

Sub: Ref: ER Kumar vs Union of India, WP(C) No. 55/2003- Final report on Shelter for Urban Homeless under NULM

- Intimation has been received from Ld. Advocate Mr. Raja Chatterjee, Advocate Supreme Court of India in the matter E R Kumar -Vs- Union of India, WP (C) 55/2003 in regards to the submission of final report by the committee as constituted by the Supreme Court in the said matter. The matter will come up for hearing on 08.08.2017 and the advocate wants the latest position/ developments with regards to the building/ maintenance of shelter for presenting before the Hon'ble Court during hearing.
- The Chief Secretary, Govt. of West Bengal filled an affidavit on 30.05.2014 w.r.t. to W.P. (C) NO.55 of 2003 mentioning the status in respect of providing shelter for homeless and plan of action in the State.
- The number of homeless in the State as per 2011 census is **104967** (including **69798** number of homeless of Kolkata).
- In the year 2014 Change Management Unit under Dept. of Municipal affairs conducted a night survey in all ULBs (excluding Kolkata) of the State and total **6468** number of homeless were identified which is placed at CP side.
- Kolkata Municipal Corporation has estimated homeless population in their area to 40000.
- If 50 persons can be accommodate in each shelter then **129** numbers of shelters are required to be constructed by 2022.
- So far 34 shelters were sanctioned and capacity of these shelters is 1700. Further **74** shelters will be constructed to cover said number of homeless population in the most concentrated ULBs. Out of these 74 shelters and plan of action has been prepared considering completion by 2022. 6 shelters of Dept. WC & SW in two corporations may be converged and cover 240 homeless.
- In Kolkata Municipal Corporation there are 35 shelters are functional under the scheme under the said Dept. and capacity of these shelters is 1588 and these may be converged with NULM.
- There are schemes in the State to provide shelter to homeless in urban areas as Housing for Urban Poor in which 9240 dwelling units have been provided to the urban homeless and more 4000 dwelling units have already sanctioned for them. For towns having homeless population below thirty will be covered under this State financed scheme by providing dwelling units to the homeless. Other **99509** number of homeless will be covered through the state Govt. Housing scheme Housing for Urban Poor by 2022.
- The Committee constituted under the directions of Hon'ble Supreme Court of India visited in the State for overseeing the provisions of shelter for homeless people in West Bengal on 03.5.2017 and conducted a meeting under the Chairmanship of Justice (Retd.) Kailash Gambhir. The minutes of this meeting is placed herewith. Some action points brought out in this meeting are stated in point 1 to point 13. Action taken w.r.t these points are mentioned in the **Annexure-II**.

- There are some observations in respect of West Bengal in the final report from point 1 to 6 including Kolkata along with the present status in the final report of the Committee. Action taken with respect to observation is mentioned in **Annexure-I**.
- Latest status report at 'X' is placed. It may be mention that 3 shelters are functional under DAY-NULM and another 2 shelters will be functional by July, 2017.

It was mentioned in the report in Kolkata Municipal Corporation area number of homeless person as per survey conducted in 2012 is 40000. It is further mentioned that a letter has been sent to Joint Commissioners (Dev) Kolkata Municipal Corporation related to the Plan of Action for Shelter for Urban Homeless. Reply of this letter is awaited. For actual figure of Homeless in Kolkata Municipal Area a letter may be issued to corporation to confirm the figure.

It is stated that the State of West Bengal to combat the problem of shelter for urban homeless is implementing the schemes and steps taken is:

a) **Scheme Shelter for Urban Homeless (SUH) under National Urban Livelihoods Mission (NULM)**- To provide the shelter for shelter less for those persons who are residing in 125 ULBs are covered so far under National Urban Livelihoods Mission (NULM) as per guidelines, issued by the Ministry of HUPA, Government of India. In 2014-15, 2015-16, 2016-17 & 2017-18 total 35 shelters were sanctioned in different ULBs and it will cover 1750 number of homeless people. Out of these six shelters are functional at Haldia Municipality, Durgapur Municipal Corporation, Krsihnanagar Municipality, Bongaon Municipality, Nabadwip Municipality and Coochbehar Municipality and cover the urban homeless in the respective Urban Local Bodies.

One shelter is under construction in each of the Urban Local Body at Howrah Municipal Corporation, Chandernagar Municipal Corporation, Jalpaiguri Municipality, Medinipur Municipality, Barrackpore Municipality, Bankura Municipality, Habra Municipality, Uttarpara Kotrang Municipality and English Bazar Municipality.

