

E.8: At the SDO office, all relevant documents (e.g. list of eligible candidates received from the BDO office, photocopies of mark sheets and proofs of residence of candidates selected in the panel, etc.) should be maintained properly and made available for any future verification if necessary.

E.9: The GP wise **Proforma ASHA_P1** is to be duly approved and signed by all the members of the ASHA Selection Committee and the SDO office will send it to the CMOH for further processing.

E.10: After receipt of the approved panel in prescribed format **Proforma ASHA_P1** from the SDO office, it is to be forwarded by the CMOH, within 30 days of receipt, to the State Mission Director (NRHM), Dept. of Health & Family Welfare, Govt. of West Bengal, along with a forwarding letter, for final approval.

E.11: On receipt of the final approval from the state, the engagement of ASHA will be done by the BMOH as Member Secretary of the Block Health & Family Welfare Samiti.

E.12: Standard format for engagement will be provided by the State ASHA Cell under NRHM along with the approved list.

F. Others:

F.1: Total no. of ASHAs to be selected per block as per Census, 2001, has already been communicated to the districts vide the initiation letters issued for the different phases.

F.2: The detailed analysis of area demarcated and assigned to each ASHA in the Gram Panchayat and subsequent reallocation, if any, has to be done as per Census, 2001.

F.3: Preference as mentioned in **Section D.4** will precede that in **Section D.5**.

F.4: In case of non-availability of candidates matching the selection criteria, specific relaxations may be approved on a case to case basis by NRHM, DoH&FW, GoWB, upon submission of a written request along with requisite proof from the Block Health & Family Welfare Samiti, by the CMOH.

F.5: After receiving engagement letter from the Block Health & Family Welfare Samiti, the ASHAs will undergo a complete residential training in various rounds as part of the capacity building mechanism. She will be entitled for a performance based incentive only after completion stipulated round of training as per guideline.

F.6: The revised order for selection of ASHAs will be effective on and from 15th July 2012. All selections initiated from this date onwards will follow this guideline.

under National Urban Health Mission (NUHM)**

Sir/ Madam,

In West Bengal the number of sanctioned U-PHC under NUHM is 459. Of these, 418 are already functional. Regular OPD are being organized in these U-PHCs and the average number of patients per U-PHC per month is 866 i.e., 35 patients per day per U-PHC. The patient load in all the U-PHCs however is not uniform. In many U-PHCs the average of OPD patients is far below the optimal point. Therefore it is time to intensify efforts to increase the number of OPD patient at U-PHCs run under NUHM.

As part of this initiative you are requested to link each and every U-PHCs under NUHM with local Community Based Organizations (CBOs).

These CBOs can be entrusted with the work of encouraging the local people to avail the health care delivery provided under NUHM by improving the health seeking behavior of the local community. The issues which can be taken-up by the selected CBOs are as follows:

- 1) Identification of vulnerable pockets and informing ULBs, so that outreach session can be organize in these pockets
- 2) Mobilize and sensitize the local community to avail of primary care provided by the U-PHCs
- 3) Assist ULBs to organize outreach camps (special outreach and UHND)
- 4) Disseminate information about various services available at U-PHCs and out-reach sessions.
- 5) Mobilize private practitioners for special outreach camps
- 6) Provide information on outbreak to ULB (like Dengue, Malaria, Diarrhoea etc.)
- 7) Participate in events and meetings on public health related issues organized by ULBs

- 8) Maintain regular contacts with community health workers (like urban ASHA / HHW, FTS)
- 9) Maintain liaison with the Mahila Arogya Samity (MAS)


You are requested to contact all the ULBs under NUHM (Municipal Corporations and Municipalities) and request them to identify local CBOs and link them with concerned U-PHCs to facilitate health care delivery for urban poor under NUHM. After identification and selection of these local CBOs, they should be oriented about NUHM by the concerned U-PHC and ULB. U-PHC will conduct at least one meeting a month with the selected CBOs. ULB will supervise and oversee these meeting.

The ULBs will maintain the following schedule for identification, selection, orientation and linkage of selected CBOs:

- 1) Identification of Local CBOs by 31st October, 2017
- 2) Linking of Local CBOs with U-PHC by 10th November, 2017 and
- 3) Orientation of Local Clubs or CBOs by ULBs by 30th November, 2017



Regular monitoring of the activities is the key to succeed in providing health in a wholesome manner without misusing the provisions laid down.

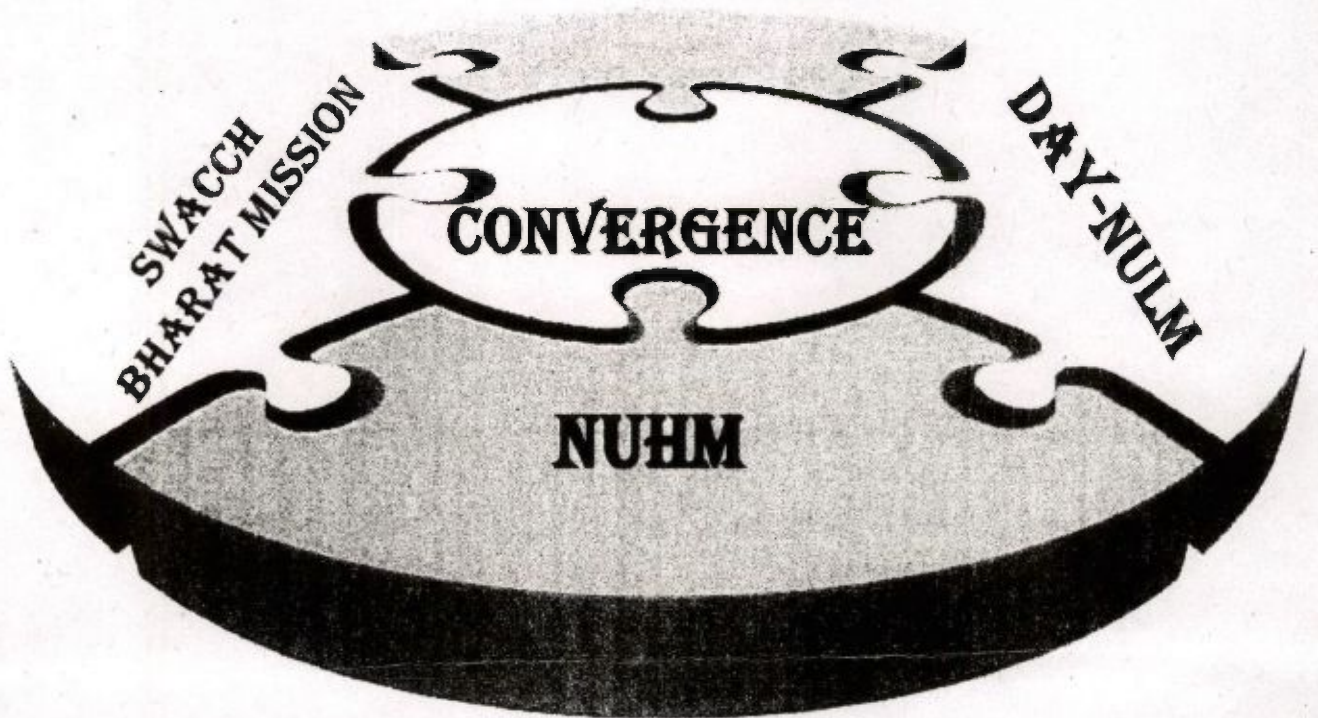

Convergence under NUHM

National Urban Health Mission (NUHM) was approved by the Union Cabinet on 1st May, 2013 as a sub-mission of National Health Mission (NHM) for providing equitable and quality primary health care services to the urban population with special focus to vulnerable/slum population.

2 Implementation of NUHM in States is heterogeneous and varies from state to state and city to city. Whereas in Seven Megacities NUHM is being implemented through Municipal Corporations, in some States like West Bengal and Maharashtra, the implementation is through Municipality and Nagar Palika. In most of the States NUHM is implemented through State Health departments as the ULBs are either not strong enough to provide the required services or the mandate is not for health.

3. Health outcomes are more defined by the other social determinants than by the just health itself. Addressing the other determinants entail building partnerships with institutions and actors both within the health and across other related sectors. Reducing health inequalities for sustainable improvement in health status of urban populations requires alignment of all sectors together with health sector, thus making Inter Sectoral Convergence is one of the main core strategies under the NUHM. The National Health Policy, 2017 also emphasize the importance of achieving convergence among the wider determinants of health and improving the environment for health. Monitoring of the programme reveals that the platform of NUHM requires integration and coordination of health and health related social determinants in order to provide a equitable, easily accessible, quality primary health care which includes preventive, promotive and curative health services deliverable to the target population i.e. the vulnerable urban population mainly slum dwellers. 4. This convergence of activities will not only improve the quality of services but also do away with the duplication of action thereby saving invaluable resources and time in the process.

