

**Sub. : Appointment of Additional District Magistrates as the Project Directors of DFID assisted HHW Scheme in 11 Non-KMA ULBs.**

Placed herewith a communication of the Jt. Secretary, Dept. of Municipal Affairs bearing no. 757/MA/C-10/2S-22/2009 dt. 30.10.2009 which speaks for itself.

In this connection this is to mention here that some of the ULBs out of 11, are facing problems in operating Bank A/C because of transfer of ADM / SDOs who are acting as Project Director of the HHW Scheme.

According to Project proposal approved both by Dept. of MA and DHFW, ADM / SDOs have been nominated as Project Director by the Government who is one of the signatories of the Bank A/C for HHW Scheme.

Since there is a post of Project Director who has been vested with definite responsibility including operation of Bank A/C, would it be in order to offer alternative proposal for operating Bank A/C ?

During active phase of IPP-VIII (Extn.), ADM acted as Project Director including operation of Bank A/C. But during O & M phase, at the request of some of the Chairman of the ULBs, Department of MA had approved joint operation of the Bank A/C by the Mayor / Chairman of the ULB and any other person as will be nominated by the Mayor / Chairman. Copy of approved note sheet is enclosed herewith for ready reference.

This is to state that in CBPHCS there is no post of Project Director and the Bank A/C is being operated by the Chairman / Vice Chairman and Finance Officer / Executive Officer.

Furthermore, this is to mention that HSDI support of DHFW is closed on 31.03.2010 and SPSRC of DHFW has approved extension of tenure of the scheme for a further period of one year w.e.f. 01.04.2010. Hence, any alternative decision be taken with regard to operation of Bank A/C for HHW Scheme, DHFW shall be consulted.