Two shelter units are under construction in the Urban Local Body at Asansol Municipal Corporation.

Rest of the shelters at Howrah Corporation, Berhampore Municipality, Halisahar Municipality, Bhatpara Municipality, Titagarh Municipality, Rajpur-Sonarpur Municipality, Mahestala Municipality, Tamralipta Municipality, Arambag Municipality, North Dum Dum Municipality, Barasat Municipality, Santipur Municipality, Tarekeswar Municipality, Jiaganj Ajimganj Municipality, are in progress. These shelters which are in various stages will be functional within the 2017-18 & 2018-19.

In this regard a Plan of Action has been prepared by the State of West Bengal to cover the homeless population by 2022. During the period from 2017-18 to 2021-22, 74 numbers of new shelters will be constructed and made functional by 2022. Thus 60 numbers of Urban Local Bodies where number of Urban Homeless is 30 or more will be covered under scheme of Shelter for Urban Homeless in National Urban Livelihood Mission. Rest 65 Urban Local Bodies where number of Urban Homeless is less than 30 will be covered up under the State Scheme of Housing for Urban Poor, *Nija Griha Nija Bhumi* (Own home, own land) and other housing scheme for urban poor.

41 shelters for urban homeless are in the process of convergence with the existing shelters running by the Department of Women and Child Development & Social Welfare, Govt. of West Bengal. These 41 shelters are covering 1856 number of Urban Homeless people. There are 35 numbers of such shelters in Kolkata Municipal Corporation, 3 numbers are in Howrah Municipal Corporation and 3 numbers are in Asansol Municipal Corporation area and are functional providing shelter to the Urban Homeless.

Shelter Management Committees (SMC) is already formed in the Urban Local Bodies where shelters are functional. Workshop has been organized for the staff and functionaries of shelters. Different IEC activities have been taken up in ULB level to mobilize the urban homeless people to bring under the shelter for homeless.

An intensive survey may be conducted for identification of urban homeless afresh, if there be any fresh entrants, will be covered up by providing shelter under State Scheme of Housing for Urban Poor.

- b) It is stated that there are schemes in the State to provide shelter to homeless in urban areas as Housing for Urban Poor in which 9240 dwelling units have been provided to the urban homeless and more 4000 dwelling units have already sanctioned for them. For towns having homeless population below thirty will be covered under this State financed scheme by providing dwelling units to the homeless. Other 99509 number of homeless will be covered through the State Government Housing scheme Housing for Urban Poor by 2022 and thus the State Government plans to cover up all the urban homeless by providing permanent shelter as well.

The above status report along with the plan of action as stated above may be considered for approval and if approved this may be sworn in the form of an affidavit by the officer, who will be authorised on this behalf of the department for filing the affidavit.

Different activities have been taken up in ULB level to mobilize the urban homeless people to bring under the shelter for homeless

- i. Project Sanction Committee at State level has already been constituted and functional since 10.04.2014. Till date 9 meetings have been held.
- ii. City Level Executive Committee at ULB level: Total 111 committees are constituted and functional out of 125 Committees in 125 ULBs. Meetings are held regularly for discussion of the matter relating to Shelter for Urban Homeless.
- iii. Shelter Management Committees at ULB level: Total 6 shelters management committee have been constituted till now where shelters are constructed and functional.

iv. At present other 41 Shelters Management Committees are functional in urban area other than NULM under Department of Women and Child Development and Social Welfare Department, Govt. of West Bengal. The Committees are in the process of reconstituted due to the adoption of convergence policy.

An intensive survey will be conducted for identification of urban homeless afresh, if there be any fresh entrants will be covered up under State Scheme of Housing for Urban Poor.

d. Regarding Utilization of Fund under NULM:

i) Till now Total Rs. 187.97 Crore has been received and total utilized Rs. 178.37 Crore which includes Rs. 21 Crore for Shelter for Urban Homeless under NULM.