5. Convergences may be viewed in the following areas:-

- (i) Convergence with the National Disease Control Programmes
- (ii) Convergence with other departments of Ministry of Health and Family Welfare
- (iii) Convergence with other Ministries

6. The main objective of convergence is to enhance the utilization of the system through provision of a common platform and availability of all services at one point. Convergence among wider determinants of health has been minimal thus far emphasizing the need for creating common institutional arrangements such that the same community organization, under the umbrella of urban local body, is responsible for all the wider determinants such as water, sanitation, nutrition, health care, education, skill development, housing, etc. Effective institutional mechanisms for convergence of urban primary health care services with other government run schemes responsible for health determinant is critical considering the

massive burden that the poor state of these determinants imposes on the health of our population. Therefore the mechanisms for convergence with health related non-medical services (water, sanitation, and waste-disposal) should be strengthened. For example, 4 lakh annual diarrhoeal deaths of children below 5 in the country are due to severe lack of sanitation facilities. World Malaria Report (2012) estimates that over 2.4 crore episodes occurred annually in India, again the chief reason in urban areas being poor sanitation and lack of behavioural change counselling.

Formation of committees at different levels

7. To ensure convergent actions of health and social determinants of health, the formation of common committee at City/State/District/ Ward level is very important. It needs to be ensured that the members of coordination committee expected to be formed at different levels - from National level to Ward level must include the Nodal Officers / Concerned Officials of the National Health Programme e.g. (IDSP/RNTCP etc). It is proposed that the members of Coordination Committee especially at district level must have access to all data related to health and social determinants of health for ensuring timely decision making.

The National Health Mission provides for an executive level headed by Chief Secretary as per the Gazette Notification on NUHM dated 26th June, 2013 which directs that at the City level the States may either decide to constitute a separate City Urban Health Mission/City Urban Health Society or use the existing structure of the District Health Society/Mission under NRHM, with additional stakeholder members. The notification also articulates the need for Urban Health Committee headed by the Municipal Commissioner/District Magistrate/Deputy Commissioner/District Collector/Sub-divisional Magistrate/Assistant Commissioner based on whether the city is a district headquarters or sub-divisional headquarter. This would help ensure better coordination with other related departments such as Women & Child Development, Water Supply & Sanitation etc as the administrative heads of these departments are the same officials.

Mechanisms of Convergence at different levels of implementation:

It is envisaged that three-tiered level of mechanisms can be put in place under NUHM, which are as under:

- a. Ward level committees including UPHC/UHC functionaries and community level workers;
- b. City level committees for planning, monitoring and reporting; and
- c. State level committees for planning, monitoring and provisioning

City Level Coordination Committee (CLCC)- to be constituted to address and resolve the day to day activities related to Health Department such as Water & Sanitation, Biomedical Waste Management, sewerage, involvement of frontline functionaries, etc.

Ward level Coordination Committee (WLCC)-Ward is the smallest administrative unit in a city and is recognized as the unit for planning and monitoring. Each ward is politically represented by the elected member (Ward Councillor) in Municipal Corporation. The key

departments like Department of Health and Family Welfare, Women and Child Development (WCD), Urban Development Department, Public Health Engineering Department (PHED) and other related departments also often respect the ward division and plan accordingly.

WLCC will serve as the nodal body for the planning and monitoring service delivery at the community level and effectively link the communities and may be utilized to address the health and other issues by involving the UPHC/UCHC functionary of the concerned area and also the community level workers, elected & other department representatives.

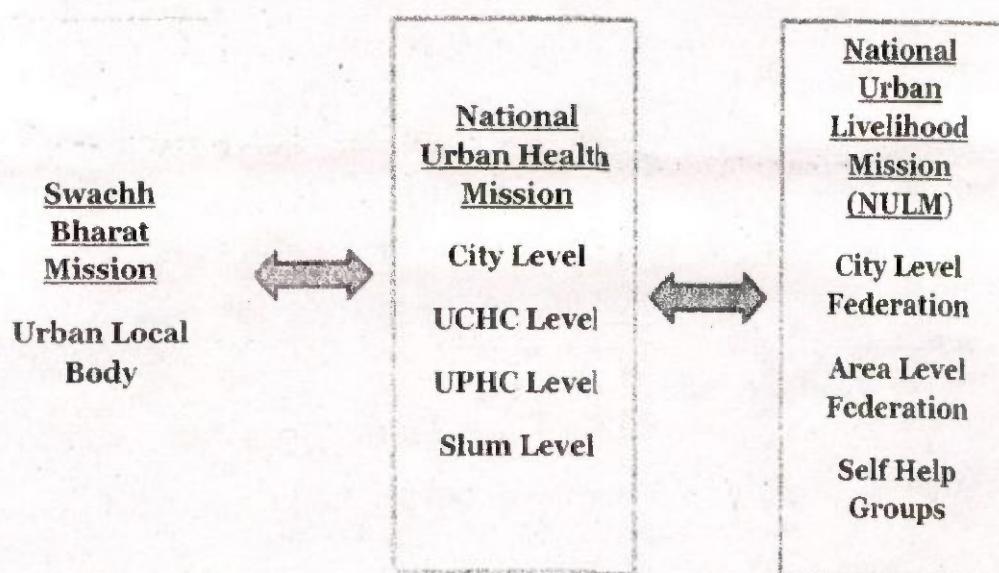
Convergence of activities among different departments under ULBs which are looking after the social determinants of health such as Water, Sanitation, Waste disposal, Food adulteration is essential to provide a quality holistic health care even if the ULBs are not implementing NUHM.

The convergence with these agencies/divisions of the health service providing agencies (ULBs/State Health Department) is another paradigm of coordinated activity.

Numbers of Missions are underway under the aegis of the Urban Development department whose activities have direct and indirect implication on the health care quality. It is now envisaged that a convergence model is to be planned to integrate the activities of these missions in order to leverage the performance and experiences of these missions. The foci of the Missions' activities are Swachhata (Cleanliness) and development of the urban poor. These parameters are complementary to the achievement of NUHM goals as health is intricately associated with cleanliness and socio-economic status of the population. Therefore we expect the proposed convergence model facilitates reaching NUHM goals in an accelerated manner.

8. Convergence Model

In this context, realizing the importance of wider determinants of health, NUHM seeks to adopt a convergent approach for interventions planned under the umbrella of SBM & NULM at the City/State/District/Ward level.



The model above would define the steps to be taken for various convergence activities at the City, District, UCHC and UPHC levels and also the rationalization of manpower and resources being deployed by the various Missions. This will impact the status of social determinants of health and maximize efficiency of all the Missions.

9. The synergy with different departments within/outside the health department i.e. intra-sectoral /inter-sectoral convergence plays a key role for rolling out of the convergence vehicle.

NUHM would aim to provide a system for convergence of all communicable and non communicable disease programmes at the city level through integrated planning - both annual and prospective, sharing of funds and human resources and joint monitoring and evaluation.

1. Convergence with the National Disease Control Programmes

All the disease control programs such as RNTCP, IDSP, NVBDCP, NPCDCS etc. are to be brought under the umbrella of City/District Health Plan so that preventive, promotive and curative aspects are well integrated at all levels.

Similarly, the NACP which ensures early detection of HIV/AIDS, effective surveillance and Universal HIV screening will be made an integral part of the ANC check-up. The health and nutrition days would be utilized for rapid blood tests and positive cases would be referred to ICTCs for confirmation. Counsellors, ANMs and ASHA/Link workers at the U-PHC would be trained for counseling on RTI, PPTCT, ANC, nutrition and spacing between births. The training for RTI and PPTCT counseling will be provided by the respective State AIDS Control Society. Testing kits should be made available at the Urban PHCs/CHCs by NACO. All HIV positive patients will be tested for T.B. and vice-versa.

- ✓ Initiatives under the RCH programme such as Intensive Diarrheal Control Fortnight (IDCF), National Deworming Day (NDD), WIFS, PMSMA etc. need to converge at the UPHC level to ensure health is addressed comprehensively. Similar convergence mechanisms can be developed for other initiatives through integrated plan and support of concerned officials.

