



Sub: Proposal for providing fund for public awareness and IEC activities to 26 cities, one Industrial Township Authority and one Development Authority.

Solid Waste Management has become a burning issue to keep the environment clean, green, hygienic and liveable. For this, Government of India has notified Solid Waste Management Rules, 2016 and the compliance of which is being extensively monitored by Hon'ble National Green Tribunal through its Apex Monitoring Committee & respective State Level Committees.

It is observed that, around 14000 MT per day Municipal Solid Wastes are being generated in the 125 Urban Local Bodies (ULBs) of West Bengal. For this, State Government has given major thrust on planning, implementation and monitoring of Integrated Solid Waste Management in its 125 ULBs, 3 Industrial Township Authorities and 19 Development Authority Areas, and simultaneously in rural areas also.

It is realized that, this mammoth task/challenge of Solid Waste Management in 125 ULBs, 3 Industrial Township Authorities and 19 Development Authority Areas, may be achieved in short run only taking it in Mission Mode comprehensive approach and at the outset launching extensive Public Awareness/Behavioural Change Communication Programmes developing several IEC materials.

Hence, it is being proposed that a fund may be allotted to 26 cities, one Industrial Township Authority and one Development Authority (as detailed below) taken up in 1st phase as model cities, proposed model cities and cluster cities being examined by the Transaction Advisors, for implementing public awareness and IEC activities on Solid Waste Management within their jurisdiction.

If approved, ward wise Rs.25,000/- for the cities and lump sum Rs. 5,00,000/- for Development Authority and Industrial Township Authority may be sanctioned for this purpose.

Further, reference to the meeting held with creative designing agencies under I&CA Department yesterday at Nagarayan and previous discussion with the State Coordinator, Centre For Environment Education at SUDA for development of IEC materials on SWM, it was understood, the IEC materials that we are thinking of for awareness campaign all over the State, need to be developed centrally, keeping conformity with the provisions vide SWM Rule 2016 so that uniform message can be percolated throughout the State for different stakeholders. That is why Centre for Environment Education, a Centre of Excellence under Ministry of Environment and Forests, Gol, working since 1984 with a mandate to promote environmental awareness nationwide, may be approached for providing content of the IEC materials for different format including poster, banner, hoarding, booklet, leaflet, audio-visuals, etc. The institute also got empanelled with MoUFA, GoI since 2013-14 for providing support to the cities/towns across the country for solid waste management.

Based on the presentation to be given by the agencies empanelled with I&CA Deptt on 21.5.19 at Nagarayan, the creative designing of different IEC materials may be awarded to the competent one. By this time, if approved, CEE may be approached for providing a comprehensive IEC plan on SWM along with contents of different format against item wise cost.

Smt. Reema Banerjee, Programme Director- East, Centre for Environment Education (a Centre of Excellence of the Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change, Government of India, details at the organization is placed at **CP- 44 to 61,** and also the empanelled agency of Ministry of Urban Development, Government of India for providing support to the Cities/ Towns for SWM, list placed at **CP-28**) vide her communication dated 30.05.2019 (**CP-63**) express their interest to provide the consulting services to SUDA on IEC for Solid Waste Management and promoting circular economy in West Bengal.

- Development of Communication plan based on the situational analysis and for presenting the IEC need for various stakeholders, the core messaging and appropriate methods for communication with them, potential opportunity and risk and addressing strategy. The plan will also proposed the media strategy and outreach activities to be undertaken over the next few weeks and months linked to the key milestones of implementation alongwith development of a Logo/ Mascot with a Tagline for the communication plan. Details placed at CP-41 to 42.
 - ii) Development and printing of the communication messages as per the final communication plan. Details placed at CP-41.
 - iii) Rolling out of the communication strategy and outreach in Kalyany/ Bidhannagar: CEE proposed to handhold and rollout the communication strategy in one of the Model town i.e. Kalyani/ Bidhannagar. The outreach team will be developed by the Model town authority and CEE will provide handholding support and training to them. CEE will developed a monitoring mechanism for effectiveness of the system. Details placed at CP-40 to 41.
 - iv) CEE proposed to be included as Knowledge Partner in the entire Solid Waste Management strategy of the state as taken by UD&MA Department with the help of their in house and associated experts, who will work in collaboration with UD&MA Department in attaining good model of SWM (Details placed at CP-39 to 40). In this connection the key experts who would be involved from CEE core team and expert panels are Smt. Reema Banerjee, Smt. Madhavi Joshi, Smt. Sanskriti Menon, Ms. Preeti Rawat Kanaujia, Prof. Brajesh Kumar Dubey, Dr. Prasad Modak, Sri Shantanu Roy, Smt. Sivaranjani Subhramanian and CEE studio team. Details of the qualification and experience of these experts are placed at CP-36 to 39.

In response to query 2 i.e 'the reasons for assigning work on nomination basis without inviting tender', it may be explained that the objective of the proposed assignment is to formulate a comprehensive IEC, capacity building and training plan with communication materials to i) inform various stakeholders about waste management system as mandated in SWM Rule 2016 and initiatives taken by ULBs to manage municipal solid waste ii) educate the community on waste segregation norms along with the concept of recycling and reuse of waste and what they have to do for compliance iii) inspire and motivate the urban folk in understanding the issues of waste management so that their surroundings can be kept clean and healthy.

It requires specific technical knowledge and expertise and command over the subject with appropriate delivery mechanism to roll out the publicity campaign on SWM across the State which may not be ascertained by inviting tender/proposal from creative designing agencies. So it is proposed to nominate an organization like CEE, working since 1984 as a Centre of Excellence under MoEF and empanelled with MoHUA in association with NIUA and TERI for providing support to cities on SWM. As an expert agency CEE may provide support to SUDA, the State level Nodal agency under UD & MA Department for SWM towards development of an IEC concept plan and content of the suggested IEC materials with capacity building and training guidance initially for one year. Based on their concept plan, IEC materials in different format including poster, banner, TVC, Radio jingles, press advertisement would be assigned for development to the creative agency/agencies empanelled with I&CA Department following I&CA Notification no 3083/DI dtd 1.11.2017.

Next, in reply to Query 3 i.e. 'As the Admin Deptt has already moved a file for engagement of TA for various ULBs whether further engagement of CEE will account for duplication of work' it may be clarified that the Transaction Advisors empanelled with FD have been engaged by SUDA for providing advisory services towards development of an integrated SWM plan along with bid process management for selection of appropriate waste processing agency in four cluster based SWM projects covering 20 municipal towns and would likely be engaged for few more cities while the present proposal deals with development of a model IEC plan for implementation of solid waste management in municipal towns along with content of IEC materials for different stakeholders. So the scope of work as envisaged for the proposed assignment is totally different from the services generally provided by TA and thus question of duplication of work may not be raised.

Again 99 ULBs were awarded @ Rs. 25000/- per wards totaling Rs. 5.10 Crore for IEC Activities on Solid waste Management (NSP-16-20).