In the matter ~~Writ~~ Petition (Civil) No.85 of 2003 ER Kumar and another VS Union of India & others, Hon'ble Justice Madan B Lokur and Hon'ble Justice Dipak Gupta of Supreme Court of India in order dated 13.10.2017 mentioned that in State of West Bengal there are 104967 nos. of homeless population as the Committee as constituted by the Hon'ble Supreme Court submitted their report. It was observed in the order that in the State of West Bengal in 125 Urban Local Bodies six Committees have been constituted. In the said order it was directed to submit details of allotment of fund, utilization of allotted fund, constitution of Committees and status of implementation of National Urban Livelihood Mission. It was also directed to submit a road map for the implementation of National Urban Livelihood Mission. Upon the direction of the Hon'ble Supreme Court the details of allotment of fund, its utilization, status of implementation of National Urban Livelihood Mission in different component has been submitted in avid-avid by Director, SUDA dated 6.11.2016. Copy of the same is placed in Flag 'X'. In addition to this avid-avid a further compliance report was submitted explaining allotment of fund in different component and expenditure thereon in different component including the activities taken up on those components. Copy of the same is placed in Flag 'Y'.

As per report of the Committee as constituted by the Supreme Court there are 104967 nos. of urban homeless. In the Census report 2011 there are 96557 nos. of urban homeless in different urban local bodies. In the earlier order in this said matter it was directed that the State will provide Shelter to the Homeless people under the scheme Shelter for Urban Homeless under National Urban Livelihood Mission. In that respect the scheme has been taken up for providing shelter to the urban homeless. As per survey conducted by Kolkata Municipal Corporation in their jurisdiction there are 37428 nos. of homeless people considering the entire matter. Plan of action has been taken. Six shelters have been constructed in six different ULBs providing accommodation for 300 homeless people in Shelter for Urban Homeless under National Urban Livelihood Mission. There are 41 shelters run by Department of Social Welfare, Women & Child Development, Govt. of West Bengal out of which 35 shelters in Kolkata MC, 3 in Howrah MC & 3 in Asansol MC. These 41 shelters covers 1856 nos. of urban homeless people. Also there are 9 shelter for homeless run by the Controller of Vagrancy under Department of Social Welfare, Women & Child Development, Govt. of West Bengal. These 50 shelters are not in compliant with the guideline of NULM. Other 29 shelters for Urban Homeless

has been sanctioned for 26 Urban Local Bodies which are under construction. Progress of construction of those shelters are placed at Flag-'Z'. There is a plan for construction of total 109 shelters which will be functional within 2022 out of which 35 has been sanctioned and 6 are in operation.

As per road map in 2018-19 25 shelters will be functional, in 2019-20 20 shelters will be functional, in 2020-21 there will be 26 shelters more functional and in 2021-22 28 shelters will be functional. Shelters are so planned in those ULBs where there are homeless people 30 or above. In these 109 shelters under NULM 5450 nos. of urban homeless people will be provided shelters. For rest of the homeless population, 9240 nos. of dwelling units have already been provided under Housing for Urban Poor under the State Govt. scheme Housing for Urban Poor. More 4000 dwelling units will be provided to the urban homeless population within 2017-18. Another 9509 nos. of urban homeless will be covered by the State scheme like Banglar Bari by the year 2022.

The matter was taken up for hearing on 08.11.2017. Hon'ble Justice Madan B Lokur and Hon'ble Justice Dipak Gupta in their order directed the State of West Bengal for submission of information on a questionnaire submitted by Mr. Prasant Bhusan petitioner within a period of 10 days. The questionnaire is placed in Flag-'A'.

50 nos. of shelters run by Social Welfare, Women & Child Department are required to be refurbished in NULM compliant. Fund for such refurbishment may be provided out of fund received for implementation of NULM. In that respect a compliance may be done with. Utilization of fund in different component was intimated in details before the Hon'ble Supreme Court. Total amount of expenditure is 178 crore out of which 21 crore has been utilized for the purpose of shelter for urban homeless under NULM. Another 20 crore may be utilized for completion of the construction work of 29 shelters which are going on. Other than these shelters 74 shelters will be constructed in coming 5 years for which another rupees 88 crore is required which may be provided from allocation from NULM.

As per order dated 10.11.2017, the meeting was held on 16.11.2017 with Kolkata Municipal Corporation and Department of Social Welfare & Women and Child Development represented by the officials of them. The department of Social Welfare & Women and Child Development was requested as per previous communication by SUDA to send proposals for allotment of fund to make the shelters for urban homeless, being run by the department, NULM compliant as to provide additional infrastructure, services and day to day maintenance as prescribed in the guideline of NULM and as observed in compliance of order of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in the matter WP (Civil) No. 55 of 2003. There are 41 shelters in different Urban Local Bodies which includes 35 shelters in Kolkata Municipal Corporation area. These shelters are required to be made NULM compliant immediately.