The objective of convergence would be optimal utilization of resources (i.e. common pool for funds, human resources, consumables, infrastructure etc) and ensuring availability of all services at one point (U-PHC) thereby enhancing their utilization by

the urban population. The existing IDSP structure would be leveraged for improved surveillance

2. Convergence with other Ministries

At present NUHM is focusing on inter-sectoral convergence with Ministry of Urban Development/HUPA for the programmes (SBM & NULM) in improving the social determinants related to health (water, sanitation, food & nutrition etc), the following may be looked upon:

Convergence with SBM – Urban Local Body plays an important role in delivering urban development programmes at the city level. This is vital for SBM as well as the NUHM programmes. The convergence with SBM can be can be facilitated as per the following roadmap:

- ✓ Developing a micro-sanitation plan for each catchment area of UPHCs/ UCHCs (total population coverage) needs to be developed by ULBs. Correspondingly, the State Health Department will ensure adherence of quality guidelines of the micro-sanitation plan for the earmarked PHCs/CHCs. The ward office will coordinate with UPHCs and UCHCs so that sanitation and Open Defecation Free (ODF) areas in urban localities can be promoted.
- ✓ ASHA, ANMs, MOs and Directors (Municipal Administration) are to be involved in community triggering exercise by the ULBs especially near identified OD Spots to generate awareness about the oro-fecal transmission route and trigger demand for toilets among the communities. The triggering platforms may be utilized for dissemination of NUHM messages like immunization, ANC, Anaemia control and other related National Health Programmes
- ✓ Registration of health workers (ASHA/ANM/AWW) and members in Mahila Aarogya Samitis as Swachhagrahis for Health Promotion and dissemination of SBM related messages. Recognition of Swachhagrahis by giving non incentives items such as caps, T-shirt, sari, bags, badges etc.
- ✓ Incentives for Swachhagrahis (ASHA/ANM/AWW) as individual or group incentives.
- ✓ 1-2 days training under Swachh Bharat Mission for ensuring proper management of waste and maintenance of hygiene standards in public health facilities and on triggering techniques.
- ✓ Swachh Bharat Mission officials should also be involved in Quality Assurance assessment of UPHC/UCHC facilities at different levels by incorporating their membership in the committee.
- ✓ Dissemination to and utilization of collaterals which are available with the State Mission Directors of SBM at the UPHC/UCHC and slum levels.
- ✓ While implementing the IDCF and National Deworming Day initiative at the ward/district levels, support of the Swachh Bharat Mission can be sought through the

Swachhgrahis, common pool of funds, key health messages, declaration of ODF etc in the form of integrated plan of action.

Convergence with NULM

NULM can provide support in strengthening the community processes as well as improving the socio-economic status of the population which impacts the health in urban areas through convergence within its existing structures.

(DAY-NULM) envisages universal social mobilization of urban poor women in three tiered structure of Community Institutions viz. Self-Help Groups (SHGs), Area Level Federations (ALFs) and City Level Federations (CLFs). ALF provides handholding support to SHGs, facilitate SHG bank linkage, negotiate with higher level institutions for benefitting urban poor and facilitate member of SHGs in accessing benefits under various government programmes and schemes.

One time revolving fund of Rs. 10,000 for two years is provided to the SHGs and used for internal lending to its members. Registered ALF is provided with revolving fund of Rs. 50,000 per ALF for onward lending of its member SHGs.

The convergence with NULM can be strengthened in the following manner:

- ✓ Target population of both the programs viz NUHM and NULM is same in terms of community participation. It would thus be appropriate to develop linkages between Mahila Arogya Samities (MAS) under NUHM and Self -Help -Group (SHG)/Area Level Federations under DAY-NULM.
- ✓ The convergence of ALF and MAS could be made in such a way that the Chairperson for both of the committees (MAS & ALFs) is common. The list of MAS state-wise under NUHM has been shared with NULM.
- ✓ Three strategies which can be adopted for better linkages between MAS and ALF depending on the level of implementation in the States/Towns.

Option 1: Cities/States, where ALF exists but MAS is not formed

- A subcommittee of 10-12 representatives from existing ALFs can be identified as MAS.

Option 2: Cities/ States where both ALF and MAS exist

- MAS members can be included into SHGs and further be included in ALF.

Option 3: Cities/States where MAS is formed but ALF doesn't exist

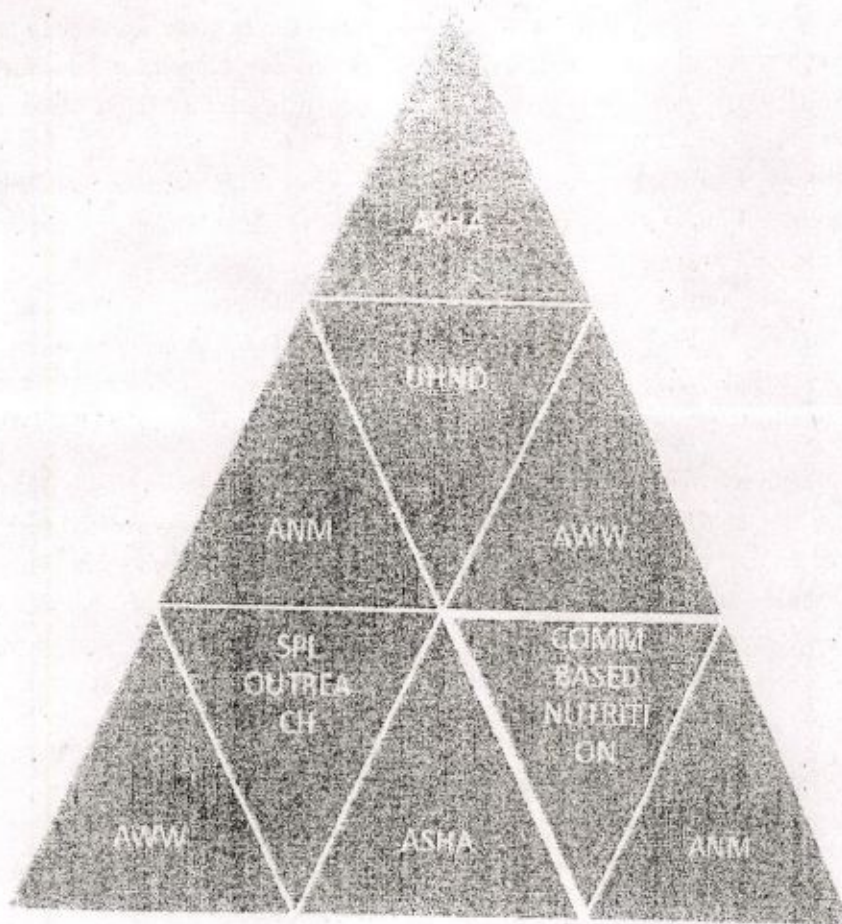
- MAS members who are not part of SHGs will be encouraged to join existing SHGs and will further be represented in ALFs.

- ✓ ALFs will support all community process activities under NUHM through MAS including preparation of plan as per the needs of urban poor and mobilization of community to increase access to health related schemes. ALFs can also facilitate

identification of ASHA as per guidelines of MoHFW where they have not been identified.

- ✓ Once the MAS members will come into SHGs/ALFs, they may avail the benefit of revolving funds and bank linkage and get skill training under DAY-NULM.
- ✓ SHGs along with MAS can mobilize the population to access outreach programs and generate health awareness including for UHND, Immunization drive, health melas among others.
- ✓ Joint Monitoring of health services at community level by ALF/MAS.
- ✓ Vulnerability mapping of slum/urban areas; data sharing between both the programmes; updating; and developing common consensus.
- ✓ NULM can play key role by rendering unused structures/ Shelters for homeless/ City Livelihood Centers for NUHM programme to address lack of infrastructure facilities in urban areas for conduction.of UHND, Special Outreach session, for functioning of UPHC where land availability is difficult.
- ✓ NULM conducts regular surveys of street dwellers and provides them with support through night shelters. Since the street dwellers are one of the vulnerable groups that NUHM caters to, the NULM survey data can help ANMs and ASHAs target this population better. This population group can also be targeted at the night shelter level by developing an appropriate mechanism like UHND, Special Outreach session etc.
- ✓ In addition to the above, States/UTs may develop their own mechanism of convergence between these committees based on local needs.

Convergence with Women & Child Development Department(WCD)

There is a close relation between the activities of ICDS and NUHM as in most States/UTs, the NUHM outreach activities i.e. UHND and special outreach sessions take place at the AWC. A service delivery mechanism by involving ASHA-ANM & AWW (3 A's) is being envisaged. Hence a convergence mechanism is to be planned on the same line.

Actionable Points

Therefore the following actionable points are suggested to strengthen convergence to accelerate the achievement of urban health goals:

Identify state, district, city and ward level institutional mechanisms for coordinating and converging with relevant stakeholders in urban health and development.

- ✓ Develop terms of reference for the committees to ensure convergent activities are planned, implemented and monitored effectively.
- ✓ Ensure the integration of all national health programmes, specific initiatives and state health programmes at the UPHC level.

- ✓ Convergence with SBM for developing micro-sanitation plan for urban health facilities with focus on ODF, trigger demand for toilets by community, involvement of health workers as Swachhagrahis, proper solid waste management disposal, proposal for incentives for Swachhagrahis.
- ✓ Convergence with NULM for strengthening of community processes at slum level, vulnerability mapping, joint monitoring of health services, support for infrastructure needs, UHND, Special Outreach session through ICDS infrastructure wherever applicable.
- ✓ Community based monitoring of nutritional status of vulnerable children in convergence with NUHM/NHM. The linkage with NRC and similar structure under NHM are to be maintained.
- ✓ Develop mechanisms to use NULM data on street dwellers and develop outreach actions at the NULM night shelters improve access of health to the most vulnerable homeless population.
- ✓ Any state specific convergence area.

The success of convergent action would depend on the quality of the Public Health Planning process. The City/State/District Health Action Plans should reflect integrated action in all section that determine good health – drinking water, sanitation, women's empowerment, adolescent health, education, female literacy, etc. At the time of appraisal of City/State/District Health Plan, care should be taken to ensure that the entire range of wider determinants of health have been addressed through the convergent action approach.

Convergence is aimed at improving the effectiveness and efficiency of all national health programmes. Thus promoting inter-sectoral convergence for promotive and preventive health care is of prime importance.

