurduar – Kalchini block

Nadia- Haringhata, Hanskhali, Krishnagar II, Krishnagar I, Chakdaha blocks

Howrah- Howrah Municipal Corporation

Darjeeling – Siliguri MC

Murshidabad- Nawda, Farakka, Samsheganj, Berhampore, Blocks

Jalpaiguri – Mal, Meteli block

Uttar Dinajpur –Raigunj municipality, Raigunj block

He informed the Core Group on major steps taken by Health and FW Department-

1. Continuous surveillance by **Dengue State Observer Teams** and **District Observer Teams** at high case load hospitals (govt. as well as private) in districts and Kolkata. In all, 62 such teams have been formed comprising of 124 doctors and

86 nurses. 330 govt and 260 private hospitals have been visited so far by the teams.

2. Special fund support amounting Rs 1.82 cr has been provided to North 24 Parganas district for surveillance (Rs 40 lakh), publicity (Rs 60 lakh), cleaning (40 lakh), larvicidal spray (Rs 18 lakh) and Guppy fishes (Rs 17 lakh).
3. Thermal fogging, under the supervision of Entomologists, to control active transmission of dengue vector (*Aedes Albopictus*) in outdoor environment using Cyphenothrin 5% EC has started in Gaighata block and Ashoknagar municipality. If found effective, this will be expanded to other areas as well.
4. Organizing Fever Camps in vulnerable pockets: 10 Special camps were running in most affected areas. About 4300 fever patients have attended such camps and 207 samples have tested positive.
5. Special meetings and **field visits** by senior officers of the department held at Habra, Bongaon, Gaighata, Barasat and Bidhannagar MCs on environmental and case management issues.
6. Regular visit by District Entomologists is taking place in vulnerable ULB/GP and areas showing high number of dengue fever cases.

Discussion and Status reported

- a) ACS, P&RD Department informed that fund for engaging additional workers (10/GP) was allocated to the affected districts, directions issued to the districts to observe 1st week of the month as "Cleanliness week", VHSNCs activated to motivate community on cleanliness; WBSRLM initiated action to build the capacity of SHGs on dengue prevention. State NREGA cell had issued order regarding renovation of minor/feeder canals which could be taken up in current season. He added that with innovative and creative use of funds many activities helping vector control could be taken up at the field level. He agreed that SWM activities in panchayat areas needed further strengthening.

Chief Secretary suggested that schemes related to removal of water hyacinth from water bodies could also be taken up at the field level.

- b) Principal Secretary, UD&MA Department informed that performance of House to House survey and vector control activity were being monitored. Four meetings had been held with vulnerable ULBs in the month of August, 2019. Ten posts of Entomologist had been newly created and five Entomologists had joined. State level workshop was organized on 14th August on solid waste management. Programme had been taken for involvement of SHGs in awareness generation on dengue in 122 ULBs. He requested H&FW Department to provide details of agencies selected for supply of Bio and Chemical larvicide.
- c) ACS, I&WD Department informed that canals in North 24 Parganas, South 24 Praganas and Howrah districts were covered under AMC. This included the uncovered canals as well. In addition, cleaning of 18 canals had been taken up on emergency basis after getting information from Health & FW dept. He requested to arrange for de-sludging and cleaning of canals, by local bodies, which were not looked after by I&WD Department.
- d) Principal Secretary, I&CA Department informed that 2043 temporary hoardings and 250 permanent hoardings had been erected out of funds provided by H&FW Department. Also tableaus, intensive miking was being mobilized in markets, haats, schools, colleges for awareness generation.
- e) Commissioner, KMC informed that less number of dengue cases was reported this year in comparison to 2018. Metro construction sites, rooftop of high-rise buildings had been targeted for vector control. 22 vulnerable wards had been identified and Fever Camps (daily 12 hours) had been set up at those wards. Patients were being provided with cards for fever tracking. 700 hoardings, 13,000 educational boards had been erected and 1700 more such hoardings would be erected. Letters had been issued in two phases to government departments where garbage was noticed. Total 262 cases had been lodged at the Municipal Magistrate Court and 4582 notices issued. About 1800 Puja committees were being involved for IEC during Puja period.
- f) Commissioner, Fisheries Department informed that total 3.18 crore guppy fishes had been distributed. Additionally, 17 lakh more guppy fishes to North 24 Parganas and 10 lakh to South 24 Parganas will be provided in the current month.

- g) Commissioner, BMC informed that repair of potholes had started. SHGs had been trained and deployed in vulnerable pockets. Notices to individual owners with unclean premises would be issued. Special attention was being given to Duttabad area where high no. of cases were detected in 2018.
- h) Secretary, WCD&SW Department informed that Kanyashree beneficiaries had been trained and deployed for awareness generation. Involvement of Kanyashree students was satisfactory in most of the districts except Paschim Medinipur which required more attention.
- i) Principal Secretary, PWD informed that one time cleaning of hospitals in Kolkata had been completed. He emphasized on development of drainage and sewage system in big hospitals in and around Kolkata.
- j) ADG L&O informed that special campaign involving youth clubs would be taken in the current month in all districts.
- k) DM, North 24 Parganas requested for additional fund to some municipalities with high case load. District had identified 9 Blocks from where early signal of dengue upsurge were received. She requested for additional HR (10/GP) for those Blocks. She also requested for fund to VHSNC for generation of awareness. The proposals were accepted.

Action points

1. All departments were requested to take steps to keep high level of alertness during ensuing festive days.
2. The issue of cleaning and re-excavation/renovation of canals and drains was discussed at length. Chief Secretary asked to monitor works in the light of order issued by P&RD Department dated 19 August 2019. He asked both P&RD and UD&MA Departments to take care of cleaning of all the municipal and panchayat drains and channels round the year for vector control.
3. Chief Secretary suggested UD&MA department to consider deploying Block Extension Officers from adjoining Blocks in municipalities (with high case load and having no elected Body) for intensive monitoring of House to House Survey and vector control activities.

4. H&FW Department was requested to share details of agencies, rates etc. with UD&MA Department for procurement of bio and chemical larvicide.
5. I&W Department would facilitate stronger convergence with Jalshree Prakalpa.
6. KMC was requested to arrange display of more number of hoardings on awareness generation.
7. I&CA Department was requested to immediately strengthen awareness campaigns and IEC activities in North 24 Parganas with special focus on the affected areas.
8. Fisheries Department was requested for supply of additional guppy fish to North 24 Parganas and South 24 Parganas districts. Department should also explore ways to promote production of *Kholse* fish having larvivorous quality.
9. P&RD Department would provide additional workforce to Blocks/GPs from where early signal of dengue upsurge are being received. Suggested blocks are – Bagdah, Barasat I, Barrackpore I, Baduria, Swarupnagar, Haroa, Minakhan, Hasnabad, Bashirhat I blocks.
10. West Bengal Police was requested to immediately take up vector control measures at the Police Stations, garages where seized vehicles were kept parked for long time. WBP would also undertake a more effective scrap disposal mechanism.
11. School Education Department was requested to especially focus on awareness generation on vector control in peri-domestic areas.
12. PWD was requested to take step for improvement of drainage system at Barasat DH and TL Jaiswal Hospital, Howrah. Also, KMC was requested to take up work outside Calcutta Pavlov Hospital for improvement of drainage.

Chief Secretary in his closing remarks emphasized on continuation of this inter-departmental coordination and focus on round the year preventive measures to control Dengue.

4th Meeting of Core Group on Prevention and Management of Dengue

Date: 14 August 2019, Nabanna

Discussion

Chief Secretary took the chair. Additional Chief Secretary, Health & FW Department briefed that more than 50% of total dengue positive cases had been reported from North 24 Parganas district this year with Habra-Ashoknagar municipal area being the focus. Areas with high number of Dengue cases reported in 2019 are as following-

North 24 Parganas- Habra, Ashoknagar, Bongaon, Bhatpara municipalities; Habra I, Habra II, Deganga, Gaighata, Bongaon blocks

South 24 Parganas- Maheshtala municipality, Budge Budge II, Kakdwip blocks

Alipurduar – Kalchini block

Nadia- Haringhata, Hanskhali blocks

Darjeeling – Siliguri MC

Uttar Dinajpur –Raigunj municipality, Raigunj block

He informed the Committee on major steps taken by Health and FW Department-

1. Training of 100% MOs and Nurses related to Dengue case management
2. Formation of **Dengue State Observer Teams** for visit to high case load hospitals (govt. as well as private) in 5 vulnerable districts and Kolkata-based hospitals.
Formation of **District Observer teams** to visit all hospitals in the districts.
3. Organizing Fever Camps in vulnerable pockets.
4. Customized IEC display at IPD and OPD on dengue protocol and management.
5. Daily visit by District Consultants to vulnerable ULB/GP.
6. Collection of independent field reports on stagnant water, garbage dumping, clogged drains etc. from vulnerable ULBs and fringe areas and taking up request of immediate intervention with district administration and concerned government departments.

Discussion and Status reported

- a) District Magistrate, North 24 Parganas informed that several rounds of meetings were being organized at municipality and Block level to intensify preventive actions and vector control activities. Clogged drains, canals had been cleaned. She also informed that fresh cases were being reported from Madhyamgram, Deganga and Barasat areas.
- b) ACS, I&WD Department informed that 125 canals in North 24 Parganas, South 24 Parganas and Howrah districts were covered under AMC. In addition, cleaning of 18 canals had been taken up on emergency basis after getting information from Health & FW dept. He requested KMC to take measures so that garbage was not dumped into canals. He also emphasized setting up vats by other ULBs to prevent garbage dumping into canals.
- c) Principal Secretary, UD&MA Department informed of demand being received from many municipalities to increase wage of vector control workers.
- d) Commissioner, KMC informed that 22 vulnerable Wards had been identified and Fever Camps (time 12 hours) had been set up at those Wards. Patients were being provided with cards for fever tracking. Of late, upsurge of dengue positive cases were being reported from 9 Wards.
- e) Principal Secretary, School Education and Higher Education Departments informed that intensive IEC involving school students was being organized.
- f) Principal Secretary, PWD informed that one time cleaning of around 250 premises had been completed.
- g) Commissioner, BMC informed that repair of potholes had started.
- h) Principal Secretary, Fisheries Department informed that around 2.40 crore guppy fishes had been released and remaining fishes would be distributed within next 10 days.
- i) Principal Secretary, PHED informed that 1268 stand posts, extension of 60 Km of pipelines, construction/repair of 607 platforms had been completed.
- j) Principal Secretary, I&CA Department informed that 1566 hoardings had been erected out of target 2043. Also, tableaus were being mobilized in all districts for awareness generation.