X

Kolkata Municipal Corporation had submitted an Action Plan in connection with implementation of Shelter for Urban Homeless. The matter was discussed. There are 37468 homeless people as per 2011 survey report in KMC area. There are 4 running shelters only and two new shelters have been constructed only which cater 268 homeless. There no other specific plan of action to accommodate such large number of homeless people within KMC area. They were requested to submit detailed plan of action immediately to cope up with this matter considering all possible shelters in public and private, permanent and temporary nature.

In the order dated 08.11.2017 of Hon'ble Supreme Court in the matter WP (civil) No. 55 of 2003, the State has been ordered to submit reply to a questionnaire on the status of shelter of urban homeless. a) Vision Document for Shelter for Urban Homeless (SUH) under National Urban Livelihoods Mission (NULM)

Even while sustaining cities with their cheap labour, urban homeless persons live desperately hard lives with no shelter or social protection. They are described variously as homeless, houseless, roofless, shelter-less and pavement dwellers. The Census of India defines 'houseless population' as persons who are not living in 'census houses'. A 'census house' is a 'structure with roof'. To provide these people a permanent roof to mainstream into the society and for dignified life permanent shelters will be constructed.

As per guideline of the scheme it will be implemented in all district headquarter town and other towns with population of one lakh or more as per the Census of 2011. State of West Bengal Primarily identified the towns/Urban Local Bodies where the total population is one lakh or more than lakh and 50 bedded shelters will be constructed in phase manner based on homeless population figure of Homeless Survey 2014 (conducted by the state) and also in the Urban Local Bodies where the total population is below one lakh although homeless population is available. Considering census 2011 homeless population.

The objectives of the Shelter for Urban Homeless (SUH) component of NULM scheme are:

- i. Ensure availability and access of the urban homeless population to permanent shelters including the basic infrastructure facilities like water supply, sanitation, safety and security.
- ii. Cater to the needs of especially vulnerable segments of the urban homeless like the dependent children, aged, disabled, mentally ill and recovering gravely ill, by creating special sections within homeless shelters and provisioning special service linkages for them.
- iii. Provide access to various entitlements, viz. social security pensions, PDS, ICDS, identity, financial inclusion, education, affordable housing etc. for homeless populations.
- iv. Provide skill training to the single male and female inmates for self employment under NULM through Employment through skills training and employment. Formation of Self Help group or inclusion of the single female inmates into SHG for their empowerment and income generation through self employment programme.

b. Road Map for Shelter for Urban Homeless (SUH)

A. In the road map submitted before the Hon'ble Supreme Court it has been mentioned 9240 dwelling units have been provided to the urban homeless. Further 4000 dwelling units will be given under this State Programme Housing for Urban Poor. The rest of the homeless populations will be covered by the various State schemes like **Banglar Bari**.

The scheme '**Banglar Bari**' envisages construction of multi-storied flats of G+3 heights and minimum carpet area of 285 sqft and 350 sqft super built up area instead of single dwelling units and the G+3 housing projects will make provision of 16 dwelling units. One G+3 building of 16 dwelling units will be made to accommodate nearly 70 person. Based on this G+3 buildings will be constructed by 2022 in phase manner. From FY 2017-18 to FY 2020-21 total 20000 dwelling units will be constructed and it will cover 90000 homeless population.

In addition to this total 35 shelters (new construction & each 50 bedded capacity) were sanctioned till now under NULM. 74 more shelters under NULM will be functional within 2022. Financial year wise target is mentioned as follows:

- i. Functional shelters till now - 6
- ii. Further 4 shelters will be functional within 2017-18
- iii. IN 2018-19 -25 shelters will be functional
- iv. IN 2019-20- 20 shelters will be functional
- v. IN 2020-21- 26 shelters will be functional

vi. IN 2021-22 - 28 shelters will be functional

These 74 nos. new shelters will be constructed under National Urban Livelihoods Mission (NULM) based on the availability of suitable land for model building. Model building plan has been made for each 50 bedded shelter which is a four storied R.C.C. vertical structure. Floor area of each shelter unit is 253.87 sqm as per guideline of SUH 50 sqft/person. Already land has been identified for 10 new shelters in 10 ULB. Land identification is under process for further 64 new shelters. All the shelters are four storied general type of shelter which will accommodate Male, Female, child and physically challenged person in different dormitory. Also separate staircase is available for female inmates for their safety and security purpose. Each shelter capacity will be 50. Out of this 16 male, 16 female, 8 family and 4 physically challenged people will stay in different floors.