Perspective of the Health Department

1. Why is convergence important under the National Urban Health Mission?

Convergence is one of the main core strategies under the NUHM. Monitoring of the programme reveals that the platform of NUHM requires integration and coordination of health and health related social determinants in order to provide a equitable, easily accessible, quality primary health care which includes preventive, promotive and curative health services deliverable to the target population i.e. the vulnerable urban population mainly slum dwellers. Therefore convergence will help to enhance the utilization of the system through provision of a common platform and availability of all services at one point. Convergence among wider determinants of health has been minimal thus far emphasizing the need for creating common institutional arrangements so that the same community organization, under the umbrella of urban local body, is responsible for all the wider determinants such as water, sanitation, nutrition, health care, education, skill development, housing, etc.

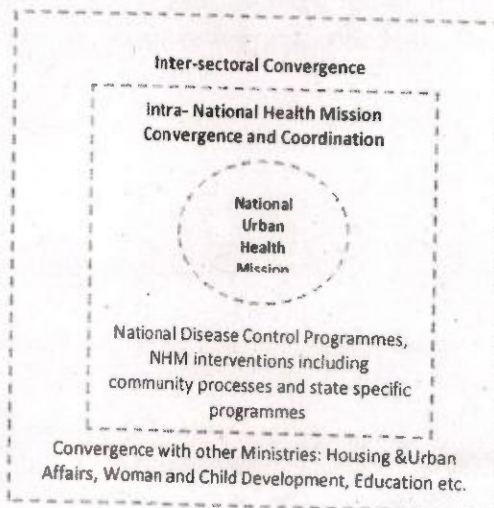
2. What is the scope of convergence under the National Urban Health Mission?

The synergy with different departments within/outside the health department, in other words intra-NHM and inter-sectoral convergence plays a key role for rolling out of the convergence vehicle.

Convergences may be viewed in the following areas:-

- Convergence with other Ministries
- Convergence with other departments and efforts of the National Health Mission of Ministry of Health and Family Welfare
- Convergence with the National Disease Control Programmes

The objective of convergence would be optimal utilization of resources (common pool for funds, human resources, consumables, infrastructure etc) and ensuring availability of all services at one point (U-PHC) thereby enhancing their utilization by the urban population. For example "The Red Ribbon Express project of National AIDS Control Organization presents one successful model of partnership comprising of Government (Ministries of Railways, Social Welfare, AIDS Control Organization) and Non-Governmental stakeholders and intergovernmental bodies".



3. What Convergence can be applied within National Health Mission?

Convergence as an administrative process which facilitates different Divisions / Units within the Department can be applied to work in synergy e.g. Health Department. All programmes such as

1. Disease control programs (RNTCP, IDSP, NVBDCP, NPCDCS, NACP etc) among others must be brought under the umbrella of City/District Health Plan so that preventive, promotive and curative aspects are well integrated at all levels.
2. Initiatives under the RCH programme such as Intensive Diarrheal Control Fortnight (IDCF), National Deworming Day (NDD), Weekly Iron Fortification Supplementation (WIFS), Pradhan Mantri Surakshit Matritva Abhiyan (PMSMA) and others need to converge at the UPHC level to ensure health is addressed comprehensively.
3. Regular Intra-NHM meetings need to be institutionalized. The existing different program heads should be responsible for implementing the different program related activities with respect to NUHM concurrently with NHM programs.

6. What are the envisaged roles for the Urban Local Body under the NUHM?

The 74th Constitutional Amendment Act (1993) lays down the provisions for the devolution of funds, functions and functionaries to enable Urban Local Bodies (ULBs) to perform their duties. The Model Municipal Law (MML) provides guidance to states towards implementation of the provisions under the 74th CAA. The MML classifies municipal functions into three categories - core, additional and other functions. Community health, curative health and health and sanitation are listed under these categories of functions.

Primary core functions are provision of safe drinking water, environmental sanitation, air pollution, licensing of butchers and slaughterhouses and preventive vector control. Among the larger ULBs with further devolution curative care at primary, secondary and tertiary levels are also among the primary functions. There has been an expansion of roles being performed by the Municipal Health teams under NUHM. The municipal health teams in some cities are participating in carrying out health assessment; developing city health plans; and in many cities supporting the identification of infrastructure for health facilities as well as monitoring the implementation of the program.

Envisaged Roles of the ULB

- Support to situational analysis of urban health;
- Participation in city health planning in terms of infrastructure and human resources; Rationalization of health facilities;
- Co-ordination and support TO CPMU/DPMU.
- Joint monitoring of program implementation;
- Identification of land, its acquisition, or allocation for health facilities;
- Provision of budgets for contractual human resources, if the city plan demands for additional centres which are not approved under the NUHM;
- Provision of budgets for medicines from ULB budget;
- Epidemic planning and management;
- Coordinated management of water contamination episodes;
- Execution of its core functions of solid waste management and preventive vector control; and
- Implementation of urban development programs/schemes in coordination with NUHM to better target the vulnerable

7. What are the proposed institutional mechanisms for convergence at each level?

To ensure convergent actions of health and social determinants of health, the formation of common committee at City/State/District/ Ward level is very important. It needs to be ensured that the members of coordination committee expected to be formed at different levels - from National level to Ward level must include the Nodal Officers / Concerned Officials of the National Health Programme e.g. (IDSP/RNTCP etc).

The 3 tier system which can be followed are as follows:

- ✓ WARD LEVEL-Ward Level Coordination Committee
- ✓ CITY LEVEL- City Level Coordination Committee
- ✓ STATE LEVEL-State Level Committee

In six mega city corporations the above three tiered mechanism for convergence is followed.

The above committees are expected to facilitate convergent planning and implementation with ULBs and other critical stakeholders. This coordination is to be delivered through the platform of the district health societies in smaller towns. Various inter-sectoral convergence structures currently exist in different forms at the city, and ward levels either as a part of the Urban Local Bodies administrative structure or through national programmes such as Swacch Bharat Mission.

In addition to the committees it will be important to establish working groups of key functionaries involved in operational activities. These working groups could meet more frequently than the committees.

8. What are the existing platforms under various programmes that can be leveraged at each level for constituting the committees?

9. Is there any existing examples of Convergence in States /UTs, if yes, provide details?

Some Examples of Existing Convergence Structures in States/UTs are as follows:

- Ward Kalyan Samitis (ward welfare committees) were established in Chattisgarh under the Mukhya Mantri Shahari Swasth Karyakram and Odisha under HUP program. They are composed of representatives of health, ULB, ICDS, schools and elected officials
- Formalized platform in West Bengal at UHC, ward and higher levels with structured interactions; Presence of SUDA structures at all levels.
- Mandated interaction of the NGO managed UHCs in Telangana with other stakeholders; leveraging MEPMA for strengthening community processes
- Ward level multi-sectoral committees which are addressing health and beyond.
- Informal ward level groups in Madhya Pradesh, leverage existing ICDS ward level nutrition committees and SJSRY neighbourhood committees
- Informal coordination of UPHCs in Mysuru, Karnataka with elected officials

10. What are the suggested objectives, functions and composition of the State Level Committee?

The State Level Committee is envisaged as a multi-sectoral platform for ensuring various urban stakeholders to be involved in planning and executing all policies, programmes and schemes which target the urban poor with a coordinated approach. The objectives of establishing a state level committee are:

- Provide a forum for convergence of state level stakeholders for the delivery of Urban Health and WASH services to the urban poor.
- Serve as nodal body for planning and monitoring of Urban Health and WASH service delivery to the urban poor.
- Provide a forum for identifying gaps and convergent solutions, and innovations to address the Urban Health and WASH service delivery to the urban poor.

11. What are the suggested objectives, functions and composition of District/City Level Committees?

The City Coordination Committee is envisaged as an Apex Body at city level for the convergence of various stakeholders involved in the delivery of urban health and Water, Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH) services to the urban poor which will function with the following objectives:

- Provide a forum for convergence of city level stakeholders for the delivery of Urban Health and WASH services to urban poor.

- Serve as the nodal body for the planning and monitoring of Urban Health and WASH service delivery to the urban poor.
- Provide a forum for exploring, reviewing and approving Public-Private Partnership initiatives and innovations to address the gaps in Urban Health and WASH service delivery to the urban poor.

12. What are the suggested objectives, functions and composition of Ward Level Committees?

The urban wards are cohesive units in the otherwise disparate cities. They form the node for convergence of all developmental programs. It establishes linkage between service provider and community by virtue of their rights through policy level influence for decision making. The 74th Amendment of the Constitution (1992) emphasizes the Constitution of Wards Committees in all municipalities with a population of 3 lakhs or more. The Ward Level Coordination Committees may either be established formally or other similar structures such as the Ward Sanitation Committees of the Swachh Bharat Mission or ULB ward committees may be leveraged as ward committees for health as well. They are expected to serve as the nodal body for the planning and monitoring service delivery at the community level and effectively link the communities with all relevant services which impact health and its social determinants.