Action points


1. All the departments are required to step up the preventive and IEC activities in urban as well as rural areas with special attention to areas from where high number of cases has been reported.
2. The issue of cleaning and re-excavation of canals and drains was discussed at length. Chief Secretary asked P&RD Department to explore resources to fund this critical activity as re-excavation was essential for canals even with concrete base and walls. Similarly, Chief Secretary asked UD&MA Department to take up a planned initiative for bi-annual cleaning of canals and related drains in urban areas on a priority basis.

He emphasised with both P&RD and UD&MA Departments to take care of cleaning of all the municipal and panchayat drains and channels round the year for vector control.
3. The issue of distribution of mosquito nets in seriously affected areas like Habra, Ashoknagar, Deganga, Bangaon was discussed in detail. The Core Committee agreed with the expert opinion that mosquito nets do not work in controlling spread of dengue. Mosquito nets principally work in arresting spread of malaria of falciparum variety.
4. It was unanimously agreed to link the daily wages of the members of vector control team with the rates of MNREGA with concurrence of Finance Department.
5. I&CA Department was requested to immediately strengthen awareness campaigns and IEC activities in North 24 Parganas with special focus on the seriously affected areas.
6. There are 9 Wards under KMC which required stepped up interventions immediately.
7. Fisheries Department requested for financial assistance to meet up the growing demand of guppy fishes from H&FW Department. Fisheries Department had so far managed to procure 3 crore guppy fishes through its state budget. Additional funding was required for meeting further demand of guppy fishes.
8. UD&MA and P&RD Departments would strengthen preventive measures in areas where Dengue positive cases were being reported. If required, additional personnel for conservancy may be deployed.

14 August 2019

9. West Bengal Police was requested to immediately take up vector control measures at the Police Stations, garages where seized vehicles are kept.
10. Howrah and Bidhanagar MCs would follow up on notices issued to private and government complexes for conservancy and cleanliness under the relevant provisions of Municipal Act and to take necessary legal action in case of default.

Chief Secretary in his closing remarks emphasized on round the year preventive measures to Control Dengue disease.



Record notes: 2nd Meeting of Core Group on Prevention and Management of Dengue

Date: 12 June 2019, Nabanna (13th Floor Conference Hall)

Discussion

Chief Secretary took the chair. Additional Chief Secretary, Health and FW Department briefed that 10 districts contributed to more than 91% of total dengue positive cases in the State. These are North 24 Parganas, Kolkata, Howrah, South 24 Parganas and Nadia, Darjeeling (Siliguri), Malda, Murshidabad, Paschim Medinipur and Hooghly. He emphasized on maintenance of cleanliness in urban slum areas and requested UD and MA Department to take proactive role. He informed that teams of doctors would start visiting hospitals where dengue deaths occurred in the year 2018 and would recommend improvements to prevent death.

1. Irrigation Department highlighted that disposal of garbage in irrigation canals in KMC and BMC areas are big challenges. Survey was done with KMC and about 750 spots were identified where garbage was thrown in canals. KMC had constructed vats at 300 spots and remaining would be complete in next one month. Well planned garbage disposal in BMC area was requested.
2. WCD&SW Department had issued instruction to all districts for involvement of Anganwadi Workers and Kanyashree students in awareness generation and cleaning of own households and immediate surroundings.
3. PHE Department had started installation of piped water supply, construction of platform etc. at vulnerable areas in Malda, North 24 Parganas and Hooghly districts. Work in other districts would be started soon.
4. PWD had issued instruction for involvement of departmental engineers in monitoring of construction sites to ensure clean environment.


Action points

1. H&FW Department to provide list of vulnerable GPs and ULBs to I&CA dept for implementing awareness plan. H&FW dept would provide fund support and creative design for this purpose.

2. UD&MA Department to issue direction to all ULBs to strictly follow Supreme Court constituted Committee decisions on solid waste management and conservancy works.
3. I&CA Department to share a budget with HFW Department with campaign through hoardings/banners down to GP level/ward level in vulnerable areas and down to Block/Municipality in non-vulnerable areas. I&CA Department to continue their campaign through LPP artists.
4. All departments are requested to utilize fund available at district level for convergence and IEC activities.
5. Community participation is required for successful implementation of prevention activities. UD&MA dept to monitor Citizen Task Force formation in ULBs. P&RD department to activate VHSNCs for ensuring community participation in rural areas.
6. Irrigation Department requested KMC for waste disposal sites near canals in KMC and BMC jurisdiction.
7. UD&MA, P&RD Department to start pre-monsoon repair works.
8. Dispatch of guppy fishes to the districts has started. ULBs to ensure pond cleaning before release of fishes. HFW Department to provide all co-ordination assistance at field level.
9. Sports & Youth affairs Department to follow up on district meetings for active participation of youth clubs in dengue prevention with awareness and cleanliness drives.
10. KMC to hold meeting with private clinical establishments in June 2019. UD&MA dept to follow up with ULBs regarding such meetings at ULB level.
11. School education Department to organize school level sensitization programmes on dengue prevention. It should also ensure proper cleaning of schools after vacation.
12. SHG&SE Department to issue direction to DRDC for organizing sensitization among SHGs for their involvement for keeping individual houses and surroundings clean.

13. Police Stations to facilitate cleaning drives in Kolkata and in districts, with the involvement of local clubs and volunteers.
14. P&RD Department to facilitate planned SLWM in rural areas, with special focus on vulnerable GPs.
15. L&LR Department to issue instructions at field level to ensure cleanliness in closed brick kilns.

Chief Secretary emphasized, in his closing remarks, on intensifying all efforts for prevention of dengue throughout the State.

The resolutions are as under:

- Number of House-to-House team, Supervisors, support staff and Vector Control team for each of the ULBs as approved by the H&FW Department shall be obtained.
- Dissemination of micro plan approved by the Health Department shall reach to the ULBs through the respective DM.
- SUDA to ensure operationalisation of spray, fogging, Elisa machine and blood cell counter by the ULBs. Checklist for completion of procurement of the said equipments shall be prepared by SUDA and sent to the ULBs for compliance.
- Designated Volunteers and Supervisors for House-to-House activity may be changed in case of exigency on obtaining approval from the District.
- Decision with regard to source of item wise funding for conduct of House-to-House activity shall be obtained from Health Department and submission of requisition for the required fund to the Department shall be done immediately.
- Data on existing and additional man power shall be obtained from Health Department to assess fund requirement for Vector Control Team for payment of honorarium.
- SUDA shall write to the H & FW Department for filling of the post of Public Health Manager in the ULBs.
- SUDA to pursue with filling up the vacant posts of HHWs & FTSs in the ULBs.
- On the basis of last year experience, the detected problematic area w.r.t. larger residential and office premises of State and Central Government, the ULB shall undertake immediate meeting with those for taking proper vector control action in this lean period. SUDA may issue circular to the ULBs in this regard.
- Team of SUDA may start their regular visits to the ULBs to check the preparedness for House-to-House and vector control activities.

Minutes of the Meeting of State Nodal Monitoring Committee for Prevention and Management of Vector Borne Diseases

Date: 4th January 2018

Venue: Green Room of Swasthya Bhawan, Salt Lake

List of participants is annexed.

Secretary (PHP), Health & Family Welfare Department takes chair and welcomed all to the first meeting of State Nodal Monitoring Committee. He informed that in the meeting chaired by the Chief Secretary on 27.11.2017 for preparation of a Joint Action Plan to tackle Vector Borne Diseases in the State, it was decided that State Nodal Monitoring Committee on Vector Borne Diseases (VBD) would be constituted with senior officers from concerned Departments and Commissioners of KMC, HMC and BMC. He also informed that in the administrative review meeting chaired by the Hon'ble Chief Minister on 4.12.2017 it was decided that every district would have a District Level Monitoring Team (DLMT) chaired by the District Magistrate. Guideline for preparation of District Vector Borne Disease Control Plan has been prepared and shared with all District Magistrates and concerned Departments. In 2018, House to House surveillance and vector control measures would be intensified. It was decided that House to House surveillance would be done in all municipal areas of the State from January to December on fortnightly basis. In rural areas, District Magistrate would decide areas of H to H surveillance.

Additional Secretary (PHP) explained the salient features of the District VBD Plan. He informed that the existing daily reporting system through SMS would be discontinued and software would be developed for daily reporting as well as sending alerts through SMS to key persons. He also informed that a calendar mentioning dates of fortnightly H to H surveillance and vector control activities would be printed by the H and FW Department for distribution among the H to H workers, supervisors, Councilors, UPHCs etc.

Advisor to Health and FW Department gave emphasis on quality of surveillance work and conservancy work. He informed that this year house marking would be done after each round of visit. He clarified that basic management of dengue cases did not necessarily depend on lab diagnosis of dengue. Rather he gave emphasis on monitoring of Platelet count, and also on management of dengue cases in peripheral units in order to prevent undue overloading in higher centres. However, he suggested that setting up Sentinel Surveillance Laboratories (SSL) in urban areas for more than 1 lakh population might be considered under NUHM.

Director, State Urban Development Authority (SUDA) proposed to increase the daily allowance to H to H workers and supervisors from existing Rs.75 to Rs. 150. He also added that there was need for arrangement of some pathological tests like platelet count, PCV test etc at ULB level.



Joint Municipal Commissioner, KMC informed that in KMC areas the VBD control activities would be undertaken on weekly basis. He requested that the calendar for KMC areas to be modified accordingly.

Joint Secretary, Department of Women and Child Development and Social Welfare suggested including the District Programme Officer (DPO), ICDS in the District Level Monitoring Team (DLMT).

Secretary, School Education Department said that School Safety Committee might be activated. He suggested that a leaflet containing 'Do-s and Don't-s' could be designed for secondary school students, along with a checklist. Students would inspect their house environment & the surroundings and submit the filled-in checklist. He agreed that if the design was provided from the end of H & FW, his department could arrange for printing and supply of the same to the schools. He informed that the proposal of H and FW Department for inclusion of a chapter on VBD, its control and management in the school syllabus had been forwarded to Text Book Committee and it was under consideration.

Additional Chief Engineer, PHE informed that PHED was supervising and monitoring works related to supply of safe potable water, repair of tube well platforms etc. Since the data of such actions may be important for the national meetings on AES, he stated that they were ready to share the same from time to time.

Commissioner, Bidhannagar Municipal Corporation requested to sanction additional allotment for the Nursing Students deployed for house-to-house activities during the dengue transmission season.

Commissioner, Howrah Municipal Corporation gave emphasis on setting up additional testing facilities in urban areas.