Process of exploration of land of different Development/ Corporations/ under takings/ Statutory Bodies of the State as well as Central Govt. will be identified and necessary actions for inter Government/ inter Departmental transfer of land will be taken for erection of SUHs.

Summary: The above mentioned 109 shelters will cover the 5450 homeless population in 124 ULB (excluding Kolkata Corporation) by 2022. In addition to this already 1856 homeless population is covered under 35 shelters, 3 shelters and 3 shelters run by the Department of Women & Child Development and Social Welfare respectively in Kolkata Municipal Corporation, Howrah Municipal Corporation and Asansol Municipal Corporation.

B. Road Map for Kolkata Municipal Corporation:

In Kolkata 700 Shelters are required for accommodating 69798 of Urban Homeless (as per Census 2011).

The report submitted by the Joint Commissioner, Kolkata Municipal Corporation vide memo no. 23/NULM/SW& UPA/2-17-18 dated: 08.09.2017

In the light of the Supreme Court's orders and directives in the matter of W.P. NO. 196 (Civil) of 2001, and subsequent decision taken by Government of West Bengal, a Rapid assessment survey was conducted in all the 141 wards of Kolkata Municipal Corporation spanning over a period of a fortnight, starting from 4 february 2011 to map the homeless population, their concentration points in Kolkata, their composition and reason for migration. The RAS, undertaken in public-private mode was conducted in Kolkata by the Calcutta Samaritans, a civil society organization having proven background of working on this social issue and funding support came from the State Government (the DFID aided Kolkata Urban Services for Poor project under Department of Municipal Affairs. Total 37468 homeless person was identified in this survey

4. Additional floor, measuring about 18000 sq. ft. on the existing premises at 13 Raja Manindra Road at Ward 5.

Expected completion time– June, 2019

Point B

Some other plots of land measuring a total area of 14.5 Cotthas possessed by other Parastatals under Government of West Bengal have also been identified and process of handing over of land to KMC has been initiated.

A large quantum of land located under the jurisdiction of KMC is possessed by different Department viz. Kolkata Port Trust, Eastern Railways and Defence under Government of India. Response is yet to receive from these Departments for provision of land for construction of Shelters for Urban Homeless. The area where land is possessed by these Departments is concentrated with the maximum number of homeless people.

Point C

Initiatives are also being taken by the Kolkata Municipal Corporation for arrangement of shelters on rental basis. Advertisement is being made in the leading newspapers in order to invite owners allowing Kolkata Municipal Corporation to use their buildings as shelters on rentals basis.

Point D

The KMC has also taken initiatives for identification of unutilized/dilapidated buildings owned by private owners or other Departments to utilize the same as Shelters for Urban Homeless on rental basis. An extensive effort is being exerted to identify such buildings. This process is expected to be completed within June, 2018. The process of renovation of these buildings will take further 3 to 4 months and the shelter may be ready by October, 2018.

Point E

Considering the persistent developmental activities under different programmes implemented by the Government of West Bengal, the urban homeless population is supposed to be on the decline. If Hon'ble Court allows, the figure of homeless in KMC area may be reviewed on the basis of the field survey.

Point F

Kolkata Municipal Corporation is also searching for lands in the adjoining areas of Kolkata for construction of more number of Shelters for accommodating urban homeless people.

The plan of Action should include the methodology for identification of homeless persons, nature of shelter, identification of land etc.

It may be noted that on 05.12.2018 an order was been passed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in the matter of W.P.(C) 55 of 2003 related to shelters for urban Homeless (Copy enclosed in c.p. side). It appears from the order, Hon'ble Supreme Court stated that, for the present no further directions are required to be passed. Hon'ble court listed the writ petition for hearing in the second week of February, 2019 on a noon miscellaneous day.

In addition to this it is stated by learned ASG appearing for the Union of India that user fee is voluntary and is not insisted upon from urban Homeless for utilization of the facilities in the shelter homes.

In this regard it may be mentioned that no such user fees fixed in any shelter order OAT-NULM in the state except Haldia Municipality. Haldia municipality had decided to collect use fee voluntarily from shelter users in SMC meeting. ^{At present} this process (user fee collection) is stopped as per decision of ULB.

Under these circumstances, it may be considered that no such action is required to take from this end, in respect of the aforesaid order.