Objectives

- Provide a forum for convergence of ward level stakeholders for the delivery of Urban Health and WASH services to the urban poor.
- Serve as the nodal body for the planning and monitoring of Urban Health and WASH service delivery to the urban poor.
- Provide a forum for reviewing implementation of multi-sectoral health and WASH activities targeted towards the urban poor.

Proposed Functions

The Ward Coordination Committee will perform the following functions:

1) Planning

- a. Devise a monthly and quarterly convergence plan with all relevant stakeholders and display for general information.
- b. Develop and formally approve a micro plan for effective delivery of envisaged services in their designated area.
- c. Assign fixed responsibilities to representatives of different departments and other stakeholders for improving health status and living conditions of the urban poor.
- d. Mobilize existing resources from the member departments/ organizations for joint activities as per micro plan.
- e. Utilize community structures such SHGs /ALFs formed under DAY-NULM, DUDA etc for promotion of behaviours related to health and health determinants.
- f. Utilize the provisions under SBM to advocate with the local authorities for construction of community based health centres, community toilets), storm water drains, desalination plants, sewerage, drainage and disposal system in their area.

2) Monitoring and review

- a. Monitor the quality of services health nutrition & WASH services in their area.
- b. Monitor every month progress based on fixed indicators, as decided by the committee, with appropriate feedback to representatives of concerned departments.
- c. Conduct quarterly review meetings with analysis of progress made versus the plan and recommendations for mid-course corrections if necessary.

3) Fostering partnerships

- a. Explore partnerships with private service providers for delivery of outreach health care services in urban slums.
- b. Explore opportunities for resource leverage for urban health and health determinant issues with charitable organizations, trusts, NGOs, CBOs, Social clubs like Rotary etc.

4) Knowledge and communication

- a. Provide platform for sharing the information on various government schemes and entitlements with the community.
- b. Dissemination of the minutes of meeting to community with proposed outcome in the month.
- c. Discussion on the community issues raised by community with the Ward Councilor.

13. What are the budgetary provisions for implementing convergent actions?

The following Line items under each programme and the ULBs can be leveraged to carry out convergent actions:

- Administrative costs (meetings, workshops, exposure visits etc)
- Training costs
- Joint IEC/BCC activities
- Untied Fund for MAS

Perspective of the Urban Local Bodies (ULB) and Other Stakeholders

1. Why is it important for the ULB to establish convergence with the National Urban Health Mission?

The 74th Constitutional Amendment Act (74 CAA) enacted in 1993, contains the Twelfth Schedule of municipal functions which are 18 in number. The Act (74 CAA) has transferred the management of health care facilities in urban areas to Urban Local Bodies (ULB) since then. However the capacity of the ULB to lead, plan and manage Urban Health Programme is not only limited in most cases but varies from state to state.

While health may not be perceived as a core function by the ULBs, the impact of ill health on urban development is immense. Therefore by coordinating and converging with the NUHM the ULBs stand to ensure that the urban developmental activities meet with success as well as optimal solutions are identified to ensure productive populations, especially in resource poor contexts.

2. What are the traditional health roles of the ULB?

The Model Municipal Law (MML) circulated by Ministry of Urban Development provides guidance to states towards implementation of the provisions under the 74th CAA. The MML classifies municipal functions into three categories, namely 'core', 'additional' and 'other' functions.

'Community health', a role listed under the 'core' functions of an ULB, is defined as follows:

- Inspection, supervision, regulation, and control of premises to ensure proper environmental sanitation
- Regulation of public bathing and washing
- Provision and maintenance of public conveniences
- Licensing of animals and control of stray animals
- Licensing of butchers and slaughterhouses
- Control of nuisances (which includes prevention of transporting pollutants, burial of corpses in unauthorized locations, sound and air pollution)

Provision of curative care which is listed under 'additional' roles (as assigned by the state government) is self-explanatory. 'Health and sanitation' which is listed under 'other' functions entails the following:

- Mass inoculation campaigns for eradication of infectious diseases
- Construction and maintenance of slaughterhouses and their regulation
- Reclamation of unhealthy localities, removal of noxious vegetation and abatement of all nuisances

- Maintenance of all public tanks and regulating the re-excavation, repair and up-keep of all private tanks, wells and other sources of water-supply
- Advancement of civic consciousness of public health and general welfare by organizing discourses, seminars and conferences
- Measures for eradication of addiction of all kinds including addiction to drugs and liquor

The eighteen areas of participation for ULBs under the 74th CAA may or may not lie with the ULBs depending on the state level policies.

3. What is the envisaged role of the ULB under the Convergence Plan?

NUHM framework envisages that the Urban Local Bodies (ULB) will implement NUHM in the seven mega cities, namely Delhi, Mumbai, Kolkata, Chennai, Bengaluru, Hyderabad and Ahmedabad. For the remaining cities, health department would be the primary implementation agency for NUHM. However, for cities/towns where capacity exists with the ULBs, the states have the flexibility to hand over the management of the NUHM to the ULBs.

The States / UTs need to guide the ULBs on NUHM Convergence Plan there by strengthening their service delivery system.

4. What are the institutional mechanisms for coordinating with the health department?

In Six Mega City Corporations the three tiered mechanism for convergence are as follows:

The 3 tier system which can be followed are as follows:

- ✓ WARD LEVEL-Ward Level Coordination Committee
- ✓ CITY LEVEL- City Level Coordination Committee
- ✓ STATE LEVEL-State Level Committee

The establishment of institutional mechanisms under the NUHM, such as state and city level committees, is expected to facilitate convergent planning and implementation with ULBs and other critical stakeholders. This coordination is to be delivered through the platform of the district health societies in smaller towns. Various inter-sectoral convergence structures currently exist in different forms at the city, and ward levels either as a part of the Urban Local Bodies administrative structure or through national programmes such as Swachh Bharat Mission.

In addition to the committees it will be important to establish working groups of key functionaries involved in operational activities. These working groups could meet more frequently than the committees.

Please refer to the FAQs on state, city and ward level committees for further information on objectives, functions and composition of each committee.

5. How can community processes under the Housing & Urban Affairs and health programs converge to create enhanced community actions?

While Urban Development programmes such as the DAY-NULM have building institutions such as the self help groups and slum level federations at the community level, the NUHM is mandated to establish a Mahila Aarogya Samiti for every 50 – 100 households in slums and among vulnerable communities.

The SHGs are provided with financial linkages, livelihood opportunities, skill training under the DAY-NULM to partner with local self governments, public service providers, banks, private sector and other mainstream institutions to facilitate delivery of social and economical services to poor. Similarly under Swachh Bharat Mission all the frontline health workers at community level will be "Swachagrahis" delivering services.

In addition the ICDS functionary – Anganwadi worker (AWW) and the Accredited Social Health Activist (ASHA) of the NUHM are also providing preventive and promotive nutrition and health services to the vulnerable groups. Coordinated and convergent actions of these community based structures have the potential of exponentially increasing the magnitude of outcomes that can be achieved by the urban development and health programmes alike.

6. What is the role that can be played by the elected representatives?

Through D.O. letters dated 19th Nov,2016, the Joint Secretary (NUHM) has written to Mayors across the country seeking their support in strengthening NUHM in their respective cities. As the elected leaders of their cities the Mayors and Chairpersons can ensure convergence of urban development and health activities through policy decisions at the level of the City Councils.

The suggested common roles for the Mayors/Chairpersons, Municipal Councilors/Corporators, Ward Councilors/Corporators are as follows:

- Review the implementation of NUHM activities
- Facilitate inter-sectoral resolution of identified problems
- Visit facilities and review the provision and quality of services
- Advocate for utilization of health services from the urban facilities among the communities
- Advocate for promotion of positive behaviors of Water, Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH), open defecation free communities and collective community actions

Beside the above the other suggested roles are also follows:

Suggested Roles for the Mayors/Chairpersons

- Chair the City level multi-sectoral Coordination Committees
- Review the financial information, including allocation and utilization of funds received by Municipal Corporations and Municipalities from NUHM
- Ensure allocation of municipal budgets to bridge financial gaps to implement identified health interventions
- Encourage the development of multi-sectoral city health plans

Suggested Roles for the Municipal Councilors/Corporators

- Review the implementation of NUHM activities in their areas
- Support the identification of specific health issues and their inclusion in the multi-sectoral city health plans

Suggested Roles for the Ward councilors/Corporators

- Chair the Ward level multi-sectoral Coordination Committees
- Review the implementation of NUHM activities
- Review the support being provided to the ASHAs, including incentives and supervision
- Review the implementation of school health and ICDS activities
- Review the implementation of SBM, water stagnation, solid waste and water quality issues
- Represent ward level health issues at the city council meetings and facilitate allocation of municipal budgets to bridge financial gaps to implement identified health interventions
- Ensure Ward level issues are represented in the multi-sectoral city health plan

Note: *May vary depending on the ground reality of the States/UTs.*

7. What are the budgetary provisions for implementing convergent actions?

The following Line items under each programme and the ULBs can be leveraged to carry out convergent actions:

- Administrative costs (meetings, workshops, exposure visits etc)
- Training costs
- Joint IEC/BCC activities
- Untied Fund for MAS