The following decisions were taken in the meeting:

- ✓ 1. H and FW Department would move for increasing the daily wage for H to H Survey Team Members and Supervisors deployed in 125 Corporations and Municipalities in the State. Fund would be provided for honourarium of H to H workers, supervisors, printing of forms, mobility support to municipalities and CMOH, cost of data entry at municipality level, contingency to municipalities and cost of IEC. It was estimated that around 71 crore would be required for these purpose.
- ✓ 2. SUDA would provide fund for payment of honourarium to Vector Control Team, cost of larvicidal, IEC, cost of implements. Around Rs. 40 crore would be required for these purposes.

2

3. KMC would spend around Rs. 14 crore for payment of honourarium to H to H workers, supervisors, printing of forms, mobility support, contingency, cost of IEC etc.
4. School Education Department would take steps to sensitize secondary level students. Inspector of School (both Pry and Secondary) would be sensitized. Expenditure on this account would be met up by the School Education Department.
5. It was learnt that Panchayet and Rural Development Department had already issued order for incurring expenditures for H to H surveillance, cleaning etc from MGNREGA and Nirmal Bangla Prakalpa.
6. DPO, ICDS would be included in the District Level Monitoring Team (DLMT).
7. SUDA would prepare list of ULBs where Sentinel Surveillance Laboratories to be set up. While preparing this list, care to be taken that each SSL caters to more than 1 lakh population or so, for the SSL to be sustainable. If the population is less than 1 lakh, the Urban Area may be tagged with the nearest SSL.
8. Facility of Blood Sample Separation Unit (BCSU) and Platelet Agitator to be augmented in the State.
9. The case management guideline for Dengue would be re-circulated and Medical Officers posted at various level to be sensitized.
10. Provision of monitoring Pack Cell Volume (PCV) and Platelet count at BPHC and UPHC level may be considered, keeping the cost effectiveness in view.
11. IEC would be intensified. H and FW Department would modify the IEC materials, as & if necessary and supply to all. State level ToT and Regional level sensitization meetings would be organized jointly by the H and FW Department and SUDA.
13. Calendar mentioning dates of fortnightly H to H Survey and Vector Control Team activities in municipal areas would be circulated among Councilors, UPHCs, Supervisors and H to H workers. Separate calendar would be printed for KMC.
14. Training Module for Vector Control Team would be provided by the H and FW Department.
15. Joint Action Plan for control & management of VBDs would be published shortly.
16. PHED was requested to give emphasis on repair of platforms at JE/AES endemic areas and send progress report to H and FW Department on quarterly basis. H and FW Department would prepare the reporting format/ points.

Meeting concludes with thanks to and from the chair.

- Weekly review meeting was held with the officials (SI and H.O) of vulnerable ULBs at SUDA for monitoring of VBD activities on - 5th, 12th, 16th and 19th of September, 2019.
- Monitoring meeting with 6 Municipal Corporations was held at SUDA on 17.10.2019.
- VBD portal entry was elaborately discussed with ULB members with focus on teams reporting of zero larvae, zero fever, zero garbage and zero blocked drains.
- Entry details on Environmental Management Portal were shared in the weekly meetings and ULB s were advised to monitor uploading of EVM data on regular basis.
- Regular feedback report is being sought from the high risk ULBs.
- Fund for VBD (VCT upto October and H-t-H upto September) have been released. Fund for procurement of Larvicide for last quantity will be released by 25th October, 2019.
- List of authorized agency approved by the DHFW for procurement of chemicals and bio-larvicidal has been communicated to all the ULBs.

① ~~Letter~~ Administrations for utilizing service of the Block level Extension officers from adjoining Blocks in municipalities.

② All ULBs have been directed to clean ~~the~~ municipal drains and channels round the year for vector control.

VBD control activities taken up by SUDA under UD & MA Dept. as on 6.9.19

1. Round wise findings and activities of HtH team and VCT are being monitored.
2. Weekly follow up meetings on prevention and management of Dengue have been held in SUDA respectively on 8.8.19, 16.8.19 and 28.8.19 and 5.9.19 with the officials of Habra, Ashokenagar, Titagarh, Naihati, Barrackpore, Madhyamgram, Taki, Basirhat, Chakdah, haringhata, krishnanagar, Maheshtala, Rajpur-Sonarpur municipalities.
3. Newly joined Entomologists have undertaken entomological survey in the municipal towns of Barrackpur and Basirhat Sub-Division and in Maheshtala, Rajpur-Sonarpur and Hooghly-Chinsurah municipalities.
4. Funds for honorarium to VCT, HtH team and procurement of larvicide have been released to all ULBs for the period upto September 2019.
5. Allotment of funds exclusively made for Habra Municipality by H&FW Deptt and UD&MA Deptt.
6. In a meeting on 14.8.19 all ULBs have been oriented towards undertaking scientific solid waste management in a planned manner.
7. A week long awareness programme (rally, workshop, quiz, street-play) is being implemented in all municipal towns from 2-9 September, focusing on segregation of waste at source, re-use of waste, plantation and water conservation etc where SHGs under SULM are leading the activities. The message that sustained and scientific waste management can only reduce the chances of vector borne disease, is being publicized through this campaign.



Guideline for Thermal Fogging


Thermal fogging of insecticide which is usually performed as an outdoor procedure is not encouraged for control of dengue outbreaks except in some much localized incidents or in special situations. *Aedes aegypti* is considered as the primary vector for dengue and it lives mostly in indoor environment. Hence thermal fogging has very limited efficacy against this vector.

In several areas of dengue upsurge in North 24-Parganas, Nadia & Murshidabad, it has been recently found that *Aedes albopictus* is the principal species of *Aedes* mosquito present over there. *Ae. albopictus* is mostly an outdoor living mosquito. They prefer to rest in vegetation and breed in outdoor/peri-domestic natural & man-made breeding spots. In rural areas, high larval density of *Ae. albopictus* has been found in rain water collection in axils of arum (kochu in Bengali) plants and on polythene sheets used to cover the fire wood & hay.

In view of the above it is recommended that thermal fogging may be used as a control measure in a situation of dengue outbreak/localized upsurge, if *Ae. albopictus* is found to be the predominant *Aedes* species in the affected place. However, the fogging must be performed with an approved insecticide i.e. Cyphenothrin 5% EC or technical Malathion (not any other commercial formulation). Also it is to be noted that fogging in the roads & streets will hardly serve any purpose. To make it effective the operation has to be performed in the garden/ bushes/ vegetation around (& behind too) the houses and in the courtyard or the space in front of a crowded cluster of houses as seen in slums.

The fogging operation at a particular place may be repeated weekly or more frequently, depending on the situation and should be continued for 2 to 3 weeks during which time mosquito breeding must be brought down to the minimum. So it is reiterated that control of *Aedes* larvae by source reduction and larvicidal spraying remains the mainstay of dengue vector control. Thermal fogging is just an additional measure to quickly reduce the adult vector density in the above-said situations.

Cost of insecticide for fogging may be borne from relevant fund heads of Dengue/ Chikungunya under NVBDCP.

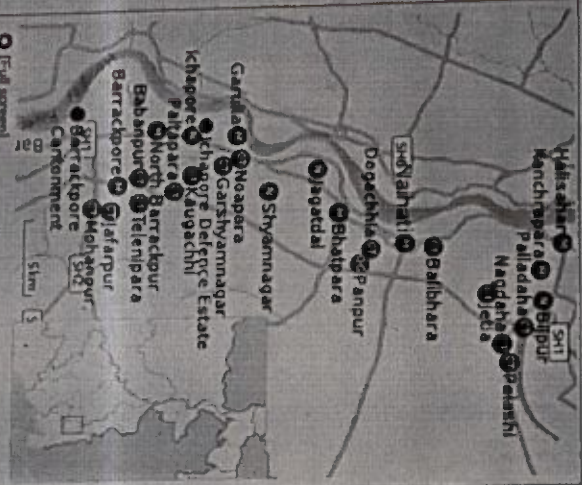

RECORD NOTES

4th Meeting of Core Group on Prevention and Management of Dengue

Date: 14 August 2019, Nabanna

Discussion

Chief Secretary took the chair. Additional Chief Secretary, Health & FW Department briefed that more than 50% of total dengue positive cases had been reported from North 24 Parganas district this year with Habra-Ashoknagar municipal area being the focus. Areas with high number of Dengue cases reported in 2019 are as following-

North 24 Parganas- Habra, Ashoknagar, Bongaon, Bhatpara municipalities; Habra I, Habra II, Deganga, Gaighata, Bongaon blocks

South 24 Parganas- Maheshtala municipality, Budge Budge II, Kakdwip blocks

Alipurduar – Kalchini block

Nadia- Haringhata, Hanskhali blocks

Darjeeling – Siliguri MC

Uttar Dinajpur –Raigunj municipality, Raigunj block

He informed the Committee on major steps taken by Health and FW Department-

1. Training of 100% MOs and Nurses related to Dengue case management
2. Formation of **Dengue State Observer Teams** for visit to high case load hospitals (govt. as well as private) in 5 vulnerable districts and Kolkata-based hospitals. Formation of **District Observer teams** to visit all hospitals in the districts.
3. Organizing Fever Camps in vulnerable pockets.
4. Customized IEC display at IPD and OPD on dengue protocol and management.
5. Daily visit by District Consultants to vulnerable ULB/GP.
6. Collection of independent field reports on stagnant water, garbage dumping, clogged drains etc. from vulnerable ULBs and fringe areas and taking up request of immediate intervention with district administration and concerned government departments.

Discussion and Status reported

- a) District Magistrate, North 24 Parganas informed that several rounds of meetings were being organized at municipality and Block level to intensify preventive actions and vector control activities. Clogged drains, canals had been cleaned. She also informed that fresh cases were being reported from Madhyamgram, Deganga and Barasat areas.
- b) ACS, I&WD Department informed that 125 canals in North 24 Parganas, South 24 Parganas and Howrah districts were covered under AMC. In addition, cleaning of 18 canals had been taken up on emergency basis after getting information from Health & FW dept. He requested KMC to take measures so that garbage was not dumped into canals. He also emphasized setting up vats by other ULBs to prevent garbage dumping into canals.
- c) Principal Secretary, UD&MA Department informed of demand being received from many municipalities to increase wage of vector control workers.
- d) Commissioner, KMC informed that 22 vulnerable Wards had been identified and Fever Camps (time 12 hours) had been set up at those Wards. Patients were being provided with cards for fever tracking. Of late, upsurge of dengue positive cases were being reported from 9 Wards.
- e) Principal Secretary, School Education and Higher Education Departments informed that intensive IEC involving school students was being organized.
- f) Principal Secretary, PWD informed that one time cleaning of around 250 premises had been completed.
- g) Commissioner, BMC informed that repair of potholes had started.
- h) Principal Secretary, Fisheries Department informed that around 2.40 crore guppy fishes had been released and remaining fishes would be distributed within next 10 days.
- i) Principal Secretary, PHED informed that 1268 stand posts, extension of 60 Km of pipelines, construction/repair of 607 platforms had been completed.
- j) Principal Secretary, I&CA Department informed that 1566 hoardings had been erected out of target 2043. Also, tableaus were being mobilized in all districts for awareness generation.