Sub: Guidelines for Training of Existing HHWs / Urban ASHAs

Sir/Madam,

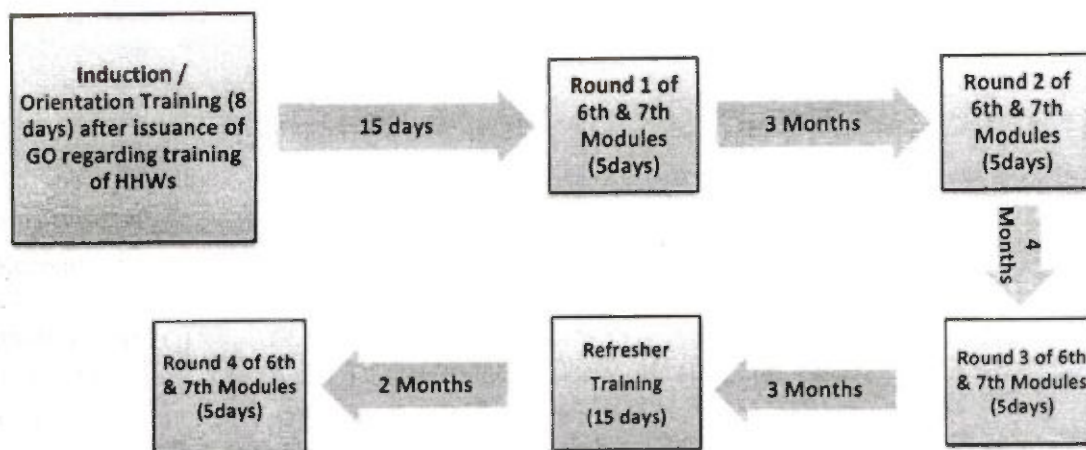
It has already been decided and communicated by this Department that the existing Community Health Worker (CHW), such as First Tier Supervisor (FTS) and Honorary Health Worker (HHW), engaged under various schemes in the 88 ULBs (approved under NUHM) will continue to function under NUHM framework. It was also communicated that the existing HHWs in the 88 ULBs (approved under NUHM) are being utilized against the sanctioned number of ASHAs under NUHM vide Memo No. HFWINUHM/553/2015/2903 dated 15.09.2016. New ASHA will also be recruited where the number of existing HHW is less than the sanctioned number of ASHA under NUHM. FTS will supervise the activities of HHW/ ASHA and the activities of MAS under NUHM.

As per framework of Govt. of India, Urban ASHAs will undergo several rounds of training which capacitate them to provide the healthcare services in the community. The same training

will be applicable for the existing Honorary Health Workers (HHWs) and First Tier Supervisors (FTSs).

Keeping the above into account, it may be noted that the State level TOT for the State Trainers had been completed. And the batch-wise District level TOT has been started from 29.06.17 at CINI STC with DTs of all districts vide Memo No. HFW/NUHM-468/2016/1075 dated 27.6.2017. After completion of TOT of the respective districts, the ULBs will be intimated regarding the training dates of the existing HHWs and FTSs.

After several discussions, it has been decided that the HHWs, new Urban ASHAs and FTSs, to be eligible in performing incentivized activities under NHM, have to undergo the following trainings:



Training Strategy (vide Memo No. HFW/NUHM-468/2016/1075 dated 27.6.2017):

The existing training structure available for the rural ASHAs will be utilized for training of FTS/HHWs/New Urban ASHAs. The strategy for Induction Training will be as follows:

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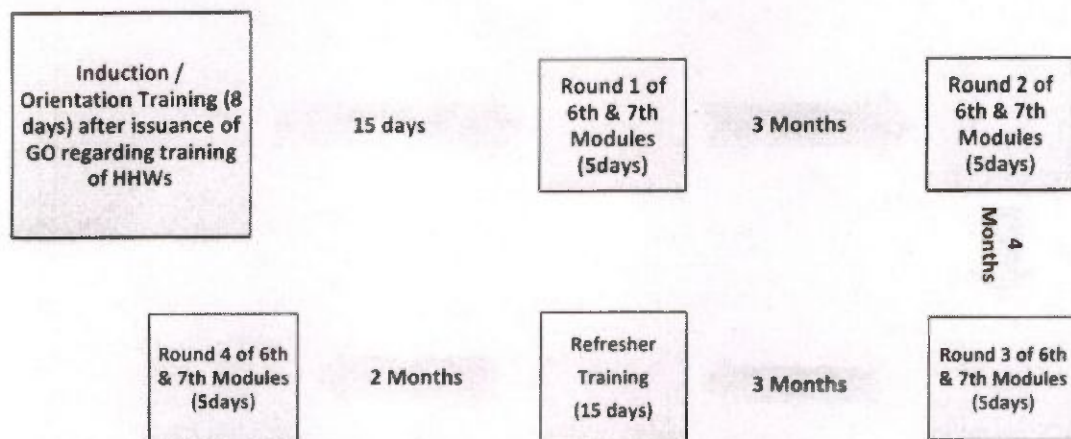

MEMORANDUM

Subject : Grant of Ad-hoc Bonus to the State Government Employees and some other categories of Employees for the year 2016-2017.

The undersigned is directed by order of the Governor to say that the Governor is pleased to decide that the State Government employees who are not covered by any of the productivity linked Bonus Scheme and whose revised emoluments did not exceed Rs.26,000/- per month as on 31st March, 2017 will be entitled to ad-hoc bonus for the accounting year 2016-2017 at the rate of Rs. 3,600/- per head. The upper eligibility ceiling of Rs.26,000/- p.m. as on 31st March, 2017 will be applicable irrespective of whether the emoluments are drawn in the pre-revised or revised scale of pay or on fixed/consolidated contract pay.

2. The benefit will be admissible subject to the following terms and conditions:-

i. Ad-hoc Bonus admissible under this order will be worked out on the basis of emoluments as admissible on 31.03.2017. For the employees drawing pay and allowances in terms of the West Bengal Services (Revision of Pay and Allowances) Rules, 2009 the term 'revised emoluments' in this order will mean and include pay in the pay band plus the grade pay in the revised pay structure and includes the non-practicing allowance, if any, Dearness Allowances, but will not include any other pay and other allowance such as house rent allowance, medical allowance, compensatory allowances, etc.

For those who are drawing pay and allowances in the un-revised scale, the term 'emoluments' will mean and include basic pay, personal pay, special pay (additional remuneration), dearness pay, dearness allowance, deputation (duty) allowance, Steno Allowance but will not include specialist pay and other allowances such as house rent allowance, medical allowance, compensatory allowance, etc. For those who are drawing remuneration on contract basis, the term 'revised emoluments' will mean the consolidated contract pay drawn by them.

ii. The employees whose revised emoluments on 31.03.2017 exceeded Rs.26,000/- p.m. but during the year 2016-2017 their emoluments for at least for six months were less than Rs.26,000/- p.m. i.e. the said emoluments exceeded the eligibility ceiling of Rs.26,000/- p.m. on account of promotion, drawal of increment, implementation of C.A. Scheme, enhancement of dearness allowance etc. after remaining less than Rs. 26,000/- p.m. for at least six months, will be entitled to ad-hoc bonus of Rs 3,600/- per head under this order.

iii. The employees who were in service on 31.03.2017 and rendered at least six months continuous service during the year 2016-2017 will be eligible for payment of ad-hoc bonus under this order. Pro-rata payment will be admissible in such cases to the eligible employees for periods of continuous service during the year ranging from six months to full year, the eligibility period being taken in terms of number of months of service (rounded off to the nearest number of months). A fraction of 15 days or more should be counted as one month.

- iv. The amount of ad-hoc bonus on pro-rata payment as admissible under Para 2(iii) above will have to be calculated according to the following formula :-

$$\text{Emoluments as on 31st March, 2017.} \quad \times \quad \frac{\text{Eligibility period in number of months}}{12}$$

= The amount of ad-hoc bonus, subject to maximum amount of Rs.3,600/- only.

- v. The casual workers who have put in work at least for 120 days and the employees on consolidated pay in the year 2016-2017 will also be entitled to ad-hoc bonus under this order according to the following formula :-

$$\frac{\text{Total amount of salary/wages earned during the year 2016-2017}}{12}$$

= The amount of ad-hoc bonus, subject to maximum amount of Rs. 3,600/- only.

The salary/wages in these cases should have the same meaning as 'revised emoluments' as defined in Para 2(i) above.

3. **The disbursement of Ad-hoc Bonus sanctioned hereinabove should be made in case of Muslim State Government employees by 19th June, 2017 and in case of other State Government employees (other than Muslim State Government employees) such disbursement should be made in between 11th September, 2017 to 18th September, 2017.**

In case of failure, the disbursement should be made as early as possible before the festival of Durga Puja/Id-Ul-Fitre.

4. The charge in respect of payment of ad-hoc bonus under this order will be debitable to the detailed head viz., "Ad-hoc Bonus" the opening of which was sanctioned under the 'Salary' head subordinate to all Major, Minor and sub-heads in the Revenue Expenditure section of the State Budget in terms of Para 9 of this Department's Order No. 4611-F, dated 22.04.1988 and necessary fund for this purpose have been provided under the above detailed heads in the budget grant available for 2017-2018.

5. The Governor is further pleased to direct that the benefit of ad-hoc bonus sanctioned under this order will also be available to the different categories of employees who had been allowed the same in the last year in accordance with Finance Department's Memo No.3141 -F(P₂) Dated- 13-06-2016 by issue of Government Orders by various Departments in this connection. As in the last year, orders for grant of ad-hoc bonus in respect of the employees of Statutory Bodies/Local Bodies/State aided Non-Government Educational Institutions and such other categories of employees of various establishments, who were allowed ad-hoc bonus/ex-gratia at par with the State Government employees or at a rate not more than the rate as approved by the Government in the last year, should be issued by the Departments concerned without referring the file to Finance Department, Group 'P₂'.

6. Clarifications issued in previous years in respect of various points raised in connection with admissibility and drawal of ad-hoc bonus would continue to apply.

Dear Colleague,

We are writing to you with regard to the convergence plan between National Urban Health Mission (NUHM), Swachh Bharat Mission (SBM) and National Urban Livelihood Mission (NULM) to develop a holistic environment covering health, sanitation and livelihood. As we are aware that NUHM works towards providing equitable and quality primary health care services to urban population with special focus on slum and vulnerable population, an integrated approach is needed involving all the stakeholders to address the social determinants for good health with convergence of ideas and co-ordination between activities as the key philosophy with support from SBM whose prime focus is on elimination of open defecation & generation of awareness about sanitation and its linkage with public health and NULM whose strategy is to reduce poverty & vulnerability of the urban poor by enabling them to access gainful self-employment & skilled wage employment opportunities, resulting in a sustainable significant improvement in their livelihoods, through building strong grass root level institutions for them.

There is a paradigm shift in the National Health Policy (2017) which emphasizes also on the importance of achieving convergence among wider determinants of health and improving the environment for health. It is now imperative that we join hands and utilize this opportunity to address the root causes of ill health by providing quality primary healthcare services with prime focus on access to safe water and sanitation to all and an enabling environment for sustainable livelihood. The main objective of convergence is to enhance the utilization of the system through provision of a common platform and availability of all services at one point. In this regard, please recall the Joint Video Conference held with HUPA, MoUD and NUHM on 3rd Feb, 2017 where all the states/UTs shared their areas of activities for urban health and expressed their commitment to work in collaboration for better urban health outcomes.

Keeping the above in view, some key action points for joint implementation of urban health initiatives are planned as follows:

1. State initiative to develop a road map in consultation with their counterparts in the state on convergence activities under NULM, SBM and NUHM with regular state level reviews at the Urban Local Bodies and State Health Departments.
2. Formation of Common Coordination Committee(CCC) at state, district, city and ward level to implement convergence through proper planning, activity and monitoring.
3. Sanitation drives with focus on importance of sanitation in areas around the urban health facilities and in accordance to the SBM norms for every fifty thousand population covered by the facility involving the urban health mechanism.


4. Involvement of all the community level workers like Mahila Arogya Samiti, Self Help Groups, Area Level Federation, City Level Federation etc., through christening them as "Swachhagrahis" through adequate capacity development and training (MEPMA model).
5. Leveraging these community level groups through social entrepreneurship by incentivizing them to participate actively in improving not only sanitation in area but also improvement in resultant health indicators.
6. Utilization of NULM infrastructure like night shelters & city livelihood centres and also community SBM infrastructure to provide community level health care like outreach services; utilization of NUHM-SBM combined triggering platform for sustained behavioral change counseling.


The way forward for this convergence mechanism has been envisaged as under:


1. Joint Meetings with the stakeholders (NUHM, NULM, SBM) at the state and sub-state level.
2. Formation of CCC at state and sub-state level.
3. Formation of Swachhagrahis involving members from ASHA, MAS, ALF, CLF and other self help groups.
4. Identification of infrastructure for use across all three programmes (e.g. NULM-SUH/CLC).
5. Triggering Platform for health education.
6. Training and Capacity Building through development of a common Training Module.
7. Development of IT based mechanism for real time data transfer and training/capacity building at every level.
8. Development of Monitoring Indicators-processing indicators, impact indicators, outcome indicators etc.

In addition to the above, States/UTs may develop their own mechanism of convergence between these committees based on local needs. The success of convergent action would depend largely on all the stakeholders who would come and work together for the benefit of vulnerable and poor people in urban areas so as to achieve common goal of a healthy and improved urban life within the framework of guidelines/instructions of respective schemes.

Proceedings of the meeting on different development activities of Municipalities of Purba Bardhaman, held on 09.06.2017 at 1.00 pm at DM Conference Hall, Court Compound, Purba Bardhaman in presence of Hon'ble DM, Purba Bardhaman, Sumita Bagchi, Jt Secretary of UD & MA Depdt, Sri B.N.Kar, Addl state Mission Director & Jt Secretary of UD & MA Depdt, Sri Ashok Das Addl Director, SUDA, ADM(Edu), All SDOs, All Chairmans & EOs of ULBs, Executive Engineer MED, Burdwan Division, & Dy CMOH-1, Purba Bardhaman.

Meeting started with the Hon'ble District Magistrate Purba Bardhaman on chair. State level officers were present in the meeting. At the out set, as desired by the District Magistrate. The Executive Engineer MED, Burdwan Division attending the meeting, has divulged the duties and responsibilities to be discharged by his fraternity on regular basis to uphold the development work of Municipalities. He also placed a write up detailing there in such duties and responsibilities. Hon'ble District Magistrate asked to deliver a copy of the said write up to every invitee of the meeting along with the resolution (Enclosed the Write up of Executive Engineer MED, Burdwan Division, Purba Bardhaman).

There after elaborate discussions were held upon the all development issues including Health (NUHM), ICDS, MNB & Beautification, Samobyathi, Housing for all (Urban), NFBs, NULM, NSAP, SLWM and Implementation of Green City Mission of Municipalities. Following such discussions, dicisions have been made accordingly and these are illustrated below categorically.

A) Health (NUHM) - Dy CMOH-1 Purba Bardhaman stated that most of UPHCs (6 nos uphcs in Budwan, 2 nos uphcs in Katwa and 1 no uphc in Kalna ULB) are running in shortage of MO, Pharmacist, Nurse and staff. There is no MO in Kalna UPHC. The chairman Kalna has taken initiative to run the Urban PHC with specialist; which was considered to be a model, to be followed by others. Same was expected from Burdwan and Katwa Municipality. Engagement of others para medical staff and part time & full time MO under NUHM should be done locally by ULBs. Problems in formation of the **Mahila Arogyo Samiti (MAS)** at Burdwan, Katwa U.L.Bs were discussed in detail. It was suggested by SUDA Officials to involve the SHGs working already at vulnerable population area like Slum areas etc. They also suggested to continue **MAS activities** along with their other activities.

B) ICDS - The DPO, ICDS Purba Bardhaman stated that allotment for construction of 18 nos ICDS Centres (3 nos for Burdwan, 7 nos for Guskara and 3 nos for Dainhat Municipality) @ 5 Lakhs per ICDS centre has been given from BCW Department. Hon'ble District Magistrate asked to the Concerned Chairman of the said ULBs to contribute another Rs 2 Lakhs more for each ICDS Centre from their Own Fund, so that construction of said ICDS Centres can be better way at least to the standard of BALA model. DPO, ICDS Purba Bardhaman stated that a proposal has been sent to the chairman Memari Municipality for repairing of 24 nos ICDS centres in Memari ULB and requested to expedite the repairing work of said ICDS centres.

C) MNB (U) & Beautification

As most of the ULBs have not yet completed the Construction works of IHHLs (i.e. Kalna, Guskara, Katwa & Burdwan Municipality), they are asked to expedite the Completion of IHHLs Construction Work. It was also informed that there is no crunch of fund; provided UCs are submitted timely. Rest fund for construction of IHHLs of Memari & Katwa Municipality are to be released from this end at an early date. The D.M. Purba Bardhaman Administration has taken up the initiative to achieve the ODF Programme. All Municipalities to make the said programme grand success, Nazardari Committee is to be formed in each word for nazardari in morning and evening on regular basis to stop open defecation. Wastes of Hospitals are to be removed regularly by U.L.Bs.

D) SAMOBYATHI

As more nos beneficiaries can get opportunity of Samobyathi Prokalpa, The IEC Programme regarding Samobyathi prokalpa are to be done more in Urban area for wide publicities, through Rallies, Miking, Wall writtings, Leaflets, Flex & Festoons at public places of ULBS and Burial Ground & cremation Ghat.

More over, **total ban on Gutkha & Plastics materials below 50 micron** was decided to be imposed urgently. All SDOs were asked to raid frequently against Gutkha using. Collection of Garbages from door to door are being done by only few ULBs. It should be done by all ULBS.

E) It was reported that **SSKs** in the Municipalities are not getting **dress, Mid day meal** etc. DPO (SSM) and O/C, Mid day meal were requested to look into the matter.

F) More emphasis is to be given for proper implementation of **Housing for All (Urban) & NFBs and SLWM** schemes by ULBs.