Action points

1. All the departments are required to step up the preventive and IEC activities in urban as well as rural areas with special attention to areas from where high number of cases has been reported.
2. The issue of cleaning and re-excavation of canals and drains was discussed at length. Chief Secretary asked P&RD Department to explore resources to fund this critical activity as re-excavation was essential for canals even with concrete base and walls. Similarly, Chief Secretary asked UD&MA Department to take up a planned initiative for bi-annual cleaning of canals and related drains in urban areas on a priority basis.

He emphasised with both P&RD and UD&MA Departments to take care of cleaning of all the municipal and panchayat drains and channels round the year for vector control.
3. The issue of distribution of mosquito nets in seriously affected areas like Habra, Ashoknagar, Deganga, Bangaon was discussed in detail. The Core Committee agreed with the expert opinion that mosquito nets do not work in controlling spread of dengue. Mosquito nets principally work in arresting spread of malaria of falciparum variety.
4. It was unanimously agreed to link the daily wages of the members of vector control team with the rates of MNREGA with concurrence of Finance Department.
5. I&CA Department was requested to immediately strengthen awareness campaigns and IEC activities in North 24 Parganas with special focus on the seriously affected areas.
6. There are 9 Wards under KMC which required stepped up interventions immediately.
7. Fisheries Department requested for financial assistance to meet up the growing demand of guppy fishes from H&FW Department. Fisheries Department had so far managed to procure 3 crore guppy fishes through its state budget. Additional funding was required for meeting further demand of guppy fishes.
8. UD&MA and P&RD Departments would strengthen preventive measures in areas where Dengue positive cases were being reported. If required, additional personnel for conservancy may be deployed.

14 August 2019

9. West Bengal Police was requested to immediately take up vector control measures at the Police Stations, garages where seized vehicles are kept.
10. Howrah and Bidhanagar MCs would follow up on notices issued to private and government complexes for conservancy and cleanliness under the relevant provisions of Municipal Act and to take necessary legal action in case of default.

Chief Secretary in his closing remarks emphasized on round the year preventive measures to Control Dengue disease.

Review meeting on VBD control to be taken by HMIC UD & MA Dept. with the ULBs

Subhanna, 25 July, 2019

1. Vector Control Team formed, trained up and working as per schedule. Round wise findings and activities of HtH team and VCT are being monitored.
2. ULB – wise no. of dengue positive case in the month of **July' 19**
(Bhatpara – 13, Barrackpore – 11, North Barrackpore – 04, Titagarh – 12, Khardah – 8, Panihati – 4, Kamarhati – 02, Habra – 73, Ashokenagar Kalyangarh – 34, Howrah – 03, Bidhannagar – 09, Bongaon – 03, Naihati – 01, Madhyamgram – 08, Barasat – 01, Garulia – 06, North Dum Dum – 03, Siliguri – 14, Baranagar – 02).
3. Under reporting on MIS is noted. ULBs have been requested to monitor and analyze MIS data on regular basis. Handholding training on MIS entry for DEAs has been conducted at H&FW Deptt.
4. ULBs were requested to give emphasize on infrastructure and waste management, that includes repairing of potholes/ditches/low lying lands, removal of garbage vat on urgent basis, construction of additional toilet, cleaning of water bodies etc. Principal Secretary, UD&MA Deptt issued advisory to the ULBs covering all these important aspects.
5. Gap analysis on conservancy work along with analysis of MIS report on regular basis was requested to be reviewed weekly in ULB level Task Force meeting .
6. Intensive IEC activities were requested to be initiated. ULBs are observing 'Cleanliness Fortnight" from **15.7.19** with different activities.
7. Regular meeting/ sensitization with local clinical establishments such as Nursing Home, Private Hospital, Private Practitioners are required to be organised regarding proper management and timely referral of fever/ VBDs.
8. Funds for (i) honorarium to HtH team members and VCT members, DEAs (ii) procurement of larvicide, (iii) contingency and mobility support released to ULBs.
9. Timely submission of UC by ULBs against the funds released for different components of VBD management will enable SUDA to assess further requirement of funds and release thereof.





RECORD NOTES

3rd Meeting of Core Group on Prevention and Management of Dengue

Date: 17 July 2019, Nabanna

Discussion

Chief Secretary took the chair. Additional Chief Secretary, Health and FW Department briefed that in the current year (2019) more than 50% of total dengue positive cases have been reported from North 24 Parganas district. Other districts, from where high number of dengue positive cases is being reported, are South 24 Parganas, Murshidabad, Uttar Dinajpur, Nadia, Malda, Hooghly, Siliguri Municipal Corporation and Howrah. Background note was circulated to all members mentioning high case load pockets. He mentioned that primary focus of Health & FW Department is case management of dengue patients whereas preventive part is being taken care of by other Departments. He informed the Committee on major steps taken by Health and FW Department-

1. 100% training of MOs and Nurses related to Dengue case management done.
 2. Formation of Dengue Observer Teams for visit to high case load hospitals (govt. as well as private)
 - a. 11 State Teams in 5 vulnerable districts and Kolkata-based hospitals.
 - b. 2 District Observer Teams in the districts totaling 35 (1 in non-focus districts).
 3. Introduction of new case management protocol for Fever Camps in vulnerable pockets.
 4. Customized IEC display at IPD and OPD.
 5. Daily visit by District Consultants to vulnerable ULB/GP.
 6. Cleanliness Fortnight being observed by all urban and rural bodies from 15 July to 28 July 2019.
 7. Convergence meeting was held and common action plan developed for KMC area.
- Director, SUDA informed that order had been issued where Solid Waste Management Task Force would function as Dengue Task Force in ULBs.

- Joint Secretary P & RD Department informed that necessary training on Task Forceformation for rural areas has been conducted for Health Supervisors and Secretary of GPs.
- ACS I&W Department requested for regular cleaning of canals by municipal bodies.
- Commissioner, KMC informed that construction of vats near canals was not allowed as per the NGT guideline. Hence, containers had been placed at identified places near canals to stop throwing garbage into canals. Similarly, BMC had placed containers at identified places near canals. He also requested Health & FW department to consider providing fund for cleaning of premises in State govt. establishments not abiding by norms of KMC.
- Commissioner BMC requested HFW Department to post medical officer in the vacant post at Corporation office to effectively supervise dengue prevention activities.
- Principal Secretary, PHE informed that works for additional infrastructure including 438 stand posts with soak-pits, about 13 kms of pipeline, 267 platform repair and 312 water taps have been implemented in 7 vulnerable districts. Works for laying of 121 Kms of pipeline, 2212 stand posts, 5 kms of drainage and 585 platforms was under planning stage.
- Secretary WCD&SW department requested for IEC fund for activities being done by the Kanyashree students.
- DM Howrah requested for contingency fund for additional conservancy works at sentinel sites.
- DM, North 24 Parganas informed that Monitoring Committee was formed at each hospital for intensive monitoring of Dengue case management. She also requested for additional fund support for IEC.
- Dispatch of guppy fishes by Fisheries department was going on. It was expected to be completed by the end of July 2019.
- School Education department had organized IEC activities at schools in South 24 Paraganas, North 24 Paraganas, Howrah and Nadia.

Action points

1. UD&MA and P&RD Departments to take all out efforts at areas where Dengue positive cases were being reported. If required, additional personnel for conservancy may be considered.

2. UD&MA department to monitor Citizen's Task Force formation in ULBs.
3. P&RD department to activate VHSNCs for community participation in rural areas.
4. All departments to utilize fund available at district level for convergence and IEC activities. I&CA Department will share design and plan for IEC activity with all the departments.
5. BMC to improve basic civic services in Salt Lake area. Potholes to be repaired urgently.
6. DMs and district Health officials to ensure presence of Nodal Officials during handover of fishes.
7. Sports & Youth affairs Department to organize Youth club -led cleaning drives.
8. School Education Department to organize IEC activities through senior students in all districts.
9. SHG&SE Department to issue direction to DRDC for organizing sensitization among SHGs for their involvement for keeping individual houses and surroundings clean.
10. Police Stations to facilitate cleaning drives in Kolkata and in districts, with the involvement of local clubs and volunteers.
11. Howrah and Bidhanagar MCs to issue notices to private and government complexes for conservancy and cleanliness under the relevant provisions of Municipal Act and to take necessary legal action in case of default.

Chief Secretary in his closing remarks emphasized on continuation of this concerted effort in days to come. With arrival of full-fledged rainy season, the challenges would increase and everyone should be well prepared for that.





Record notes: 2nd Meeting of Core Group on Prevention and Management of Dengue

Date: 12 June 2019, Nabanna (13th Floor Conference Hall)

Discussion

Chief Secretary took the chair. Additional Chief Secretary, Health and FW Department briefed that 10 districts contributed to more than 91% of total dengue positive cases in the State. These are North 24 Parganas, Kolkata, Howrah, South 24 Parganas and Nadia, Darjeeling (Siliguri), Malda, Murshidabad, Paschim Medinipur and Hooghly. He emphasized on maintenance of cleanliness in urban slum areas and requested UD and MA Department to take proactive role. He informed that teams of doctors would start visiting hospitals where dengue deaths occurred in the year 2018 and would recommend improvements to prevent death.

1. Irrigation Department highlighted that disposal of garbage in irrigation canals in KMC and BMC areas are big challenges. Survey was done with KMC and about 750 spots were identified where garbage was thrown in canals. KMC had constructed vats at 300 spots and remaining would be complete in next one month. Well planned garbage disposal in BMC area was requested.
2. WCD&SW Department had issued instruction to all districts for involvement of Anganwadi Workers and Kanyashree students in awareness generation and cleaning of own households and immediate surroundings.
3. PHE Department had started installation of piped water supply, construction of platform etc. at vulnerable areas in Malda, North 24 Parganas and Hooghly districts. Work in other districts would be started soon.
4. PWD had issued instruction for involvement of departmental engineers in monitoring of construction sites to ensure clean environment.