G) All pension (**oldage, widow, disability**) under **NSAP (urban)** are to be released for each month timely.

H) **DAY NULM** works in ULBs are not satisfactory. More emphasis on DAY NULM Scheme is to be given by ULBs & Bankers for grant success. They are asked to plan & perform for achieving target of SHG formation and initiate grading of SHGs credit linkage with Banks. In this regard, a work shop regarding sensitization of Bank employees has already been called by Hon'ble Director of SUDA on 14.06.2017 at 11.00 am at Burdwan House (Panthasala), Burdwan. Hon'ble DM Purba Bardhaman was requested cordially to be remain present in said work shop.

I) **Implementation of Green city Mission** in U.LBs are to be done properly as per guide line of UD & MA Depdt, Nagarayan, DF-8, Sector-1, Saltlake, Kolkata-64 vide no-390-T & CP/c-2/1M-18/2017 dtd 20.02.2017 which have already been mailed from this end. Provided that **Construction of roads, Water supply scheme, Drainage related scheme, Construction of Office Building and procurement of office materials works** are strictly not permissible under Green City Mission.

As there was no other issue for discussion, the meeting ended with vote of thanks to and from the chair.

4. All the staffs engaged under UPHCS retire from their services after attending 60 years of age without any pension or other retirement benefits inspite of serving their duties in the field of one of the most important sector like Health, with full dedication with a very minimum remuneration.





Respected Sir,

With due respect firstly I would like to beg a pardon for engaging your valuable time to consider my prayer. I Sri Hironmoy Dey, have been working as a clerk at Urban-Primary Health Care Services under SUDA at Kalyani Municipality since 1998.

I would like to draw your kind attention towards the following matters for your kind perusal:-

1. Though Urban Primary Health Care Service is presently merged with NUHM, but clerks like me who have been working dedicatedly under UPHCS, are not provided with any other facilities like all other staffs worked under NUHM, inspite of taking active part in various programmes under NUHM and other Health related programmes. I am getting Rs. 3250 only as honorarium, which is quite low in comparison with the Lower Division Clerk worked under NUHM who get Rs. 9,000.00 per month.
2. All the HHWs working under UPHCS are absorbed and converted into ASHA under NUHM. But despite of getting nearly same remuneration like HHWs and doing work under same schemes (UPHCS) they are entitled for swasthyasathi schemes and we are deprived from Swasthyasathi scheme.
3. We are also deprived from EPF facility which is enjoyed by all NUHM staffs who are getting remuneration of Rs. 15000 per month.
4. All the staffs engaged under UPHCS retire from their services after attending 60 years of age without any pension or other retirement benefits inspite of serving their duties in the field of one of the most important sector like Health, with full dedication with a very minimum remuneration.

Whereas the present humanitarian Government of West Bengal (Ma-Mati-Manus) led by our Hon'ble Chief Minister Smt. Mamata Banerjee has already arranged to provide monthly pension facility for the people from different sectors of this society (e.g.- Folk artist, & other artists)

In this content would like to request you to kindly absorb us under NUHM scheme like HHWs so that we can get the facilities including enhanced remuneration and other facilities as enjoyed by the NUHM staffs.

Sir, if you kindly consider my prayer and arranged to provide us the facilities as mentioned above, I shall be highly obliged.



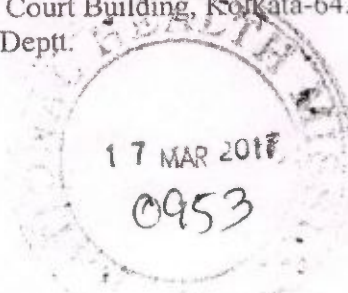



Job responsibility of different categories of HR under NUHM

Public Health Manager: One Public Health Manager (PHM) is sanctioned for each & every Municipality. He/she will supervise the activities under NUHM and assist the Nodal Officer -NUHM / Health Officer of the Municipality for implementing NUHM. The Public Health Manager shall perform the activities mentioned hereunder:

1. To supervise and monitor the day to day activities of health facilities (U-CHC, U-PHC & Maternity Home) and inform the same to the Nodal Officer -NUHM / Health Officer.
2. To organize and facilitate monthly meeting on 1st Saturday of every month and also organize other meeting at the ULB as per requirement. The preparation and decimation of proceedings of meeting.
3. To ensure the preparation and submission of reports as per direction of the authority within stipulated time as prescribed by the authority.
4. To ensure timely reporting and uploading of HMIS data from ULB level. He/ she will be responsible for facility wise data quality in HIMS portal.
5. To assist the Finance Officer of the Municipality for the preparation of financial reports and timely submission of the same to the District/ State.
6. Plan and organize the training and capacity building programmes.
7. To maintain liaison with the stakeholders for establishing convergence.
8. To oversee the progress of construction works of U-CHC, U-PHC & Maternity Home.
9. To assist the Nodal Officer -NUHM / Health Officer for effective supervision and monitoring of routine immunization, pulse polio and out-reach sessions (UNHD& Special out-reach camps).
10. To assist the Nodal Officer -NUHM / Health Officer in procurement process.
11. To oversee that the equipments and instruments are in good condition and duly calibrated.
12. To ensure the Annual Maintenance Contracts of different medical equipments.
13. To ensure timely delivery of drugs, equipments and other logistics to the U-PHC and other health facilities.
14. Visit all the health care facilities under the concerned ULB in every month.
15. To interact supervisor, AWW of ICDS, C.B.O.s, School Teachers during field visits and also interact with the slum people and attend the community level meeting.
16. Maintenance of the referral linkage as per guideline.
17. PHM shall assist in gap analysis of existing services, preparation of action plan to fill up identified gaps, implementation of Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs).

18. To ensure bio-medical waste management practices as per the guidelines.
19. To facilitate periodic meeting of Quality Assurance Committee/team and prepare agenda, notes, and action taken report, for the same. Also maintain minutes of the meeting.
20. To ensure display of the Citizen Charter of Patient's Rights focusing NUHM component in UPHC.
21. To ensure periodic meetings of "Rogi Kalyan Samiti" for effective improvement of the management and service provision of the U-PHC level as per the RKS guidelines issued from time to time.
22. To ensure timely preparation of indents for drugs, linen, vaccines, ORS, consumables, instruments, contraceptives sufficiently in advance and will ensure submission of the same to the CMOH.
23. To participate in the selection and training process of MAS.
24. To ensure that ASHA/HHW/FTS perform their activities regularly and report properly. It is to be ensured that the ASHA/HHW get their incentives regularly.
25. To participate in the meetings / trainings / seminars / workshops organized by SUDA/ State / District.
26. Any other work assigned by the Nodal Officer -NUHM / Health Officer or appropriate authority.

Urban Health Planning & Monitoring Manager: Urban Health Planning and Monitoring Managers are sanctioned for Municipal Corporation. He / she shall perform the same activities as assigned to the Public Health Manager in the Municipalities. The area of activity of Urban Health Planning and Monitoring Managers will be Borough / Wards if not otherwise defined.

Accounts Manager: One Accounts Manager is sanctioned for each Programme Management Unit at District and each Municipal Corporation. District Accounts Officer will supervise the activities of Account Manager-NUHM under administrative control of CMOH of the District. In case of Municipal Corporation, Account Manager will function under supervision of the Finance Officer. Accounts Manager will also report to the Nodal Officer-NUHM / Health Officer of the concerned Municipal Corporation. The Account Manager will perform the activities mentioned hereunder:

1. Maintenance of account and book expenditure under different activities.
2. To prepare routine financial reports and submit it to the proper authority within stipulated time.
3. To disseminate all the financial guidelines and circulars of NUHM to all concerned.





NUHM in West Bengal

National Urban Health Mission (NUHM) started functioning as a sub-mission under the National Health Mission (NHM) in 2013, National Rural Health Mission (NRHM) being the other sub-mission. NUHM seeks to improve the health status of the urban population. The focus is on Urban Poor living in listed and unlisted slums and all other vulnerable population such as homeless, rag-pickers, street children, rickshaw pullers, construction and brick kiln workers, sex workers, and other temporary migrants.

In West Bengal activity under National Urban Health Mission (NUHM) has been initiated as per approved State PIP since February 2014 to strengthen the Primary Health Care delivery system in urban area. For effective implementation of the programme, Department of Health & Family Welfare, Government of West Bengal has finalised in consultation with Municipal Affairs Department, modalities regarding implementation strategy, fund flow to the ULBs under NUHM, formation of City Urban Health Society for all the Municipal Corporations, procurement of Drugs and equipment, new construction, repair and renovation and engagement of HR.

NUHM presently covers 88 Urban Local Bodies (ULBs) having population of 50,000 and more (as per census 2011): List at **Annexure-I**.

Programme Achievements:

- **Establishment of Urban Primary Health Centre (U-PHC)** – Under NUHM norms, there will be one Urban Primary Health Centre (U-PHC) for 50,000-60,000 urban population. 458 U-PHCs have been sanctioned till date for the state, out of which 298 U-PHCs are already functional. Both preventive and curative services are being provided through these Urban Primary Health Centres (U-PHCs).