Action points

1. H&FW Department to provide list of vulnerable GPs and ULBs to I&CA dept for implementing awareness plan. H&FW dept would provide fund support and creative design for this purpose.

2. UD&MA Department to issue direction to all ULBs to strictly follow Supreme Court constituted Committee decisions on solid waste management and conservancy works.
3. I&CA Department to share a budget with HFW Department with campaign through hoardings/banners down to GP level/ward level in vulnerable areas and down to Block/Municipality in non-vulnerable areas. I&CA Department to continue their campaign through LPP artists.
4. All departments are requested to utilize fund available at district level for convergence and IEC activities.
5. Community participation is required for successful implementation of prevention activities. UD&MA dept to monitor Citizen Task Force formation in ULBs. P&RD department to activate VHSNCs for ensuring community participation in rural areas.
6. Irrigation Department requested KMC for waste disposal sites near canals in KMC and BMC jurisdiction.
7. UD&MA, P&RD Department to start pre-monsoon repair works.
8. Dispatch of guppy fishes to the districts has started. ULBs to ensure pond cleaning before release of fishes. HFW Department to provide all co-ordination assistance at field level.
9. Sports & Youth affairs Department to follow up on district meetings for active participation of youth clubs in dengue prevention with awareness and cleanliness drives.
10. KMC to hold meeting with private clinical establishments in June 2019. UD&MA dept to follow up with ULBs regarding such meetings at ULB level.
11. School education Department to organize school level sensitization programmes on dengue prevention. It should also ensure proper cleaning of schools after vacation.
12. SHG&SE Department to issue direction to DRDC for organizing sensitization among SHGs for their involvement for keeping individual houses and surroundings clean.

13. Police Stations to facilitate cleaning drives in Kolkata and in districts, with the involvement of local clubs and volunteers.
14. P&RD Department to facilitate planned SLWM in rural areas, with special focus on vulnerable GPs.
15. L&LR Department to issue instructions at field level to ensure cleanliness in closed brick kilns.

Chief Secretary emphasized, in his closing remarks, on intensifying all efforts for prevention of dengue throughout the State.



Comparatively higher Dengue positive cases are being reported from Bidhannagar Municipal Corporation, Panihati, Khardaha, Titagarh, North Barrackpore, Barrackpore, Bhatpara and Habra Municipality. Two prompt strategies may be taken to control further upsurge of Dengue in these ULBs i.e. Vector control and awareness generation.







Madam / Sir,

Two pronged strategy has been taken for prevention and management of dengue ie., emphasis on prevention and dengue case management as per protocol. As a part of case management, teams have been formed with Specialist Medical Officers and Nursing staff to visit high case load hospitals for supportive supervision. Ten such teams have been formed for visiting hospitals up to the month of October 2019.

The House to House survey and vector control activity have already been started in rural and urban areas for prevention of Dengue. Now, you are requested to **organize field visits on daily basis (5 days a week) to GPs/ULBs for active surveillance.** Epidemiologist (IDSP), District Entomologists, VBD Consultant, District Epidemiologist (NUHM) and District Quality Manager (PH) may be drafted for this purpose. 15 days' advance order may be issued and shared with this office (entomologist.ibd@gmail.com and idsb.wb@gmail.com). Visit reports to be uploaded in the Disease Monitoring System Portal in www.wbhealth.gov.in on daily basis for further actions from your end and this end.



RECORD NOTES OF THE MEETING OF CORE GROUP ON PREVENTION AND MANAGEMENT OF DENGUE

Date: 3.5.2019

Discussion

Chief Secretary, Government of West Bengal took the chair and welcomed all the participants. He emphasized, in his initial remarks, on coordination among State Government Departments for prevention and management of dengue in the year 2019.

Additional Chief Secretary, Health and FW Department briefed that as per the Dengue Action Plan, 2019 around one lakh personnel would be deployed in all Blocks and ULBs in the State for fever survey, vector control activity and awareness generation. He pointed out that 10 districts contributed to more than 91% of total dengue positive cases in the State. These are:

- Most vulnerable districts (5) – North 24 Parganas, Kolkata, Howrah, South 24 Parganas and Nadia: these districts contribute to more than **66% case load**
- Other vulnerable districts (5) - Darjeeling (Siliguri), Malda, Murshidabad, Paschim Medinipur, Hooghly: Further **25% case load**

He also informed that 803 vulnerable Wards and 791 vulnerable GPs had been identified based on the incidence of dengue over the last few years and physical vulnerability mapping. Additional infrastructural requirements for vulnerable areas (rural and urban) like-spot source of water, piped water supply, pucca drains, toilets, garbage vats had been identified and shared with UD&MA, P&RD and PHE Departments. He requested all departments to specially focus on these 10 districts and vulnerable areas (urban slums and rural fringes) for prevention of dengue.

Background Note highlighting department wise issues and required actions was shared with all members.

1. Irrigation Department informed that contract had been awarded to agencies for maintenance of 1980 Kms of canal in and around Kolkata and Purba Medinipur. Also, survey was done with KMC to identify spots where garbage was thrown in canals.
2. P&RD Department informed that House to House survey and vector control activity had started in all GPs from March, 2019 as per plan.
3. UD&MA Department had started the process of installation of solid waste management at 30 ULBs. Vector control activity would be started in vulnerable wards from May, 2019 on a weekly basis. HtH Survey and vector control activity for other ULB areas would be started from June, 2019.
4. I&CA Department had prepared plan to involve Lok Prasar Prakalpa teams for awareness generation on dengue prevention.
5. Awareness on dengue and preventive measures had been included in the syllabus of School Education Department.
6. WCD&SW Department had issued instruction to all districts for involvement of Anganwadi Workers and Kanyashree students in awareness generation and cleaning of own households.
7. PHE Department had completed survey in identified vulnerable villages for installation of spot sources, construction of platform, improvement of drainage and piped water supply. Works would be started after the General Election, 2019.
8. PWD had issued instruction for involvement of departmental engineers in monitoring of construction sites to ensure clean environment.
9. Youth Services and Sports Department had issued letter to all District Magistrates for planned participation of youth clubs in dengue prevention and management in local areas.
10. KMC had issued letter to 11 State Government Departments and 7 GOI establishments where vector control activities were to be intensified.

Decisions Taken


1. Special focus would be given on 10 vulnerable districts.
2. **Health & FW Department** would sanction fund for payment of honourarium to House to House Workers, Supervisors, Data Entry Assistants in ULBs; mobility support to ULBs; contingency to ULBs; cost of larvicide in rural areas, printing of forms for use in rural and ULBs through CMOH, State level IEC (TV, radio, newspaper).
3. **Panchayat & RD Department** would sanction fund for payment of honourarium to House to House Workers, Supervisors, Data Entry Assistants; mobility support; spray machine and other implements; contingency to Blocks/GPs. The Department would move FD for adequate budget provision. The Department would also plan for non-municipal towns and approach FD for budget provision.
4. **Urban Development & MA Department** would sanction fund for payment of honourarium to vector control teams; larvicide for ULBs, spray machine etc. The Department would move FD for adequate budget provision.
5. **P&RD and UDMA departments** would issue necessary instruction to panchayats and ULBs for getting the water bodies cleaned up before guppy fishes could be released in them. This work should be completed by May-end and release of fish made available by the Fisheries Department should be released in water bodies from the first week of June, 2019.
6. **HFW department** would especially strengthen urban PHCs to handle dengue.
7. **All departments** would sanction fund for infrastructure works, IEC at local level etc.
8. Additional infrastructure development works in vulnerable areas to be completed at the earliest (Action -**UD&MA, P&RD, PHED**).
9. **Irrigation Department** would ensure regular maintenance of irrigation canals for continuous flow of water covering the entire breadth of the canal. Special care would be taken for canals in and around Kolkata like CPT canal, Bagjola, Baichikhali etc.

10. Filling up of pot holes/unused cesspools/ditches before monsoon. Special emphasis to be given in Bidhannagar Municipal Area (Action - **UD&MA, P&RD, PWD, PHED, Irrigation, Fisheries, KMC, BMC**).
11. **Fisheries Department** would supply around 1.50 crore larvivorous fishes by 1st week of June, 2019. All ULBs and Blocks would clean ponds of water hyacinth before release of fishes. Further requirement of larvivorous fishes would be assessed by the Department in mid-June 2019.
12. All ULBs would organize meeting with clinical establishments in municipal areas on Dengue prevention protocol (Action - **UD&MA Dept and HFW Dept**).
13. All Blocks and ULBs would organize meeting with youth clubs, Kanyashree students, Anganwadi Workers, school/colleges and SHGs on awareness generation. Health & FW Department would provide technical assistance (Action - **UD&MA, P&RD, HFW, SHG&SE**).
14. The new initiative proposed in vulnerable ULBs for formation of Citizens' Task Force in vulnerable areas. **UD&MA** Dept was requested to issue necessary guideline in this regard. In rural areas the VHSNCs would function as Citizens' Task Force.
15. **P&RD Department** would arrange regular conservancy works in rural fringes.
16. **KMC** would organize fever camps for early detection of dengue. Also, will organize meeting with private clinical establishments (Support – **HFW Dept**).
17. Private ponds in **KMC** area to be maintained by as per the existing provisions of law.
18. **KMC** would continue cleaning of the Gol establishments' offices and residential campuses, especially the ones that were generally not undertaking scavenging and cleaning regularly.
19. Health infrastructure in **BMC** would be strengthened from the state level (Action - **UD&MA and HFW Dept**).
20. Instruction would be issued to all colleges and schools for involvement of students in dengue prevention in own household environment, adequate personal protection measures and keeping school premises clean especially before and after long

vacations (Action - Higher Education and School Education Dept). HFW Dept would provide the required IEC materials to these departments.

21. Higher Education department would involve NSS in dengue prevention and cleanliness drive.
22. I&CA Department would send budget to HFW Department for sanction of fund for IEC in all government programmes/events.
23. Meeting with agencies for clean environment in construction sites during monsoon (Action - PWD and PHED).
24. Instruction to all districts for sensitization of Self Help Groups and involving them in awareness generation and cleanliness in individual homes and immediate neighborhood. Health & FW Department would share IEC materials (Action - SHG&SE and HFW Dept).
25. Instruction would be issued by DGP and Commissioners of Kolkata Police and Bidhannagar Police for involvement of youth clubs and social organizations in awareness generation and scavenging/cleaning of local areas (DGP, Commissioner(s) of Police).
26. Police directorate, KP and Bidhannagar police would undertake special cleaning drive in their dumping grounds and the ones used for keeping condemned vehicles.

Urban Local Bodies: Initiatives for the present year.

Dear Chairperson/Mayor,

The Government of West Bengal attaches the highest importance to the control of vector borne diseases. You are aware of the activities for prevention and control of vector borne diseases that need to be taken up this year right from May in a comprehensive manner as guided by Health & Family Welfare Department from time to time. Apart from routine activities already undertaken as in the previous years for VBD control, it has been decided at a high level meeting chaired by the Chief Secretary that the municipal bodies would take the following few more steps with a view to further strengthen VBD control and management mechanism in the areas in your jurisdiction:

1. Wherever Vector Control Team and House to House Team are yet to be formed, these may be formed forthwith. Involvement of HHWs, SHG members and MAS in H2H team should be prioritised.
2. The vector control team members need to be adequately trained. SUDA has completed training of ULB level Master Trainers. You need to ensure that the MTs complete training of VCT within May, 2019.

3. Citizens' Task Force (CTF) may be formed at ward level to facilitate house-to-house vector control activities and ensure community involvement and solution of local challenges. CTF may include local community stakeholders, respectable persons, members of clubs and other community organizations.
4. It has already been decided to form a Municipal Task Force for solid waste management (MTF - SWM) under your leadership. This Task Force should also oversee the VBD management initiatives as this involves conservancy activities.
 5. Special emphasis should be given to regular cleanliness drive/conservancy work in urban slums, factories and mills, construction sites, unused premises *etc.* In case owner of the property, whether private or government, does not keep the premises clean, action should be initiated under the following sections of the concerned Act as enumerated below:
 - a. Section 159A, HMC Act, 1980 - for Howrah Municipal Corporation
 - b. Section 496A, KMC Act, 1980 - for Kolkata Municipal Corporation
 - c. Section 243, West Bengal Municipal Corporation Act, 2006 - for all other Municipal Corporations
 - d. Section 333, West Bengal Municipal Act, 1993 - for all Municipalities.
 6. Potholes/ditches/low lying areas *etc.* where water may accumulate should be repaired or drained.
 7. Construction of household/community/public toilets should be completed to ensure general cleanliness in the locality.
 8. Open vats should be removed on urgent basis. Scientific disposal of solid waste should be taken care of.
 9. Schemes for piped water supply may be proposed in consultation with MED or KMDA.
 10. Cleaning of water bodies should also be undertaken immediately. Water hyacinths and other growth in water bodies should be removed. For bigger projects, plan & estimates for renovation, cleaning and beautification of water bodies may be sent to the UD&MA Department under Green City Mission for allotment of funds.

12. All reports of investigations & E may be submitted to the District Health Officer, West Bengal according to the guidelines for releasing fish to the water bodies.

13. Cleaning of school/college premises and surroundings should be continued.

14. Inauguration of IBC activities should be initiated like every year. Service of the SHCs should be utilised for this purpose.


14. Regular meeting/ sensitization with local clinical establishments such as Nursing Home, Private Hospital, Private Practitioners should be held regarding proper management and timely referral of fever/VBDs. Trained Health Officer/ Medical Officer from ULBs may lead a small committee at ULB level to guide and monitor these establishments.

15. Adequate attention should be paid to maintain integrity and quality of the data collected during House to House survey, VCT activities and Vector Borne Disease Surveillance.





Subject: Prevention and Management of Dengue in the year 2019 – Follow up

Madam/Sir,

A State level meeting with regard to preparation of state level plan for Dengue management was held under the chairpersonship of the Hon'ble Chief Minister on 19 February, 2019. The meeting reviewed the status of initiatives undertaken for prevention and management of dengue in 2019. Following decisions have been taken in that meeting-

1. A total of 787 wards and 791 have been identified in consultation with the districts (district wise list is annexed) across the State as vulnerable areas. It decided that –
 - a. **In the vulnerable areas (urban and rural), the House-to-House (HTH) survey would be conducted during the months of June to November, 2019 on a fortnightly basis (5 day activity in each round; 13 rounds in total).**
 - b. **In the vulnerable areas (urban and rural), the activities of Vector Control Teams (VCT) will start from the 1st week of May, 2019 and will continue up to November, 2019 on a weekly basis (6 day activity; 30 rounds in total).**
2. **In other areas (urban and rural), both HTH Survey and work of VCTs will start from the 1st week of June, 2019 and will continue up to November, 2019 on a fortnightly basis (13 rounds in total). Duration of each round will be same as above.**

3. In urban areas, a 2-member HTH Team will be deployed per 300 households (average). In rural areas, a 2-member HTH Team will be engaged for each GP area. Two (2) VCTs will be deployed for each urban Ward as well as for each GP area. Each Vector Control Team will consist of 3 members.

One Supervisor will be deployed for 5 HTH Teams in the urban areas. In rural areas, one Supervisor will be engaged for each GP for both HTH Teams and VCTs.


Rs 150/- per day will be allowed as honorarium to each worker/member of both H2H and VC team.

For data entry in the software, 1 DEA will be engaged at each Urban Primary Health Centre and 3 DEAs at the headquarter level. In case of the ULB having no UPHC, 4 DEAs will be engaged at the headquarters. They will be allowed Rs. 75 per day for 7 days during each round. In case of rural areas, services of the data entry operator under MGNREGA will be utilized.

4. In order to destroy the mosquito larvae, both chemical larvicides (e.g. temephos, diflubenzuron etc) and bio-larvicides should be used. Rotational use of these larvicides is advisable.
5. In order to control of larval population of Dengue vector in water bodies (e.g. cesspool, unused pond, ditches etc) extensive use of larvivorous fish (e.g. guppy, gambusia) is to be ensured. Fisheries Department has been requested to meet the increased demand in the current year. A meeting with District Fisheries Officer may be held early and total fish requirement for urban as well as rural areas may be placed with the Fisheries department.
6. Training of HTH survey workers, Vector Control Team members and members of Citizens' Task Force is to be completed by May, 2019.

7. Training of Medical officers and private doctors, private laboratories, nurses, Municipal Health Officers and MOs, laboratory technicians should also be completed by May, 2019. It is to be ensured that all laboratories in the government hospitals are functional and no equipment lies unutilized. Any shortage of equipment, chemicals or HR must be brought to the notice of Health department within 15 March 2019. I would request you to initiate action on the above mentioned points. CMOH of your district has been briefed on the above issues. CMOHs will provide required assistance for providing input and implementation of the district plan.

Adequate precautions are required to be taken by Public Works Department to prevent breeding of mosquito larva in any building / land/ other asset maintained by Public Works Department. The matter was reviewed by Hon'ble Chief Minister. All concerned of P.W.D. will ensure the following:

- i) All open pits where water might accumulate and remain stagnant are to be closed down immediately.
- ii) Drainage is to be ensured so that water does not accumulate at any part.
- iii) Construction sites have to be specially monitored so that mosquito larvae does not breed in the site. Debris should be removed regularly. No water should be allowed to remain stagnant at the site.
- iv) Bleaching powder may be applied from time to time.
- v) Air Condition Machines should be cleaned regularly and water accumulation prevented.
- vi) Rubbish / garbage / debris should be removed.
- vii) Unwanted vegetation should be removed.

Concerned Engineer Officers shall inspect the assets within their jurisdiction regularly and ensure that the above mentioned action is taken.

RECORD NOTES OF THE MEETING OF CORE GROUP ON PREVENTION AND MANAGEMENT OF DENGUE

Date: 3.5.2019

Venue- Chief Secretary's Conference Hall,
Nabanna

Discussion

Chief Secretary, Government of West Bengal took the chair and welcomed all the participants. He emphasized, in his initial remarks, on coordination among State Government Departments for prevention and management of dengue in the year 2019.

Additional Chief Secretary, Health and FW Department briefed that as per the Dengue Action Plan, 2019 around one lakh personnel would be deployed in all Blocks and ULBs in the State for fever survey, vector control activity and awareness generation. He pointed out that 10 districts contributed to more than 91% of total dengue positive cases in the State. These are:

- Most vulnerable districts (5) – North 24 Parganas, Kolkata, Howrah, South 24 Parganas and Nadia: these districts contribute to more than **66% case load**
- Other vulnerable districts (5) - Darjeeling (Siliguri), Malda, Murshidabad, Paschim Medinipur, Hooghly: Further **25% case load**

He also informed that 803 vulnerable Wards and 791 vulnerable GPs had been identified based on the incidence of dengue over the last few years and physical vulnerability mapping. Additional infrastructural requirements for vulnerable areas (rural and urban) like spot source of water, piped water supply, pucca drains, toilets, garbage vats had been identified and shared with UD&MA, P&RD and PHE Departments. He requested all departments to specially focus on these 10 districts and vulnerable areas (urban slums and rural fringes) for prevention of dengue.

Background Note highlighting department wise issues and required actions was shared with all members.


Decisions Taken

1. Special focus would be given on 10 vulnerable districts.
2. **Health & FW Department** would sanction fund for payment of honourarium to House to House Workers, Supervisors, Data Entry Assistants in ULBs; mobility support to ULBs; contingency to ULBs; cost of larvicide in rural areas, printing of forms for use in rural and ULBs through CMOH, State level IEC (TV, radio, newspaper).
3. **Panchayat & RD Department** would sanction fund for payment of honourarium to House to House Workers, Supervisors, Data Entry Assistants; mobility support; spray machine and other implements; contingency to Blocks/GPs. The Department would move FD for adequate budget provision. The Department would also plan for non-municipal towns and approach FD for budget provision.
4. **Urban Development & MA Department** would sanction fund for payment of honourarium to vector control teams; larvicide for ULBs, spray machine etc. The Department would move FD for adequate budget provision.
5. **P&RD and UDMA departments** would issue necessary instruction to panchayats and ULBs for getting the water bodies cleaned up before guppy fishes could be released in them. This work should be completed by May-end and release of fish made available by the Fisheries Department should be released in water bodies from the first week of June, 2019.
6. **HFW department** would especially strengthen urban PHCs to handle dengue.
7. **All departments** would sanction fund for infrastructure works, IEC at local level etc.
8. Additional infrastructure development works in vulnerable areas to be completed at the earliest (Action -**UD&MA, P&RD, PHED**).
9. **Irrigation Department** would ensure regular maintenance of irrigation canals for continuous flow of water covering the entire breadth of the canal. Special care would be taken for canals in and around Kolkata like CPT canal, Bagjola, Baichikhali etc.

vacations (Action - **Higher Education and School Education Dept**). **HFW Dept** would provide the required IEC materials to these departments.

21. **Higher Education department** would involve NSS in dengue prevention and cleanliness drive.
22. **I&CA Department** would send budget to HFW Department for sanction of fund for IEC in all government programmes/events.
23. Meeting with agencies for clean environment in construction sites during monsoon (Action - **PWD and PHED**).
24. Instruction to all districts for **sensitization of Self Help Groups** and involving them in awareness generation and cleanliness in individual homes and immediate neighborhood. Health & FW Department would share IEC materials (Action - **SHG&SE and HFW Dept**).
25. Instruction would be issued by DGP and Commissioners of Kolkata Police and Bidhannagar Police for involvement of youth clubs and social organizations in awareness generation and scavenging/cleaning of local areas (**DGP, Commissioner(s) of Police**).
26. **Police directorate, KP and Bidhannagar police** would undertake special cleaning drive in their dumping grounds and the ones used for keeping condemned vehicles.

Chief Secretary requested all to take steps for prevention of mosquito breeding after cyclone 'Fani' passed over State territory.

লার্ভাভোজী মাছের ব্যবহার হল জৈবিক উপায়ে মশা নিয়ন্ত্রণের একটি পদ্ধতি ।

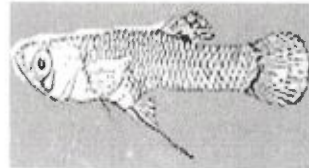
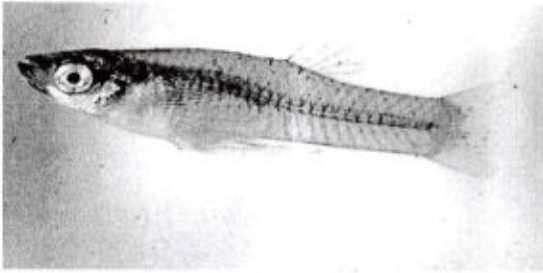
১৯০৩ সাল থেকে লার্ভাভোজী মাছের দ্বারা মশা দমন শুরু করা হয় । এই পদ্ধতি কাজে লাগিয়ে বিভিন্ন স্থানে মশার লার্ভা কমানোয় সাফল্য পাওয়া গেছে ।

সাধারণত গামবুসিয়া এবং গান্ধি মাছই এই কাজে ব্যবহার করা হয় । এই মাছগুলি প্রায় দু বছর বেঁচে থাকে, যদিও পুরুষ মাছের আয়ু সাধারণতঃ সাত সপ্তাহ ।

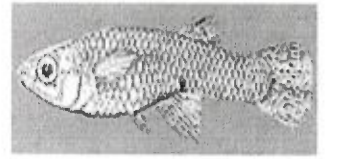
মাছগুলি বেশ কষ্টসহিষ্ণু, কারণ বদ্ধ জলাশয়ে, যেখানে অক্সিজেন মাত্রা কম, লবণাক্ত জল, সেখানেও এরা বেঁচে থাকতে পারে এবং স্বাভাবিক ভাবে প্রজনন চালিয়ে যায় । এরা মোটামুটি উচ্চ তাপমাত্রা (26-34°C) এবং নিম্ন তাপমাত্রাও (10°C) সহ্য করতে পারে ।

রাসায়নিক নিয়ন্ত্রণ পদ্ধতির থেকে মাছ-নির্ভর পদ্ধতির খরচ অনেকটা কম হয়, যেহেতু মাছ গুলি বহুদিন বেঁচে থাকে এবং সারা বছরে প্রায় ৩-৪ বার প্রজননের মাধ্যমে মাছের সংখ্যা নিজে থেকেই বাড়তে থাকে ।

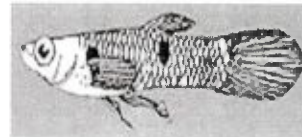


Gambusia - Male

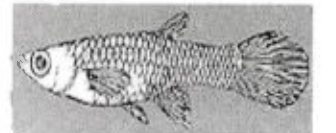

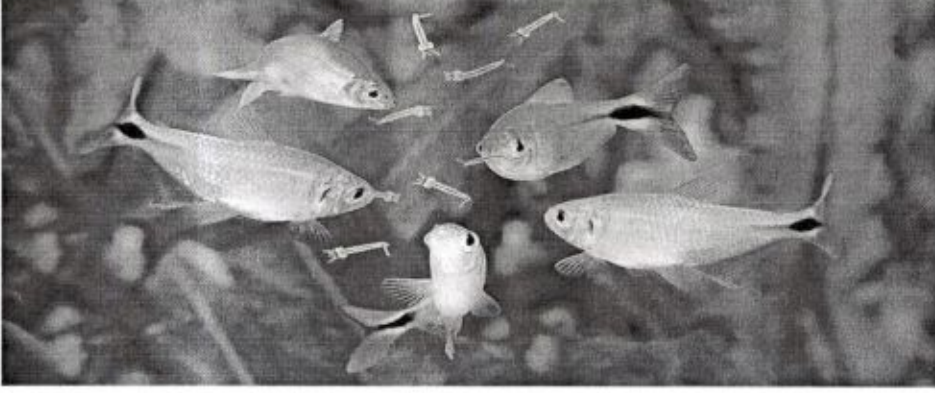

লার্ভা নিয়ন্ত্রন ক্ষমতা :



একটি পূর্ণাঙ্গ গাঙ্গি মাছ দিনপ্রতি ৮০-১০০ টি মশার লার্ভা এবং গামবুসিয়া ১০০-৩০০ টি মশার লার্ভা খেতে পারে।

- মাছগুলির আকার বেশ ছোট বলে এরা খাদক প্রাণীদের প্রিয় খাদ্য নয় এবং প্রয়োজনে এরা সহজে জলের গাছপালার মধ্যে লুকিয়ে পড়ে।
- গাঙ্গি এবং গামবুসিয়া মাছগুলি সেই সমস্ত বদ্ধ অগভীর জলাশয়ে বেঁচে থাকতে পারে যেগুলো মশার আদর্শ জন্মস্থল এবং উল্লেখযোগ্য ভাবে মশার লার্ভা এদের প্রিয় খাদ্য।
- খুব সহজেই মাছগুলিকে বিভিন্ন জায়গায় সহজে নিয়ে যাওয়া যায় এবং নতুন জলাশয়ে খুব তাড়াতাড়ি এরা মানিয়ে নিতে পারে।

মাছগুলিকে কিভাবে ব্যবহার করা উচিত

- সর্বোচ্চ ৪০ লিটার পরিমাপের প্লাস্টিক ব্যাগ / জেরিক্যান / প্লাস্টিক পাত্রের অর্ধেক জল ভর্তি করে (যাতে পাত্রের মধ্যে যথেষ্ট অক্সিজেন থাকে) মাছগুলিকে বহন করতে হবে এবং অবশ্যই সূর্যালোক থেকে আড়ালে নিতে হবে।
- ৩-৫ লিটার এর পলিথিন ব্যাগে ১.৫ লিটার জল ভরে মাছ গুলিকে রাখতে হবে; তবে ২৪ ঘন্টার মধ্যে উপযুক্ত স্থানে ছেড়ে দিতে হবে।
- ১ রৈখিক মিটার দৈর্ঘ্যে ৫-১০ টি মাছ, খুব বেশি লার্ভা ঘনত্ব হলে ১০-২০ টি মাছের হিসেবে ছাড়া যেতে পারে।
- মাছ ছাড়ার উপযুক্ত সময় ভোর বেলা বা সন্ধ্যার দিকে।
- মাছ ছাড়ার আগে মাছের পাত্রের এবং জলাশয়ের তাপমাত্রা একই রকম থাকা উচিত।

- মাছ ছাড়ার আগে অন্যান্য খাদক মাছ এবং ঘন আগাছা বা আবর্জনা পরিষ্কার করে নিতে হবে এবং সেই পরিচ্ছন্নতা বজায় রাখতে হবে।
- খারমোকল অথবা প্লাস্টিকের/ মাটির পাত্র, ডাবের খোলা ইত্যাদি জলে ভেসে থাকলে, তা' অবশ্যই পরিষ্কার করে নিতে হবে, কারণ এই সব পাত্রে জল জমলে, মশা ডিম পাড়তে পারে। কিন্তু পাত্রগুলি জলের উপর ভেসে থাকায় মাছ সেখানে পৌঁছাতে পারে না। মাছেরা যেহেতু দলবদ্ধ হয়ে ঘুরে বেড়ায়, তাই ওই সব জলাশয়ের আগাছা পরিষ্কার রাখাও জরুরি।

নজরদারি ও নিয়ন্ত্রণ

সুপারভাইজররা ডেঙ্গি-প্রবণ মরশুমে মাসে অন্ততঃ এক থেকে দুইবার নজরদারি করবেন:-

- জলাশয়ের পরিচ্ছন্নতা বজায় আছে কিনা।
- মাছ ছাড়ার পর সেগুলি বেঁচে আছে কিনা।
- যদি না বেঁচে থাকে, তবে কেন মাছগুলি বাঁচতে পারেনি (জলে অনবরত আবর্জনা বা দূষিত পদার্থ ফেলার জন্য বা লার্ভিসাইডাল রাসায়নিক দেওয়ার জন্য প্রভৃতি)।
- নতুন কোনো জায়গায় মাছ ছাড়ার প্রয়োজন আছে কিনা।
- মাছ ছাড়ার ফলে লার্ভার ঘনত্ব কমেছে কিনা এবং এলাকায় মশা ঘটিত রোগের প্রকোপ কমেছে কিনা লক্ষ্য রাখতে হবে।

Urban Local Bodies: Initiatives for the present year.**

Dear Chairperson/Mayor,

The Government of West Bengal attaches the highest importance to the control of vector borne diseases. You are aware of the activities for prevention and control of vector borne diseases that need to be taken up this year right from May in a comprehensive manner as guided by Health & Family Welfare Department from time to time. Apart from routine activities already undertaken as in the previous years for VBD control, it has been decided at a high level meeting chaired by the Chief Secretary that the municipal bodies would take the following few more steps with a view to further strengthen VBD control and management mechanism in the areas in your jurisdiction:

1. Wherever Vector Control Team and House to House Team are yet to be formed, these may be formed forthwith. Involvement of HHWs, SHG members and MAS in H2H team should be prioritised.
2. The vector control team members need to be adequately trained. SUDA has completed training of ULB level Master Trainers. You need to ensure that the MTs complete training of VCT within May, 2019.


3. Citizens' Task Force (CTF) may be formed at ward level to facilitate house to house vector control activities and ensure community involvement and solution of local challenges. CTF may include local councillors, stakeholders, respectable persons, members of clubs and other community organizations.
4. It has already been decided to form a Municipal Task Force for solid waste management (MTF – SWM) under your leadership. This Task Force should also oversee the VBD management initiatives as this involves conservancy activities.
5. Special emphasis should be given to regular cleanliness drive/conservancy work in urban slums, factories and mills, construction sites, unused premises *etc.* In case owner of the property, whether private or government, does not keep the premises clean, action should be initiated under the following sections of the concerned Act as enumerated below:
 - a. Section 159A, HMC Act, 1980 – for Howrah Municipal Corporation
 - b. Section 496A, KMC Act, 1980 – for Kolkata Municipal Corporation
 - c. Section 243, West Bengal Municipal Corporation Act, 2006 – for all other Municipal Corporations
 - d. Section 333, West Bengal Municipal Act , 1993 – for all Municipalities.
6. Potholes/ditches/low lying areas *etc.* where water may accumulate should be repaired or drained.
7. Construction of household/community/public toilets should be completed to ensure general cleanliness in the locality.
8. Open vats should be removed on urgent basis. Scientific disposal of solid waste should be taken care of.
9. Schemes for piped water supply may be proposed in consultation with MED or KMDA.
10. Cleaning of water bodies should also be undertaken immediately. Water hyacinths and other growth in water bodies should be removed. For bigger projects, plan & estimates for renovation, cleaning and beautification of water bodies may be sent to the UD&MA Department under Green City Mission for allotment of funds.

11. Requisition of larvivorous fish may be submitted to the District Fisheries Officer adhering to the guidelines for releasing fish to the water bodies.
12. Cleaning of school/college premises and surroundings should be continued.
13. Intensive IEC activities should be initiated like every year. Service of the SHGs should be utilised for this purpose.
14. Regular meeting/ sensitization with local clinical establishments such as Nursing Home, Private Hospital, Private Practitioners should be held regarding proper management and timely referral of fever/ VBDs. Trained Health Officer/ Medical Officer from ULBs may lead a small committee at ULB level to guide and monitor these establishments.
15. Adequate attention should be paid to maintain integrity and quality of the data collected during House to House survey, VCT activities and Vector Borne Disease Surveillance.

You are aware of the activities for prevention and control of vector borne diseases that need to be taken up this year right from May in a comprehensive manner as guided by Health & Family Welfare Department from time to time. Apart from routine activities already undertaken as in the previous years for VBD control, it has been decided at a high level meeting chaired by the Chief Secretary that the municipal bodies would take the following few more steps with a view to further strengthen VBD control and management mechanism in the areas in your jurisdiction:

1. Wherever Vector Control Team and House to House Team are yet to be formed, these may be formed forthwith. Involvement of HHWs, SHG members and MAS in H2H team should be prioritised.
2. The vector control team members need to be adequately trained. SUDA has completed training of ULB level Master Trainers. You need to ensure that the MTs complete training of VCT within May, 2019.
3. Citizens' Task Force (CTF) may be formed at ward level to facilitate house to house vector control activities and ensure community involvement and solution of local challenges. CTF may include local councillors, stakeholders, respectable persons, members of clubs and other community organizations.
4. It has already been decided to form a Municipal Task Force for solid waste management (MTF – SWM) under your leadership. This Task Force should also oversee the VBD management initiatives as this involves conservancy activities.
5. Special emphasis should be given to regular cleanliness drive/conservancy work in urban slums, factories and mills, construction sites, unused premises etc. In case

owner of the property, whether private or government, does not keep the premises clean, action should be initiated under the following sections of the concerned Act as enumerated below:

- a. Section 159A, HMC Act, 1980 – for Howrah Municipal Corporation
 - b. Section 496A, KMC Act, 1980 – for Kolkata Municipal Corporation
 - c. Section 243, West Bengal Municipal Corporation Act, 2006 – for all other Municipal Corporations
 - d. Section 333, West Bengal Municipal Act, 1993 – for all Municipalities.
6. Potholes/ditches/low lying areas etc. where water may accumulate should be repaired or drained.
 7. Construction of household/community/public toilets should be completed to ensure general cleanliness in the locality.
 8. Open vats should be removed on urgent basis. Scientific disposal of solid waste should be taken care of.
 9. Schemes for piped water supply may be proposed in consultation with MED or KMDA.
 10. Cleaning of water bodies should also be undertaken immediately. Water hyacinths and other growth in water bodies should be removed. For bigger projects, plan & estimates for renovation, cleaning and beautification of water bodies may be sent to the UD&MA Department under Green City Mission for allotment of funds.
 11. Requisition of larvivorous fish may be submitted to the District Fisheries Officer adhering to the guidelines for releasing fish to the water bodies.
 12. Cleaning of school/college premises and surroundings should be continued.
 13. Intensive IEC activities should be initiated like every year. Service of the SHGs should be utilised for this purpose.
 14. Regular meeting/ sensitization with local clinical establishments such as Nursing Home, Private Hospital, Private Practitioners should be held regarding proper management and timely referral of fever/ VBDs. Trained Health Officer/ Medical Officer from ULBs may lead a small committee at ULB level to guide and monitor these establishments.

15. Adequate attention should be paid to maintain integrity and quality of the data collected during House to House survey, VCT activities and Vector Borne Disease Surveillance.

Action required

Sensitization of Self Help Groups and involving them in awareness generation and cleanliness in individual homes and immediate neighborhood.

Dear Sir,

I refer to the discussions held during the conference with selected municipalities/corporations relating to prevention and control of vector borne diseases on 2nd June, 2018. Several issues were raised by the Commissioners/Chairpersons and health officials of different ULBs for making our efforts on vector control more effective. Apart from all the instructions issued from time to time and the guidelines already circulated the following steps are reiterated:


1. Wherever all the House to House (H-to-H) teams and Vector Control teams are yet to be formed, these may be formed forthwith.
2. The teams need to be adequately trained. If training of master trainers is required, you may contact CPHO, SUDA (e-mail: cphosuda@gmail.com) within 11th June 2018.
3. There are gaps reported in conservancy. If needed, efforts should be redoubled to ensure that the breeding sites are cleaned on a regular basis. In case the owner of the property, whether private or Government is not keeping the premises clean, action should be initiated under relevant sections of HMC Act. The extract of the provisions of the Sec.159A, HMC Act. 1980 provide for issuing notice upon the

owner/occupier to clean or maintain such premises to prevent mosquito breeding. If the person fails to comply with the direction, there is a provision for imposition of penalty and also recovery of the cost of cleaning the premises by the municipal body. A copy of the relevant section is enclosed.

4. You are requested to pay closer attention to the micro plan and the State Vector Borne Diseases Control and Seasonal Influenza Plan 2018 available at www.bhdc.gov.in and the relevant District Vector Borne Diseases Control Seasonal Influenza Plan 2018. Issues relevant to different government departments including Central government departments may be brought to the notice of the relevant officers whose particulars have been provided in the said district plan.
5. In view of discrepancy of data, it is requested that adequate attention be paid to the integrity and quality of the data relating to House to House survey and related vector borne diseases control activities.

HMC Act, 1980

Sec. 159A. Prevention of mosquito-breeding.—(1) If, in the opinion of the Mayor-in-Council, any pool, ditch, tank, well, pond, swamp, quarry, hole, drain, cesspool, watercourse, pit, cistern, desert or air-cooler, ground, underground, or overhead tank or any collection of water, or any land on which water may, at any time, accumulate, is or likely to become a breeding place of mosquitoes or, in any other respect, becomes a nuisance, the Mayor-in-Council may by notice require the owner or the person having control thereof to take all or any of the following actions :—

- (a) to clean, or drain off or remove water therefrom, or to provide cover thereto, or
- (b) to treat the same in such physical, chemical or biological method as may consider suitable in the circumstances, or
- (c) to fill up unwholesome waterbody.

Provided that any unwholesome waterbody may be filled up only after compliance with the provisions of section 40 of the West Bengal Land Reforms Act, 1955, (West Ben. Act X of 1956), by the owner or the person having control thereof.

(2) No person shall keep, or permitted to be kept or maintained, within any premises or land any collection of stagnant or flowing water which, in the opinion of the Mayor-in-Council, is, or is likely to be, a breeding place for mosquitoes, unless such collection of water is treated in such manner as may effectively prevent the breeding of mosquitoes.

(3) All borrow pits dug in the course of construction and repairs of buildings, roads, or embankments shall be deep and connected with each other in the formation of a drain directed towards the lowest level and properly sloped for discharge into a river, stream, channel, or drain, and no person shall create any isolated borrow pit which is likely to cause accumulation of water which again, in turn, may breed mosquito.

(4) The owner or occupier of any premises shall not keep therein any bottle, tyre (old or new), vessel, can, container or receptacle in such manner as may allow it to collect, or to retain, water which may breed mosquito, and shall clean and dry such bottle, tyre (old or new), vessel, can, container or receptacle at the interval of seven days.

(5) The owner or occupier of any premises shall wrap the openings of the vent-pipes and the outlets of septic tanks with proper mosquito-proof nets and shall maintain covering slabs of septic tanks to prevent entry and exit of mosquitoes.

(6) The owner or occupier of any premises shall seal the overhead tanks, cisterns or water receptacles to prevent mosquito breeding, and shall provide safe ladder for making the overhead tanks or cisterns or water receptacles approachable in order to facilitate inspection of the water in the container by the municipal authorities.

(7) For construction of permanent water collections such as swimming pools, artificial fountains, or water reservoirs, constructed for the purpose of beautification,—

- (a) an application shall be submitted to the Corporation, stating therein the anti-larval measures, which shall be taken by the applicant to keep the water free of mosquito larvae;
- (b) the Corporation, after considering the application, shall issue a license to the applicant;
- (c) the applicant shall comply the said license on payment of such fee as may be determined by the Corporation, and the license shall be renewed annually.

(8) The owner or the occupier of any private pond or water reservoir shall keep such pond or water reservoir free from water hyacinth or allied weeds to prevent mosquito breeding.

(9) If any person on whom the notice under sub section (1) is served on fails or refuses to take the measures, or adopt the method of treatment, specified in such notice within the time specified therein or contravenes the forgoing provisions under this section, the Municipal Commissioner himself or any officer duly authorized by him may take such measures or adopt such treatment, specified in such notice within the time specified therein, and recover the cost of doing so on the owner or the occupier of the premises, as the case may be, by way of levying special conservancy charges, at such rate as may be determined by the Mayor-in-Council, and shall also be liable to a penalty which shall not be less than rupees one thousand but may extend to rupees one lakh only.


